## English Residential Schools

THE BELOVED GUARDIAN wrote to an individual,

*“... the world is undoubtedly facing a great crisis and the social, economic and political conditions are daily becoming more complex. Should the friends desire to take the lead in informing the world, they should start by educating themselves and understand what the troubles and problems really are which baffle the minds of men. It is in these Summer Schools that this training should be provided for the friends.”*

(From letter written on behalf of the Guardian to an individual believer, 27th January, 1932)

To this end, the Bahá'í Council for England is sponsoring three residential schools in beautiful surroundings for the friends to come together and strengthen our bonds, increase our understanding and resolve, and better serve the Cause and the generality of Mankind.
