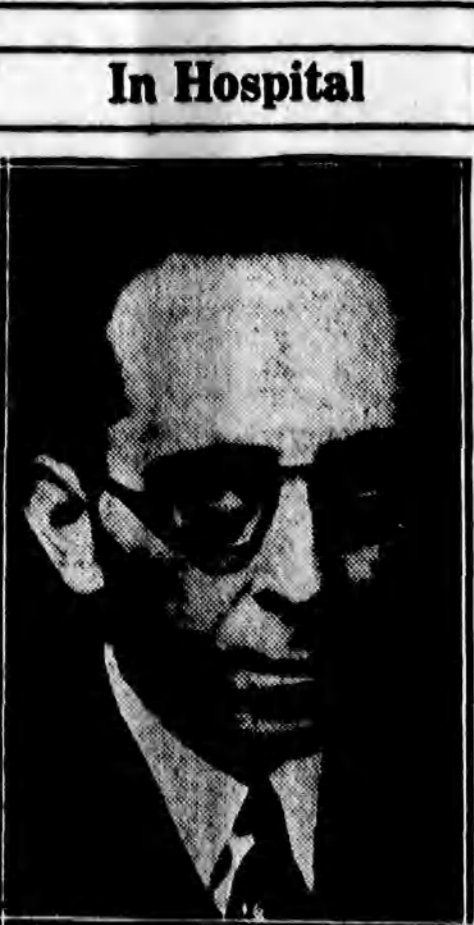
Flushing Crash Injures Three
