Revisionists Demand Extra Zionist Congress and Z. O. Executive's Resignation

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Prague, Aug. 15—A demand for an extra world Zionist Congress this year and the resignation of the world Zionist Executive is voiced in the political resolution adopted by the fourth world conference of the Union of Zionist Revisionists today just before it adjourned after an all-night session.

Should the demands of the Revisionists fail and the same Executive be selected at the extra Congress if called, the conference authorized the Revisionist Executive to take some definite action or to call a special world conference for such a purpose. The political resolution, submitted by M. Machover, and read by Dr. Robert Lichtheim declared, "The occurrences of last year demonstrate the complete breakdown of the politics of the Zionist leadership. The Revisionists warned the last Zionist Congress and their tender of cooperation was ignored. Notwithstanding the political debacle and the catastrophe in Palestine the leadership pursues the same policy. The conference proclaims that the Zionist Executive has forfeited its political prerogative by transferring its authority to the Jewish Agency which is not recognized by the Revisionists".

The political declaration also denounced the activities of the English officials in Palestine and bitterly

Jewish Socialists Commemorate Bialystok Pogrom of 1905

Warsaw, Aug. 15—The twenty-fifth anniversary of the attack on the Jewish workers of Bialystok in 1905 by armed bands of Cossacks was commemorated today by the Jewish Socialists of Bialystok who organized an impressive procession through the same streets in which 70 Jews were killed and several score seriously injured. Carrying wreaths the Jewish Socialists proceeded to the cemetery where the murdered Jews are buried. Speeches recalling the heroism of the fallen Jewish victims of the Cossacks' fury were delivered.

Woman to Be Named Justice of the Peace in Tel Aviv

Tel Aviv, Aug. 15—At least one woman will be appointed a justice of the peace in this all-Jewish city when the municipality appoints the three additional justices it needs, the town council decided today. It also decided to consider a restriction in admission of juveniles to the moving picture houses except by permission of parents or teachers.

12 Fascists Arrested After Attack on Jewish House

Berlin, Aug. 15—Twelve members of the National Socialist party (Fascists) were arrested today by the German police in the Rhineland village of Dolgesheim following an attack on the house of a Jewish merchant, M. Frank. This is but the latest of a series of anti-Semitic attacks that have occurred in the Rhineland since it was evacuated by the Allied troops.

Yesterday at midnight the National Socialists began shooting at Frank's house, breaking doors and windows. Frank, who is a local Republican leader, was roughly handled while his family hid in the attic until the police arrived and dispersed the attackers. Frank's family, which has lived in Dolgesheim for 36 years, was compelled, under a police escort, to move to Worms.

Says Non-Zionists Should End Attempt to Enforce Their Will and System

Jerusalem, Aug. 15—The approaching meetings of the Zionist Actions Committee and the Administrative Committee of the Jewish Agency in Berlin should end "the attempt of the non-Zionists to enforce their will and their system," writes the Hebrew daily, "Ha'Areztz" today in commenting on the two meetings. The "Ha'Areztz" comment follows the speculation yesterday by the "Doar Hayom" concerning the possible dissolution of the Jewish Agency.

The "Ha'Areztz" says, "We do not oppose nor renounce the Jewish Agency but its first year has shown that the greatest danger is the weakness of the Zionist side and the dictatorship of the other side. The Zionists admitted that they make mistakes in regarding the other side as experts. They are capable of correcting these mistakes now. It is useful to analyze the so-called experts' capacity."

Arab Newspaper Suspended for Publishing Speech of Egyptian

Jerusalem, Aug. 15—The Arab daily paper, "Al Hayat," organ of the extremists in the Arab Executive, was today indefinitely suspended for publishing a speech of Zaki Pasha, Egyptian Arab leader, in which he said that the Arab murderers of the Jews of Hebron and Safed are heroes before whom the Arabs should bow down.

It is understood, too, that the acting High Commissioner has requested the Grand Mufti, who is Zaki Pasha's host, to warn his guest to moderate his language if he desires to remain in Palestine, otherwise he will be compelled to return to Egypt.

No Jewish Candidates Thus Far Named for Reichstag by New German Constitutional Party

Berlin, Aug. 15—Thus far there are no Jewish candidates included in the list of the new German Constitutional party for the forthcoming elections to the Reichstag. When the party was formed its leaders gave assurances that it sought equality for all citizens. Democratic circles are also disillusioned because their candidate, Georg Bernhardt, editor of the "Vossische Zeitung," has been rejected as a candidate, the Young German League, a constituent element of the Constitutional party, insisting on a Christian candidate.

In the meantime the aims of the anti-Semitic National Socialists in the event that they obtain control or even the balance of power in the next Reichstag were revealed today by M. Kasche, a friend of Adolph Hitler, National Socialist chieftain, speaking at a conference of the party workers and officials at Ostmark.

He explained that should the National Socialists obtain the balance of power they expect to be able to have a National Socialist named minister of the interior, which means control of police, and a National Socialist as minister of war, which means control of the Reichswehr. They also hope to storm the Reichstag, he said, and force through a law appointing Hitler prime minister and dictator and then to occupy the towns and destroy "the Democratic and Jewish nests."

Report Renewal of Religious Persecution in Soviet Russia

Warsaw, Aug. 15—A renewal of the religious persecution in Soviet Russia which early this year aroused the whole world is reported by the orthodox organ, "Tageblatt," on the basis of information received in Jewish circles of Vilna. According to this information the rabbi of Slutsk has been arrested on a charge of counter-revolutionary activity.

Slutsk is a town of 15,000 population not far from the Polish-Russian border.

Memorial Meeting for Riot Victims in Detroit Today

Detroit, Mich., Aug. 15—A memorial meeting in tribute to the martyrs who died during the riots in Palestine in August, 1929, will be held at Congregation Emanuel on Sunday evening, August 17, under the auspices of the Detroit Mizrahi groups. Rabbi A. M. Ashinsky, Mizrahi president, will be the principal speaker, and Rev. Renben Bayarsky will make the El Molei Rachaman.

**\$2,083,818 Raised Here for
Palestine Emergency Fund
Brown's Final Report Shows**

A total of \$2,083,818 was collected from American Jewry for the aid of the stricken Palestine Jews as a result of the Arab riots of last year, it was announced yesterday by David A. Brown, chairman of the Palestine Emergency Fund, in a final report just issued. In addition to this sum there was \$30,407.50 earned in interest which makes the total obtained \$2,114,225.89. This sum does not include \$100,000 which was sent direct to Palestine by Nathan Straus, who gave half of this amount, and by Julius Rosenwald and Felix M. Warburg who each dispatched \$25,000.

After pointing out that the cost of raising this large fund was 3 1/2 percent, and if the interest earned is deducted from expenses the cost was only two percent, Mr. Brown said that \$146,624.79 of the fund still remains in this country. The monies transmitted abroad during the past year were \$716,625.65 to Palestine, \$189,242.88 to England and \$1,000,000 to the Deutsche Bank in Berlin, under a special agreement with Felix M. Warburg to cover allocations already made by the Palestine Emergency Committee in Palestine, which is composed of Pinchas Rutenberg, Dr. Maurice B. Hexter and Col. Frederick Kisch.

After tracing the history of the Palestine Emergency Fund and paying tribute to the personnel of the organizations which aided in raising the fund, Mr. Brown praised the services of the Yiddish, Anglo-Jewish and general press in opening their columns to a plea for funds. Mr. Brown pointed out that his report does not presume to touch upon the actual expenditure of the Fund, this being in the hands of the Palestine Emergency Fund Committee.

**Canadian Hadassah Convention
Opens in Ottawa, September 7**

Ottawa, Aug. 15.—The sixth convention of the Hadassah Organization of Canada will be held in Ottawa on Sunday and Monday, September 7 and 8.

Following the resolutions adopted at their former conventions, the women of the Canadian Hadassah have recently been devoting themselves, for the most part, to the support of the Canadian Hadassah Agricultural School for Girls at Nahalal, and are at present engaged in erecting a new wing of this building, to be known as the Lillian Freiman Wing, in honor of their president, Mrs. A. J. Freiman of Ottawa. Besides lending aid to the campaigns of the Canadian Zionist Organization on behalf of the Keren Hayesod and Jewish National Fund, Hadassah in this country provides for the maintenance budget of the Motza Convalescent Home in Palestine, the second story of which it has built, as well as for the Baby Creche of Jerusalem, the maintenance of this latter being the specific work of the Junior Chapters throughout the country.

Reports of these various phases of Canadian Hadassah activity will be submitted to the sixth convention by chairmen of various committees, while additional reports will be read to the assembled delegates by the treasurer, Mrs. R. Kates, and the secretary, Mrs. R. Singer of Montreal, as well as by the vice-presidents of the Eastern, Central and Western Division, Mesdames L. Fitch and S. Kahn, Montreal; D. Dunkelman and A. Selick, Toronto; and M. Rady and H. E. Wilder, Winnipeg.

**Long Beach Temple Will
Dedicate Talmud Torah Today**

The dedication ceremonies of the new Talmud Torah of Temple Israel of Long Beach, N. Y., will take place on Sunday afternoon. The Talmud Torah, which was built at a cost of \$150,000, will have room for about 300 Jewish children.

The dedication program will consist of addresses by Elvin N. Edwards, district attorney of Nassau County; Hon. Frank Frankel, Mayor of Long Beach; Dr. Gabriel Schulman of the Park Avenue Congregation, New York City, and Rabbi Morris M. Goldberg of Temple Israel, Long Beach. The clergymen of the various Christian denominations of Long Beach will also participate in the dedicatory exercises.

**Registration Starts in
New York Yeshivahs**

Registration of old and new pupils in the elementary and high schools connected with the ten New York Yeshivahs, combined in the United Yeshivah Chest, starts this week, according to an announcement issued by C. Joshua Epstein, vice-president of the organization.

The Yeshivahs functioning in Manhattan, Brooklyn, and the Bronx, had an enrollment last year of close to 5,000 pupils, and it is expected that the number of registrants will be increased.

**Can't Sacrifice Lives of All
Cabinet Ministers for Sake of
Jews, Roumanian Envoy Says**

"We cannot sacrifice the lives of all the members of the Roumanian Government in order to protect the Jews," declared Carol Davila, the Roumanian Minister to the United States, in an interview with the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, yesterday.

"The combatting of the anti-Jewish disturbances in Roumania has already cost the blood of one of the members of the government," Mr. Davila stated, referring to the attempt upon the life of the acting Minister of the Interior, Dr. Constantin Angelescu, who was shot and wounded by one of the anti-Semitic student leaders. "I cannot advise the Roumanian Government to take such measures against the anti-Semitic riots as would endanger the lives of more cabinet members. Moreover, the Roumanian Government knows the situation in the country and takes such steps against the rioters as it considers necessary and most effective."

**Rabbi Kohn Named to Utica
Bethel Synagogue and Center**

Utica, N. Y., Aug. 15.—Rabbi S. Joshua Kohn has been called by the Bethel Synagogue and Center of this city to occupy its pulpit. Rabbi Kohn has just returned from an extended trip to the Holy Land and while there he attended the spring session of the Hebrew University, visited the colonies and all the Jewish settlements of Palestine.

Rabbi Kohn is a graduate of the Jewish Theological Seminary of the class of 1925. Since his graduation he has been rabbi in Philadelphia, occupying the pulpit of the West Philadelphia Jewish Community Center. He was president of the West Philadelphia Zionist District, and vice-president of the Philadelphia Young Judea for four years. He helped to organize the Avukah chapter at the University of Pennsylvania and was on the first administrative committee of the Avukah.

**Rabbi Schorr Heads Temple
Adath Israel in Bronx**

Rabbi Henry A. Schorr has been unanimously elected spiritual leader and minister of Temple Adath Israel of the Bronx, it was announced today by Louis Altschul, president of the temple. Dr. Schorr will begin his duties on September 1.

Dr. Schorr is a member of the first graduating class of the Jewish Institute of Religion and past president of its alumni association. For three years he served Congregation Atereth Israel, Manhattan. When Dr. Joel Blau went to England to serve as Senior Minister of the West End Synagogue, London, Rabbi Schorr succeeded him in Temple Peni-El, now known as the Unity Synagogue, with which congregation Rabbi Schorr has been affiliated for the past four years. Since 1925 Dr. Schorr has served as chaplain of Bellevue Hospital.

Roumania Names Commission to Probe Synagogue Fire

Bucharest, Aug. 15.—The government has appointed an investigating commission of three to probe the fire that early this week damaged the largest Jewish synagogue in Roumania at Maramoresh Sighet. The commission consists of a local judge, the public attorney and the police prefect. The chairman is the supreme state attorney, M. Fildan.

The Iron Guard, anti-Semitic youth organization, is continuing its attacks on the Jews. Leon Herskowitz, a young Jew, was seriously beaten in Galatz and one of his attackers was arrested. In the Kishinev public gardens students attacked Ilie Weinberg. The students were arrested and are being held for trial.

Julius Henry Cohen Named to State Power Commission

Albany, Aug. 15.—Julius Henry Cohen, New York counsel to the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey, has been named by Governor Roosevelt as one of the five members of the St. Lawrence Power Development Commission, whose duty it will be to investigate the development of State-produced power in the St. Lawrence River. The commission is headed by Professor Robert M. Haig of the School of Business of Columbia University.

Among the many famous legal cases in which Mr. Cohen has appeared as counsel, has been that of counsel for the Cloak, Suit and Skirt Manufacturers' Association in the strike of 1910 and for the Dress and Waist Manufacturers' Assn. in the "Protocols of Peace" in women's wear industry. He is the author of "Law and Order in Industry," "The Law, Business or Profession?" "An American Labor Policy" and "Commercial Arbitration and the Law."

Rabbi Mayer Winkler Resigns Los Angeles Pulpit

Los Angeles, Aug. 15.—Feeling that his views on spiritual matters differed materially from those of the majority of his congregation, Rabbi Mayer Winkler, who for the past eight years was the spiritual leader of Temple Sinai, one of the largest Conservative synagogues on the Pacific coast, handed in his resignation, which was regretfully accepted by the congregation, and followed by a vote of thanks for his past eight years of service.

Rabbi Winkler, who was one of the first rabbis in the country to speak regularly over the radio, was recently made a citizen of this country. He is a graduate of Vienna University with the degree of Ph. D., and is also a graduate of the Jewish Theological Seminary of Vienna. He served one year as a rabbi at Homestead, Pa., and was called from there to the Los Angeles pulpit. Rabbi Winkler was appointed Regional Director of the United Synagogue of America in 1925.

Charge Vayda Voevod Subsidized Anti-Semitic Student Group

Bucharest, Aug. 15.—Point blank charges that Dr. Alexander Vayda Voevod, Roumanian minister of the interior, has subsidized the anti-Semitic youth organization, the Iron Guard, and its paper, the "Iron Guard," with government funds are made in today's opposition press. The organ of the Liberal party, "Vittorul," reveals that beginning in July Zelea Codreanu, anti-Semitic agitator and leader of the Iron Guard, who was yesterday acquitted of inciting to riot, had received funds for his organization and its paper from the ministry of the interior on an order from Dr. Vayda Voevod.

Similar charges are made by the Averescu organ, "Dreptatea." These accusations conflict with the assurances recently given by Dr. Vayda Voevod that his department had assigned funds to anti-Semitic students only for cultural work. It appears to be the feeling in the press that the government is attempting to quiet the anti-Semitic students by giving them funds.

Threats against the court at Sighet have been renewed unless it releases the anti-Semitic agitators. A letter signed by "the Iron Hand," says it will do to Sighet "what was done to Borscha, or even worse." The letter describing the judges as "abominable slaves of the Jews" threatens to blow up all the government buildings.

N. Y. Rabbis Start War on "Mushroom Synagogues"

The war on the "mushroom synagogues" which each year spring up just before the High Holidays, is on again. These synagogues have been attacked from two sources, one a condemnatory resolution adopted by the Rabbinical Association of the Yeshivah College calling upon the Jews not to attend services in these temporary synagogues, and the other the enlargement of synagogues in the Bronx.

Pointing out that the "mushroom synagogues" are conducted for the profit of private individuals without any benefit to the community and that the services in them are not conducted in a true religious spirit, the Rabbinical Association urges the Jews not to patronize these synagogues and makes a special plea at this time because the economic crisis makes them a particular menace to the regular congregations.

In the Bronx, Rabbi Jacob Katz, spiritual leader of the Montefiore Congregation, is making arrangements to spend \$10,000 to enlarge the vestry room so that it will accommodate 200 people, or the equivalent of the number of persons ordinarily attending services at one "mushroom synagogue." Other Bronx rabbis who have joined the fight against the "mushroom synagogues" are Dr. Louis Hammer of the Kingsbridge Jewish Center and Dr. Alexander Basel of the Jacob H. Schiff Center.

Galatz Police Prefect to Be Dismissed for Anti-Semitism

Bucharest, Aug. 15.—M. Anastaru, police prefect of Galatz, will be dismissed because an investigation has established that he sponsored the recent anti-Semitic disturbances in Galatz, according to a report in the "Adaverul." In the meantime the district court at Jassy, the seat of the anti-Semitic student movement, has sentenced two students, Tratrastu and Tanait, to twenty days' imprisonment each for maltreating a number of their Jewish colleagues and Persu, a high school student, has been given a milder term for beating Jews in the streets.

While Jewish leaders today asked for an audience with Victor Cadere, chief of the secret police, to ask him to speed up the investigation into the fire that early this week damaged the largest Jewish synagogue in the country at Maramoresh Sighet, the notorious anti-Semitic agitator, Carol Danila and Nicolai Totu, for whom a police dragnet is out, were reported to have passed through Kishinev but before they could be apprehended disappeared again.

Problem of Corpses for Jewish Medical Students to Be Discussed

Warsaw, Aug. 15.—The question of Jewish medical students supplying Jewish medical corpses for anatomical study in the Warsaw University Medical College will be discussed at a special conference of representatives of Polish-Jewish organizations that will be called for this purpose here in Warsaw next month.

For the past few years authorities of Polish medical colleges have been complaining over the fact that Jews do not supply their quota of medical corpses for anatomical study purposes. This has been used as an argument for barring Jews from the medical colleges. On the eve of the new academic year 1930-31 the question has again been raised. It is expected that the Jewish conference next month will come to an agreement with the medical authorities on this matter.

Canada May Further Curtail Immigration from Europe

Ottawa, Aug. 15.—There is a possibility that the new Conservative government will shortly put into effect legislation that will further sharply restrict immigration to Canada from Europe and the United States. This is foreshadowed in a conference of the cabinet today that discussed further immigration restrictions. The desire to close the gates of Canada to immigrants is traceable to the unemployment situation.

It was also announced here today that Senator Raoul Dandurand, Canada's representative on the Council of the League of Nations, who has always championed the rights of minorities, has been replaced by Sir Robert Borden, a former Conservative premier of Canada.

tive for the good of the entire country. "We here cannot give the Roumanian government any suggestions with regard to what measures it should adopt to restore order in Roumania any more than the Roumanian people can give advice or make recommendations to the American government as to how it should conduct its affairs," Mr. Davila declared.

This firm and categorical declaration, pronounced in a tone and manner which left no doubt of his feeling that American Jews should not interfere in the internal affairs of Roumania, Mr. Davila made to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency shortly after he concluded his private conference with the delegation of the American Jewish Congress. Although Mr. Davila's statement to the Jewish delegation was worded in a comforting and diplomatic manner and assured that the Roumanian Government would take all necessary steps to prevent further anti-Jewish occurrences, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency learns that the conference between the American Jewish Congress delegation and Mr. Davila did not run very smoothly. Mr. Davila was rather disturbed by the frank utterances of Rabbi Stephen S. Wise, who openly accused the present Roumanian Government of not fulfilling its duties toward the Jewish citizens of Roumania.

Rabbi Wise and several other members of the Jewish delegation left the conference hall even before the official reply of the Roumanian Minister was made and released.

Yiddish Schools Convention Opens in Syracuse

Syracuse, N. Y., Aug. 15—The annual convention of the Yiddish schools of the Jewish National Workers' Alliance and Poale Zion will open here tomorrow. Delegates from all parts of the United States and Canada, one even from as far west as Los Angeles, are expected to attend.

The opening session tomorrow night will take place in the auditorium of the Temple of the Society of Concord. Among those who will deliver addresses will be J. Entin, Berl Locker, Haim Greenberg, L. Segal, S. Shapiro, S. Whiteman, Leah Biskin and H. Ehrenreich.

Important Trade Developed with Palestine by Czechoslovakia

criticized the indifference of the British government to the fulfillment of the Balfour Declaration. It also emphasized the Jewish National Home as meaning a Jewish state with a Jewish majority and with the full cooperation of the British government in colonization.

The all-night session was devoted to the discussion and adoption of the various resolutions and reports of committees. The resolution advocated by B. Weinstein of Palestine calling for the creation of independent labor unions in Palestine to compete with the General Federation of Jewish Labor was adopted. This resolution was carried despite bitter opposition on the part of Mordecai Danzig, the only American delegate, Dr. Jacob Hoffman from Latvia and M. Klinoff.

The conference adjourned after enthusiastic speeches by Vladimir Jabotinsky, Meer Grossman and Dr. S. E. Soskin. Mr. Jabotinsky termed the conference "a great event in Jewish life. It is a further rejuvenation of the Zionist movement and a sign that the Jewish youth are with us." Meer Grossman, in his closing remarks, indicated the great growth of the movement.

Vladimir Jabotinsky was reelected president of the Union of Zionist Revisionists and Dr. Robert Lichtheim of Germany and Meer Grossman of England were named vice-presidents.

In a statement to the press at the conclusion of the conference Mr. Jabotinsky said, "The conference showed that a new generation of Jews is growing. A new Zionism must be created. Herzlian Zionism that had been crushed has been brought back by Revisionism. We have covered much ground from Vienna to Prague. We keep marching on."

Jew Named to State Teachers' College Board in Minnesota

St. Paul, Aug. 15—Gustavus Loevinger, St. Paul attorney, has been selected by Governor Theodore Christianson as a member of the State Teachers' College board. Mr. Loevinger is one of eight members appointed to the board. The board supervises and directs the curriculum and activities of six teachers' training or normal schools throughout Minnesota.
