Trade Demand Index

Our Trade Demand Index has seen both its lowest and highest readings within a span of just 15 months.

The post-Covid era of low interest rates, housing shortages, soaring house prices and closed borders has created a strong boom in the trades. Skilled labour shortages are adding to the heat.

Look for a slight cooling effect as recent record quarterly inflation, LVR restrictions and investor disincentives, followed by predicted interest rate rises play out. However, the capital gains many homeowners have made over the last year, combined with ongoing housing shortages and closed borders will work to limit cooling overall.
