Abstract: The John F. Bradbury, Jr. Postcard Collection contains postcards collected by Bradbury, containing images from the Ozarks and Southern Missouri. The postcards consist of real photograph, commercially printed, and illustrated postcards. The images mainly feature Missouri towns, railroads, Route 66, resorts, and rivers.

Historical Note:

John F. Bradbury, Jr. was born October 24, 1952, in Heidelburg, Germany, to John F. Bradbury, Sr. and Jeanne Bradbury. His father was a Lieutenant Colonel in the United States Army stationed in Germany during the Allied occupation. The family soon relocated to Rolla, Missouri, and his father was stationed out of Fort Leonard Wood and worked as an ROTC instructor at the Missouri School of Mines (now Missouri University of Science and Technology).

John graduated from the University of Missouri – Rolla (now Missouri University of Science and Technology) with a bachelor's degree in history in 1974. After a year of graduate study at the University of Wyoming – Laramie, he went to work for the Union Pacific Railroad. In 1980, John took the job as manuscript specialist with the Western Historical Manuscripts Collection at the newly created Rolla Research Center. He became the associate director in 2011 and maintained the position until his retirement in 2015. After his retirement the State Historical Society of Missouri appointed him a Senior Fellow and he continued his work on various research projects.

Throughout his career, John authored and coauthored numerous books and articles on a variety of topics including the history of Rolla, the Civil War in the Ozarks, Route 66 through Missouri, and Missouri's railroad history. He wrote several articles for area newsletters including the *Phelps County Historical Society Newsletter* and the *Old Settlers Gazette*. Also of note are his books, *A History of Southern Missouri and Northern Arkansas: Being An Account of the Early Settlements, the Civil War, the Ku-Klux, and Tims of Peace* edited with Lou Wehmer and "My Own Commander": The Civil War Journal of J.J. Sitton, 1863-1865, the latter of which was published posthumously.

John passed away at his home in Rolla, Missouri, on June 11, 2023.

Scope and Content Note:

Missouri Counties

This series contains postcards from various Missouri counties. The postcards feature images of main streets, resorts, railroads, highways, rivers, businesses, hotels, municipal buildings, greetings/tourism advertisements, boating, fishing, nature scenes, and individuals. These postcards were organized by John Bradbury by their location, first by county and then by city

and/or specific location. For example, folder 54 contains images from Rolla, Phelps County, Missouri, specifically images from Pine Street in downtown Rolla. Materials in this series date from 1907 to 2022.

Missouri

The Missouri series contains images that feature multiple counties or are identified as Missouri with no exact location noted. Also included are miscellaneous town, railroad, and tourist destination scenes. The series is arranged alphabetically by location or subject.

Railroads

This series consists of railroad postcards. Companies and railroad lines include: St. Louis Midland Railroad, Missouri Southern; Chicago, Rock Island and Pacific Railroad; Missouri, Oklahoma and Gulf; Iowa and Southwestern Railway; Union Pacific; Burlington Northern; Chicago and Alton Railroad; Missouri, Kansas, Texas Railroad Company; Chicago and North Western Railroad; Kansas City Southern; Atchison, Topeka, and Santa Fe Railway; Missouri Pacific Railroad; Minneapolis, St. Paul, and Sault Ste. Maire Railroad; St. Louis, Iron Mountain and Southern Railway; and Mississippi River and Bonne Terre Railway. The postcards include images of train wrecks, depots, railroad workers, transport cars, engines, rail construction, and bridges. Most the images are from Missouri with a few miscellaneous images from Colorado, Wyoming, Iowa, and Illinois, among other locations.

This series was kept in its original order as organized by John Bradbury who grouped images by location, subject, and railroad company depending upon his interest.

Military

This series contains postcards with historical reproductions, images from battlefields and historic sites, and soldiers. The images mostly deal with the American Civil War, but images from World War I and World War II are also included. This series is arranged by war. Folder 103 contains images from around the United States.

States

This series consists of postcards obtain by Bradbury during his travels around the United States. The postcards feature images of tourist locations, motels, railroads, and nature scenes. This series is organized by location.

Miscellaneous

This series contains loose postcards that were not organized by Bradbury and did not fit with any of the categories he had already established. Nearly all lack descriptions and location information.
