2019-2020 session roll call votes by your state legislators on key small business issues are listed here. Although this voting record does not reflect all elements considered by a lawmaker when voting, nor does it represent a complete profile of a legislator, it can be a guide in evaluating your legislators' attitudes toward small business. Please thank those legislators who supported small business.

SENATE

- 1. SR 20, PN 0155 (BAKER), ADOPTION (FEB 5, 2019):** Resolution directing the Legislative Budget & Finance Committee to conduct a study of the impact of venue on medical professional liability actions. **A "Yes" vote supports the NFIB position.** The bill passed 31-18.
- 2. SB 139, PN 0851 (J. WARD), FINAL PASSAGE (JUN 4, 2019):** Amends the Price Gouging Act to clarify certain provisions relating to business restrictions during a state of disaster emergency. **A "Yes" vote supports the NFIB position.** The bill passed 31-17.
- 3. HB 17, PN 2900 (RYAN), FINAL PASSAGE (NOV 19, 2019):** Amended the Tax Reform Code to require the collection of Personal Income Tax to be made within 10 years from the date the return was first due. **A "Yes" vote supports the NFIB position.** The bill passed 48-1 and became Act 90 of 2019.
- 4. SB 613, PN 1636 (MENSCH), CONCUR IN HOUSE AMENDMENTS (APR 15, 2020):** Required the Governor to develop and implement a Mitigation Plan for Business and Industry using COVID-19 guidance from the Centers from Disease Control and Prevention and conforming to the Advisory Memorandum on Identification of Essential Critical Infrastructure Workers During COVID-19 Response, as published by the U.S. Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA). **A "Yes" vote supports the NFIB position.** The Senate concurred in House amendments 29-21, and the bill was vetoed by the Governor.
- 5. SB 327, PN 1700 (ARGALL), CONCUR IN HOUSE AMENDMENTS (MAY 13, 2020):** Provided several COVID-19 response measures, including: allowing for the creation of County Emergency Mitigation Plans; notification by the Governor of statutes and

regulations suspended, modified, or waived during the disaster declaration; provisions for a state debt cost reduction review; and the creation of a COVID-19 Cost and Recovery Task Force. **A "Yes" vote supports the NFIB position.** The Senate concurred in House amendments 28-20, and the bill was vetoed by the Governor.

- 6. HB 2388, PN 3719 (MIHALEK), FINAL PASSAGE (MAY 13, 2020):** Required the Governor to immediately issue waivers to vehicle dealers, lawn and garden centers, cosmetology salons, barbers, messenger services, animal groomers, and manufacturers to allow these industries to safely provide their services during the disaster emergency. **A "Yes" vote supports the NFIB position.** The bill passed 31-17, but was vetoed by the Governor.
- 7. HB 2412, PN 3720 (POLINCHOCK), FINAL PASSAGE (MAY 13, 2020):** Required the Governor to immediately issue waivers to real estate activities of brokers, salespersons, and licensees, allowing these professionals to provide their services while following guidelines during the disaster emergency. **A "Yes" vote supports the NFIB position.** The bill passed 33-15, but was vetoed by the Governor.
- 8. HCRRR 1 (MAY 27, 2020): Concurrent resolution disapproving of the Department of Labor and Industry's final-form regulation #12-106:** Minimum Wage, which significantly expands overtime eligibility requirements for non-exempt employees. **A "Yes" vote supports the NFIB position.** The concurrent resolution passed 29-21, but was vetoed by the Governor.

- 9. SB 1166, PN 1835 (K. WARD), FINAL PASSAGE (JUL 15, 2020):** Amends the Pennsylvania Constitution to limit a Governor's emergency declarations to 21 days without legislative approval and clarify that the General Assembly can terminate or extend a Governor's emergency declaration without the Governor's approval. Also prohibits racial or ethnic discrimination under law. **A "Yes" vote supports the NFIB position.** The bill passed 33-17.
- HOUSE ONLY**
- 1. HB 522, PN 0987 (TOBASH), FINAL PASSAGE (MAR. 19, 2019):** Establishes the Career and Technical Education Investment Incentive Program, a tax credit program to incentivize business investment in career and technical education training programs in participating schools. **A "Yes" vote supports the NFIB position.** The bill passed 162-34.
- 2. HB 349, PN 1129 (HEFFLEY), FINAL PASSAGE (APR 8, 2019):** Requires that municipalities enforcing the Uniform Construction Code (UCC) through third-party agencies have at least two or more agencies under contract to perform these services. **A "Yes" vote supports the NFIB position.** The bill passed 114-84.
- 3. HB 17, PN 1851 (RYAN), FINAL PASSAGE (SEP 19, 2019):** Amended the Tax Reform Code to require the collection of Personal Income Tax to be made within 10 years from the date the return was first due. **A "Yes" vote supports the NFIB position.** The bill passed 155-31 and became Act 90 of 2019.
- 4. HB 1055, PN 1407 (KLUNK), RECONSIDERATION (SEP 24, 2019):** Establishes the Independent Office of the Repeater to make recommendations to repeal, modify, or revise existing regulations. **A "Yes" vote supports the NFIB position.** The bill passed 103-98.
- 5. SB 613, PN 1636 (MENSCH), FINAL PASSAGE (APR 14, 2020):** Required the Governor to develop and implement a Mitigation Plan for Business and Industry using COVID-19 guidance from the Centers from Disease Control and Prevention and conforming to the Advisory Memorandum on Identification of Essential Critical Infrastructure Workers During COVID-19 Response, as published by the U.S. Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA). **A "Yes" vote supports the NFIB position.** The bill passed 107-95 and was vetoed by the Governor.
- 6. HB 2400, PN 3520 (TURZAI), FINAL PASSAGE (APR 21, 2020):** Requires the Secretary of Community and Economic Development to issue waivers to all construction activities that adhere to required mitigation measures. **A "Yes" vote supports the NFIB position.** The bill passed 111-91.
- 7. HB 2376; PN 2566 (ROAE), FINAL PASSAGE (APR 21, 2020):** Prohibits the Governor from closing retail store operations during a disaster emergency if the store limits customers to one at a time; provides for contactless and curbside operations for other businesses. **A "Yes" vote supports the NFIB position.** The bill passed 112-90.
- 8. SB 327, PN 1700 (ARGALL), CONCUR IN SENATE AMENDMENTS (MAY 14, 2020):** Provided several COVID-19 response measures, including: allowing for the creation of County Emergency Mitigation Plans; notification by the Governor of statutes and regulations suspended, modified, or waived during the disaster declaration; provisions for a state debt cost reduction review; and the creation of a COVID-19 Cost and Recovery Task Force. **A "Yes" vote supports the NFIB position.** The House concurred in Senate amendments 108-94, and the bill was vetoed by the Governor.
- 9. HB 2025, PN 3907 (STRUZZI), FINAL PASSAGE (JUL 8, 2020):** Provides that the Department of Environmental Protection may not establish or join a state or regional greenhouse gas cap-and-trade program unless the General Assembly specifically authorizes such a measure. **A "Yes" vote supports the NFIB position.** The bill passed 130-71.
- 10. SB 1166, PN 1835 (K. WARD), FINAL PASSAGE (JUL 14, 2020):** Constitutional amendment limiting a Governor's emergency declarations to 21 days without legislative approval and clarifying that the General Assembly can terminate or extend a Governor's emergency declaration without the Governor's approval. Also prohibits racial or ethnic discrimination under law. **A "Yes" vote supports the NFIB position.** The bill passed 115-86.
