


### University of Nevada at Reno


The Idaho Southern Tigers opened their 1936 football season against the University of Nevada Wolves, at Reno, October 2. Though fighting gamely all the way, the Tigers lost an exceptionally well-played game to the Wolverine Pack by a score of 21-12.

Hoggan scored the first touchdown for the Tigers on a short line buck, after Idaho had made a determined drive down the field. Shortly afterwards, Nevada retaliated with a march down the field, and soon forged ahead. In the second quarter, Nevada scored seven more points. The Wolf Pack scored again at the start of the second half, and added the extra point to lead 21-6. Early in the fourth period, Atkinson ran 80 yards for Idaho Southern's second score.

### University of Montana at Missoula

Idaho Southern lost the second season game in a spectacular contest with the University of Montana at Missoula. Unleashing long runs and passes, the Grizzly squad baffled a hard fighting Tiger team, and rolled up a score of 45 to 13. Montana scored three times in the first quarter; a blocked Idaho punt was followed by Rolston's 78-yard touchdown sprint, and Dolan, Montana end, recovered a Tiger fumble behind the goal line. An intercepted Tiger pass and a forward pass, Peterson to Shields, earned Montana's second quarter touchdown. Early in the fourth, Idaho broke into the scoring column when Hoggan heaved passes of 27 and 32 yards to Atkinson and Norby for touchdowns. The last Montana touchdown came in the fourth, following a series of passes.





# Western State College at Pocatello

Idaho Southern outbattled the Mountaineers of Western State College 12-0 to win their first victory of the 1936 football season, October 17. A rejuvenated Tiger squad required but four plays to push over the initial touchdown against the invaders. The second touchdown followed quickly, with Price carrying the ball in two plays to the Mountaineers' 29, where Hoggan faked a pass and cut across left tackle, scoring on the next play. An Idaho fumble paved the way for a final Mountaineer scoring thrust in the second half, as Rout passed to Pederson on the 18. This met with no success.


# Ricks Junior College at Rexburg


In their annual encounter, Idaho Southern completely swamped the Ricks' Vikings at Rexburg, October 25. Scoring only six points during the first half, the Tigers returned to the field and ran the score to 34-0 before the final gun sounded.

Midway in the first quarter Mike Gates, substitute back, grabbed a Viking punt and raced 80 yards for the initial Tiger score. The orange and black's second string

played the first half.

Led by Hopkins and Price, the first team entered the game at the start of the second half, and made four touchdowns to finish whitewashing the Rick's eleven. Tronowsky, Engle, and Brooks played outstanding games in the line.





#### Montana Mines at Butte



Neither team was able to marshal an offense, either aerial or running, for a sustained drive.


The Mines' touchdown came in the fourth quarter on a blocked punt which a Montana man recovered and ran 15 yards to the two-yard line. Idaho Southern held two attempts; however, on the next play a Mines' back slipped over for the score.

### Albion Normal College at Pocatello

On November 7, a strong and fast Albion Normal team held the Idaho Southern eleven to a hard fought 18-7 victory. Presenting one of the best teams in recent years, the Teachers kept the Idaho Tigers growling throughout the game. Idaho failed to score in the first quarter, although they reached the Panther 16-yard stripe early in the game. In the second period an infuriated Tiger team moved resolutely to the 30, where two brilliantly executed passes—Hoggan to Nipper and Holt—placed the ball on the Albion 12. Hoggan passed to Walt Carte for a score.

In the second half, Tronoswsky blocked a pass and recovered for Idaho on the Albion II. Two plays later, following an off-tackle smash by Price, the Tigers tallied. In the fourth period a pass to Young in the end zone made a goal for the Teachers.





#### Montana State Bobcats at Pocatello

Before the largest crowd ever to witness a football game at Idaho Southern, the Montana State Bobcats defeated Idaho Southern's Tigers 32-19, in the first game to be played in the newly erected \$150,000 stadium, November 11.

In the first half the Bobcats gained a substantial lead, scoring three touchdowns and an extra point, Idaho getting one touchdown. Opening the second half much as they did the first, the Montana eleven scored two touchdowns in quick succession, and place-kicked an extra point to make the score 32-6. Immediately the Tigers returned to life and pushed over Idaho's second score. Idaho Southern added the final touchdown in the fourth quarter.

# College of Idaho Coyotes at Pocatello

Idaho Southern thoroughly trounced their homecoming opponents, the College of Idaho Coyotes, Saturday, November 21, by a score of 30-0. The game was played in the new stadium before approximately 3,000 fans, and successfully completed the

Bengals' 1936 football season.

On the second play of the game, Price slipped through the line and traveled from Idaho's 30 to within four yards of a score. Two plays later, Hoggan rammed over the Idaho's first touchdown. Caccia recovered a Caldwell fumble on the midfield stripe, and two passes, Hoggan to Price and Holt, saw Idaho again across their rivals' goal line. In the fourth quarter, Gates fumbled, and the ball rolled over the Coyote goal line, where it was picked up by Tronowsky, the only Tiger lineman to score a touchdown. Price ran 72 yards to score the final touchdown of the 1936 season for Idaho Southern.
