GRANT OF NARACOORTE CAVES AS A PUBLIC PLEASURE RESORT, &c.

BY virtue of the provisions of The National Pleasure Resorts Act, 1914, I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby grant unto the Attorney-General, being the Minister of the Crown to whom, for the time being, the administration of the said Act is committed, the lands belonging to the Crown described in the schedule hereto for the purpose of being used by the public as a pleasure resort, park, or recreation ground: Provided, however, that the said lands, or any part or parts thereof, may at any time be resumed by the Governor of the said State, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, for and on behalf of the Crown.

EDUCATION REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Office, at Adelaide, this twenty-third day of February, 1917.

Present—

His Excellency the Governor.

The Hon. the Chief Secretary.

The Hon. the Minister of Industry, Minister of Mines, and Minister of Marine.

BY virtue of the provisions of The Education Act, 1915, and The Acts Interpretation Act, 1915, His Excellency the Governor in Council hereby—

(1) varies the regulation numbered XXIV., 27, made under the Education Act, 1915, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 18th day of January, 1917, by inserting at the end thereof the following paragraph:—

Four Senior Exhibitions of the value of £20 per annum tenable for two years at a high school, or other secondary school approved by the Minister, shall be open for annual competition among pupils of secondary schools within a radius of 10 miles of the General Post Office, Adelaide;

(2) declares that the schedules A, A1, A2, B, B1, and B2, following the regulation numbered XXIV., 42, made under the Education Act, 1915, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 18th day of January, 1917, are substituted for the schedules A, A1, A2, B, B1, and B2 which were repealed by the Order in Council made under the Education Act, 1915, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 15th day of January, 1917.

And the Honorable the Minister of Education is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
