Get Admitted

At Hinds, it's easy to enroll, and there's no application fee! Hinds Community College has an open-door admission policy that offers all students general admission to the college.

Find Your Admission Type

High School Graduate

- Submit your final official high school transcript, showing your graduation date.
- Submit official ACT scores or take the Accuplacer at any Hinds campus.

College Transfer

- Submit the official transcript from the last college attended. If the transcript shows in-progress courses, you must submit an updated transcript after your final grades are posted.
- If you did not complete at least one English and Math course in college, submit official ACT scores or take Accuplacer at any Hinds campus.

Returning to Hinds

 If Hinds was the last college you attended, and you are returning after sitting out one or more semesters, you will only need to submit a new admission application.

Special Admissions

 Nursing, Allied Health, and some career/technical programs have additional applications and/or admission requirements. See page 4-5 or visit hindscc.edu/programs for details.

Dual Enrollment

- Submit your official high school transcript, showing the completion of at least ten core units.
- Submit official ACT scores or take the Accuplacer at any Hinds campus.
- Submit a letter of recommendation from your high school counselor or principal.

Equivalency Diploma

- Submit an official High School Equivalency diploma transcript: either GED, Hi-SET, TASC or MS.
 Competency Based diploma. Use diplomasender.com
- Submit official ACT scores or take the Accuplacer at any Hinds campus.

No High School Diploma

- If you do not hold a high school diploma or equivalency diploma, or if you have an occupational or certificate diploma, you can still enroll in college through our MI-BEST program.
- MI-BEST (Mississippi Integrated Basic Education and Skills Training) is a unique program that allows you to work on your high school equivalency diploma and pursue college credit at the same time!
- Plus, financial aid is available to qualifying MI-BEST students. Contact us for more information at 601.857.3914.

My.Hinds

My. Hinds is the portal to your student account. This is the official location for you to manage your student information. It is important for you to begin using My. Hinds before you become a student and all throughout your time at Hinds.

Use My.Hinds

Log in to your My. Hinds account to:

- View your admissions documents and financial aid status
- Register for classes (after being advised) and view your class schedule
- Sign your financial aid award letter
- Track your academic progress and your grades
- View your balance, set up a payment plan, or make online payments
- · Check your Hinds email
- Download free software such as Microsoft Word, Excel, and Power Point
- View announcements, the college calendar, and more!

Log In

Several business days after you apply to Hinds, you will be able to download your Welcome Letter from within your Applicant Profile. This letter includes your HindsNet ID. As soon as you download your Welcome Letter, go to my.hindscc.edu to log in to My.Hinds.

If you've never logged in before, follow these instructions:

- HindsNet ID = The first initial of your last name (capitalized) + your seven digit Student ID
- Password = The first initial of your first name (capitalized) + the first initial of your last name (capitalized) + your six digit DOB (MMDDYY) + \$

Hinds Email

Your Hinds email is the official method of communication from the college. Begin checking your Hinds email regularly for important updates and announcements.

Financial Aid Checklist

- ☐ Apply for state aid at msfinancialaid.org. Deadline each year is September 15.
- ☐ When applying for federal aid, enter Hinds' school code OO2407 (for all 6 Hinds locations) and use the "IRS Data Retrieval" option to ensure prompt awarding.
- Apply for scholarships and Veteran benefits, if eligible. Some scholarships have deadlines. For a list of scholarships, deadlines, and applications, visit hindscc.edu/ scholarships.
- ☐ Complete your financial aid file by submitting all required documents as requested by the Office of Financial Aid. These documents may be viewed in your My.Hinds account.
- Once your financial aid file is complete, you will receive an award notification through your My. Hinds email account.
 If you are awarded aid, you must accept your award within your My. Hinds account (see page 8).
- ☐ If awarded, financial aid will be available for the payment of your Hinds fees 10 days prior to the first day of classes, as long as you have submitted all required admission documents.



Scholarships

Foundation Scholarship

Awarded on a competitive basis to students who demonstrate academic excellence, a desire for achievement, involvement in extracurricular activities, and/or financial need. Students wishing to be considered on the basis of financial need should submit a FAFSA to Hinds Community College by February 15.

Award: amounts vary, awarded every fall semester

Deadline: February 15

How to Apply:

- Submit an application for admission.
- Submit an application for the Foundation Scholarship at hindscc.edu/foundationscholarship.
- Submit two letters of recommendation from individuals representing areas such school, church, community, civic, work, etc. It is the student's responsibility to make sure their recommendations have been submitted by the February 15 deadline.
- Submit a typed resume, which includes a list of achievements, honors, extracurricular activities, work, etc.
- Submit a copy of your high school transcript or equivalency diploma transcript and college transcripts, if applicable.
 Transcripts should verify a current cumulative GPA of 2.0 or above. If GPA is not listed on the high school transcript, submit a signed High School GPA Verification Form.
- Submit ACT scores (or Accuplacer scores if ACT has not been taken).

Only complete scholarship files will be considered. Submit all required documents by February 15 to the Office of Enrollment Services, P.O. Box 1100, Raymond, MS 39154 or by email to scholarships@hindscc.edu or in person at Fountain Hall, Raymond Campus.

Honors Scholarships

The Honors Institute, housed on the Rankin and Raymond Campuses, offers Honors classes, leadership opportunities and international study in an enhanced and supportive learning environment. To join, students must complete an Honors application and submit two letters of recommendation. Honors program members are eligible for Honors Scholarships. ACT Freshman Scholarship

Award: total award amount listed is divided equally over four consecutive semesters (excluding summer terms)

ACT 21 – 24	Faculty Scholarship - \$4,000
ACT 25 – 28	Dean's Scholarship - \$6,000
	President's Scholarship - \$12,000

Deadline: first day of classes of the first freshman semester (excluding summer terms)

How to Apply:

- · Submit an application for admission.
- Submit an official ACT composite score of 21 or above before the first day of classes. The scholarship award amount is based on the highest ACT composite score on file in the Office of Admissions on the first day of classes. Scholarship award amounts cannot be changed by submitting a new score after the first day of classes.
- Must be a first-time entering freshman, meaning Hinds must be the first college you attend after receiving your high school diploma or high school equivalency diploma.
- Be admitted to Hinds as a Mississippi resident.

Valedictorian & Salutatorian Scholarships

Awarded to high school seniors graduating as Valedictorian or Salutatorian from an accredited high school located in the Hinds Community College District (Hinds, Rankin, Warren, Claiborne, and Copiah counties).

Award: full-tuition for up to four consecutive semesters (excluding summer terms)

Deadline: July 1 Priority Deadline

How to Apply:

- · Submit an application for admission.
- Submit the Application for the Valedictorian & Salutatorian Scholarship at hindscc.edu/scholarships.
- Submit a final high school transcript verifying class rank as 1st or 2nd in your class from an accredited high school in Hinds, Rankin, Warren, Claiborne, or Copiah county.
- Must be a first-time entering freshman, meaning Hinds must be the first college you attend after receiving your high school diploma or high school equivalency diploma.
- Be admitted to Hinds as a Mississippi resident.





Career & Technical Competition Winner

Awarded on a competitive basis to graduating seniors who placed first in a Skills USA, HOSA, FBLA, DECA, FFA, or TSA competitive event while enrolled in a high school career or technical program. This scholarship is offered in order to promote career and technical education and is exclusively for students who wish to continue their education at Hinds in a career or technical program of study.

Award: One-year, full-tuition scholarship

Deadline: July 1 Priority Deadline

How to Apply:

- Submit an application for admission.
- Submit the Application for the Career & Technical Competition Winner Scholarship at hindscc.edu/ scholarships.
- Submit evidence of your first-place award in an approved career/technical competition.
- Must be a first-time entering freshman, meaning Hinds must be the first college you attend after receiving your high school diploma or high school equivalency diploma.
- Be admitted to Hinds as a Mississippi resident.
- Enroll in an approved career or technical program.

HSE Scholarships

Awarded to eligible high school equivalency (HSE) diploma recipients.

Award: varies according to the two options listed below

Deadline: first day of classes of the first freshman semester

HSE First Class Free Award: allows an HSE diploma recipient to receive their first class free.

HSE Scholarship: awarded to students who achieved one of the following scores: GED score of 640 or above; HiSET scores of 75 or above; TASC total score of 2800 or above. Recipients may receive \$1,000/semester for up to four consecutive semesters (excluding summers).

How to Apply:

- · Submit an application for admission.
- Submit the HSE Scholarships Application at hindscc.edu/ scholarships.

- Submit official HSE diploma transcript.
- Must be a first-time entering freshman (Hinds is the first college you attend after receiving your HSE diploma.)
- Must be at least 17 years of age.
- Be admitted to Hinds as a Mississippi resident.

Resident Assistant Award

Resident Assistants (RAs) serve as student leaders in our Residence Halls, providing support to professional housing staff with day-to-day operations. RAs also serve as facilitators, mediators and a resource for residential students. Because of their responsibilities and leadership role, RAs receive a financial award equivalent to full in-state tuition, room and board. Applicants for an RA position must have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or above and be in good standing with the College. To apply, contact the Housing Office at 601-857-3222 (Raymond) or 601-885-7195 (Utica).



After you register for classes, you will owe tuition and fees. Log in to your My. Hinds student account to view your itemized statement. Paper bills are not mailed.

To retain your classes, you must do one of the following by the payment deadline:

- · Have awarded financial aid that covers all expenses. You are responsible for any fees not covered by financial aid - OR -
- Set up an automatic payment plan in your My. Hinds account (see hindscc.edu/automaticpayment for details) - OR -
- Pay entire balance with cash, check, or credit card.

No financial aid will be applied to your account until you are fully admitted to the College by submitting all required documents as requested by the Office of Admissions.

Register for Classes

After completing your admission requirements, you are ready to register for classes. Registration takes place before the fall, spring, and summer terms each year. View the registration dates for the upcoming semester at hindscc.edu/enroll.

How to Register

- First-time Hinds students must visit with a Hinds counselor at any of our six locations. A counselor will talk with you one-on-one about your major and help you select the right classes.
- No appointment is necessary to see a counselor for class registration. Simply visit any Hinds campus during our open registration dates.
- If you are taking all online classes, you may submit an online advising request at hindscc.edu/elearning, and a counselor will advise and register you for classes via email.
- Before you come to campus to register, be sure you have already submitted your admission application. In addition, freshman students must first submit either their ACT or Accuplacer scores. College transfers must first submit a college transcript showing the completion of at least one English and one Math course.

Testing & Placement

- Hinds uses ACT or Accuplacer scores to place first-time college students in the appropriate classes.
- First-time college students who have not had the ACT must take the Accuplacer, a free placement test given in a computer lab at all Hinds campuses. To find a test time, visit hindscc.edu/testing. You may also study in advance for the Accuplacer at accuplacer.org.
- For college transfer students, a counselor will advise you based on previous college coursework. If you have successfully completed three credit hours of English and three credit hours of Math, test scores may not be required.
- Students not ready for college-level coursework will first take developmental courses, which could require additional time to complete an associate's degree.



Disability Support Services

Hinds Community College provides reasonable and appropriate accommodations for students with disabilities. Disability Services staff members verify eligibility for accommodations and work with eligible students who have self-identified and provided current documentation. Students with disabilities should schedule an appointment with the designated Disability Services staff member on their respective campus to establish a plan for reasonable, appropriate classroom accommodations.

- Attend a New Student Orientation. Before the semester begins, we will contact you about orientation dates for the campus where you will be residing. (Only for students beginning in the fall semester.)
- ☐ Move in! During the designated move-in dates, you will be able to check into your residence hall after you complete all of the following:
 - 1. Register for 15 or more credit hours.
 - 2. Show proof of full payment for tuition, room, board and other fees.
 - 3. Attend a New Student Orientation at your campus.

The Priority Deadlines are June 15 (fall semester) and November 15 (spring semester.) However, residence halls fill on a first come, first serve basis, so students are encouraged to apply early.






Get Ready for Classes

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
