HOUSE AND SENATE

- 1. Low Carbon Fuel Standard (HB 1091):** Gas and diesel prices will substantially increase due to this new "clean fuels" standard, which requires refineries to reduce the carbon intensity of transportation fuels. **A "No" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed the House 54-43. Passed the Senate 26-23. Signed by the governor. (2021)
- 2. Worker Protection Act (HB 1097):** This legislation extends the period of time workers can file complaints alleging discrimination or retaliation. It also added a new daily penalty for businesses refusing to comply with a stop-work order issued by the state Department of Labor & Industries (L&I), including those objecting to COVID-related closure demands. **A "No" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed the House 53-45. Passed the Senate 30-19. Signed by the governor. (2021)
- 3. WA Cares payroll tax delay (HB 1732):** Following widespread complaints from businesses, the Legislature approved an 18-month delay in implementing a payroll tax to fund the WA Cares long-term services and supports benefit program. **A "Yes" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed the House 91-6. Passed the Senate 46-3. Signed by the governor. (2022)
- 4. Climate Commitment Act (SB 5126):** This bill establishes a cap-and-trade program intended to reduce carbon emissions. Electricity, fuel, manufacturing, shipping, and transportation costs are expected to increase as a result. **A "No" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed the Senate 27-22. Passed the House 54-43. Signed by the governor. (2021)
- 5. Wage liens (SB 5355):** The bill allows workers to lien the personal assets of a business owner, the owner's spouse, or estate, in wage disputes. **A "No" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed the Senate 25-24. Passed the House 51-46. Signed by the governor. (2021)
- 6. Unemployment tax relief (SB 5873):** NFIB won \$500 million in targeted unemployment tax relief in 2021, and another \$250 million in temporary tax reductions in 2022, that primarily benefits small employers. Both bills received near unanimous votes; we are counting the most recent bill. **A "Yes" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed the Senate 48-1. Passed the House 95-0. Signed by the governor. (2022)
- 7. State Business & Occupations (B&O) Tax relief (SB 5980):** Building on last year's success exempting PPP, EIDL, and other COVID-related assistance from B&O tax, NFIB won an increase in the B&O Small Business Tax Credit this year. The increased credit will effectively exempt all firms with up to \$125,000 in annual gross receipts from the B&O tax. A partial tax credit will apply for businesses grossing nearly double that amount. **A "Yes" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed the Senate 48-0. Passed the House 97-0. Signed by the governor. (2022)
- 8. Extending COVID emergency orders (SJR 8402):** This resolution ratified and extended Governor Jay Inslee's state of emergency and executive orders issued in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. NFIB supports greater legislative oversight when states of emergency last longer than 60 days. **A "No" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed the Senate 28-19. Passed the House 54-44.

SENATE ONLY

9. Credit card processing fees (SB 5459): This bill would have corrected a recent state Department of Revenue decision that subjects credit card processing fees to double taxation under B&O Tax, increasing costs to small businesses and other merchants. **A "Yes" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed the Senate 38-10. (2022)

10. Workers' compensation appeals (SB 5801): NFIB led a coalition of small-employer groups that defeated this L&I agency request legislation. The bill would have required employers to pay workers' attorney fees and other court costs when losing on any single point of contention in an appeal to superior court or an appellate court. **A "No" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed the Senate 28-21. (2022)

HOUSE ONLY

11. Qui tam authority (HB 1076): This bill would have allowed trial attorneys, labor unions, and other third parties to sue employers for alleged violations of nearly a dozen workplace safety and health or worker rights laws – even if L&I had declined to issue a citation. **A "No" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed the House 53-44. Died in the Senate Ways & Means Committee. (2021)

12. Ergonomics (HB 1837): This bill would have allowed L&I to impose rules limiting repetitive motions a worker could perform during the workday. Voters expressly prohibited this \$1 billion regulatory burden on employers by passing Initiative 841 nearly 20 years ago. **A "No" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed the House 50-48. (2022)
