Biographical Note:

Lynn Morrow was born in Mexico, Missouri, in February 1946. He earned a bachelor's and master's degrees in history at Southwest Missouri State University in 1975 and 1980 respectively. He was research historian for the Center for Ozarks Studies, Southwest Missouri

State University (now Missouri State University) from 1977 to 1982. He married Kristen Kalen in October 1981. As Kalen and Morrow, they operated a historic preservation consulting firm from 1983 to 1990, where they conducted cultural resource management surveys and prepared nominations for the National Register of Historic Places for sites in several counties in Missouri. In July 1990, Morrow became supervisor of Missouri's newly created Local Records Preservation Program at the Missouri State Archives, where he retired from in 2012.

Arrangement:

This collection has been arranged into a single series, then chronologically.

Scope and Content Note:

This collection contains two cultural resource books relating to the Fourche Creek Watershed in Ripley County, Missouri, and northern Arkansas and a literature review for the Missouri and Arkansas Power Corporation detailing excavations of Native American archaeological artifacts. This collection also includes a booklet on the various soils found in Southeast Missouri area.
