ECU has been ranked Australia's top public university for undergraduate teaching quality for the past seven years, according to the QILT (Quality Indicators in Learning and Teaching) survey results.

Our reputation for teaching quality was also highlighted in the 2023 Good Universities Guide, where ECU has maintained its long-standing five-star rating for teaching quality for an impressive 16 years in a row.

The University was ranked in the top 400 in the Times Higher Education World University Rankings 2023, an annual list of the top universities based on their teaching, research, and international outlook.

ECU was granted university status in 1991, and has close to 30,000 students, from 95 countries.

ECU has eight Schools – Arts and Humanities; Business and Law; Education; Engineering; Medical and Health Sciences; Nursing and Midwifery; Science; and the Western Australian Academy of Performing Arts (WAAPA). These Schools deliver a wide range of on-campus and online courses.





The SES measure relates to undergraduate domestic and onshore international students. The SES measure is percent Satisfied. This is the percentage of responses which score 3 or 4 (Good or Excellent) on a 4-point satisfaction scale. The GOS full-time employment, overall employment and median salary measures relate to undergraduate domestic graduates only. Full-time employment is the percentage of undergraduate domestic graduates in full-time employment as a proportion of all undergraduate domestic graduates who were available for employment. Overall employment measure includes full-time, part-time and casual employment. Graduates are surveyed 4 months after course completion, mainly May for end-of-year completers.

A FWCI of 1 indicates that the publications have been cited at world average for similar publications (with "world" referring to the total set of publications indexed in the Scopus database). FTE includes academic staff classified "Research" reported to the Department of Education for the Higher Education Staff Data Collection as at 31 March. FTE excludes VET and casual/sessional academic staff.
