## **Biographical Note:**

Quintin Joseph Papineau Jr. was born on January 7, 1928, in Rochester, New York, to Quintin J. Papineau Sr. and Lizette K. Knobles. He attended Webster Groves High School in Webster Groves, Missouri. He registered for the draft during World War II but it is unclear if he served. He worked for Kent Realtors as a sales representative in the 1950s. Papineau died March 24, 2008, at the age of 80. He is buried in Valhalla Cemetery in Bel-Nor, Missouri.

## **Scope and Content Note:**

This collection consists of thirty-five photographs taken by photographer Quintin J. Papineau Jr. between 1996 and 1998. His photographs include images of agricultural machinery harvesting cotton, rice, and potatoes in Mississippi and Stoddard County, Missouri. There are also several images of Blue, Greer, and Morgan springs in Oregon County, Missouri and Heron Pond in Illinois Little Black Slough Nature Preserve. There are also images of the Burnt Mill (Perry County), B'Nai Israel Synagogue (Cape Girardeau, Missouri), Marion County Courthouse (Palmyra, Missouri), and the steamboats *The Mississippi Queen* and *American Queen* and ferry *The Dorena* traveling the along Mississippi River.
