Moorish Troops and 100 Tanks, Using Fire, **Push Ahead**

MADRID FALLS

LOAYZA (Copyright, 1936, By Universal Service) MADRID, Nov. 8 (Sunday)-The streets of Madrid early today resounded to the swelling din of a mighty battle as Spain's victorious Insurgent troops, fighting toward the center of the falling capital, hammered violently at bullet-spiting militia barricades.

Fierce Moorish shock troops, aided by 100 tanks, armored cars and flamethrowers, seized the whole west bank of the Manzan-ares River and the Casa del Campo FOR ARGENTINE Park in the western section of the embattled metropolis, then charged into the city's bulwarked thoroughfares.

The advancing invaders encountered Madrid's men and women defenders, obeying orders to "give up your lines before losing another inch," in mortal hand-to-hand and house to house combat.

A determined move to prevent the establishment of the new Magistrates Court system in Queens was under way last night.

Leaders of the bar, civic groups and police came out with strong statements opposing the new setup which would create a boroughwide traffic court in Jamaica and a borough-wide felony court in Ridgewood.

The possibility loomed that, If the new system, which is to go into effect Dec. 1, is not scrapped because of protest, the case may be fought out in the courts.

Among those protesting last night were Pierce H. Power, vicepresident of the Queensboro Chamber of Commerce; Frank A. Bellucci, president of the Queens Bar Association, and Walter Hogan, president of the Jamaica Lawyers Association.

The new setup, which was announced yesterday by Chief Magistrate Jacob Gould Schurman, Jr., met with immediate opposition.

Leaders of the opposition pointed out that, if the plan were put into effect, it would mean the scrapping of Ridgewood and Jamaica courts for all but their special purposes. All other cases, which now are heard in these courts, would be delegated to other courts at great inconvenience to the public because of the great size of the borough.

Recalls Fights

Power, recalling the civic battles that were fought to source additonal magistrates courts in Queens to answer the demands, declared:

"This order of Chief Magistrate Schurman is a practical reversion to conditions that were yound intolerable ten and fifteen years ago. In my opinion it is no vise or farseeing remedy of any existing undesirable condition. 


