IRFAN COLLOQUIUM - Mysticism and the Bahá'í Faith.

The Irfan Colloquium is an annual gathering of those engaged or seriously interested in studies related to the fundamental principles of the Bahá'í belief system; academic studies of the Bahá'í holy texts; and comparative studies of the world religions in relation to Bahá'í Faith. The main theme of the Irfan Colloquium in 2001 is "Mysticism and the Bahá'í Faith." The colloquium will be followed by a seminar on the Writings of Bahá'u'lláh revealed during the late 'Akká period. Among those presenting papers this year are: Prof Moshe Sharon (from Israel), Stephen Lambden, Moojan Momen, and Enoch Tanyi (from the Cameroons)
