**EUROPEAN UNION (RESTRICTIVE MEASURES)  
 (LIBYA) REGULATIONS 2011.**

The Minister for Enterprise, Trade and Innovation, Richard Bruton, T.D., in exercise of the powers conferred on him by Section 3 (as amended by Section 2 of the European Communities Act 2007 (No. 18 of 2007)) of the European Communities Act 1972 (No. 27 of 1972), has made Regulations that may be cited as the European Union (Restrictive Measures) (Libya) Regulations 2011.

The effect of this Regulation is to provide for penalties for infringements of Council Regulation (EU) No. 204 of 2 March 2011 concerning certain restrictive measures in view of the situation in Libya. The Regulation prohibits the sale, transfer, export and import of equipment which might be used for internal repression and prohibits the provision of technical assistance or brokering services related to equipment which might be used for internal repression.

INLAND FISHERIES ACTS 1959 TO 2010

CONSERVATION OF SALMON AND SEA TROUT  
(RIVER SUIR) (CATCH AND RELEASE) BYE-LAW  
No. 880, 2011.

I, Pat Rabbitte, Minister for Communications, Energy and Natural Resources, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 57 of the Inland Fisheries Act 2010 (No. 10 of 2010) and having complied with the requirements of Regulation 31 of the European Communities (Natural Habitats) Regulations 1997 (S.I. No. 94 of 1997), at the request of Inland Fisheries Ireland hereby make the following bye-law:

1. (1) This Bye-law may be cited as the Conservation of Salmon and Sea Trout (River Suir) (Catch and Release) Bye-law No. 880, 2011.

(2) This Bye-law comes into operation on 17 March, 2011.

2. In this Bye-law—

“catch and release” in relation to angling for salmon and sea trout in the specified waters, means carefully handling any fish caught and immediately returning the fish alive to the waters;

“fish” means either salmon or sea trout or a combination of both;

“salmon” means fish of the species *Salmo salar* (Atlantic salmon);

“sea trout” means fish of the migratory form of *Salmo trutta*, but does not include a sea trout which is 40 centimetres or less in length measured in a straight line from the tip of the snout to the fork of the tail;

“specified waters” means the waters of the Rivers Suir, Clodiagh, Lingaun and Blackwater in the No. 3 or Waterford District.

3. Notwithstanding the permission contained in Article 4(a) of the Conservation of Salmon and Sea Trout (Bag Limits) Bye-law No. 874, 2010, from 17 March to 14 August during the year 2011, a person shall not —

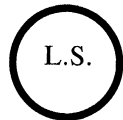
(a) take, from the specified waters, by rod and line any fish other than by catch and release, or

(b) use or attempt to use worms as bait or any fish hooks, other than single barbless hooks, in angling for salmon and sea trout in those waters.

4. Notwithstanding the permission contained in Article 3 of the Conservation of Salmon and Sea Trout (Bag Limits) Bye-law No. 874, 2010, a person shall not take, from the specified waters, by rod and line during the period from 15 August 2011 to 30 September 2011 more than 1 fish.

5. Subject to Article 6, it is prohibited for a person where he or she has taken the number of fish permitted under Article 4, to take by rod and line any further fish from the specified waters other than by catch and release.

6. A person angling for fish in accordance with Articles 4 and 5 shall not use or attempt to use worms as bait or any fish hooks, other than single barbless hooks.

This Bye-Law provides for catch and release in angling for salmon and sea trout (over 40cm) in the River Suir (including the waters of the Rivers Clodiagh, Lingaun and Blackwater) in the No. 3 or Waterford district during the period 17 March to 14 August, 2011 and a restricted bag limit of 1 fish during the period 15 August to 30 September, 2011. The Bye-law also prohibits the use of worms as bait and any fish hooks other than single barbless hooks in angling for salmon and sea trout (over 40cm) in those waters.

I, Pat Rabbitte, Minister for Communications, Energy and Natural Resources, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 57 of the Inland Fisheries Act 2010 (No. 10 of 2010) and having complied with the requirements of Regulation 31 of the European Communities (Natural Habitats) Regulations

1997 (S.I. No. 94 of 1997), at the request of Inland Fisheries Ireland hereby make the following bye-law:

1. (1) This Bye-law may be cited as the Conservation of Salmon and Sea Trout (River Nore) (Bag Limits) Bye-law No. 879, 2011.

(2) This Bye-law comes into operation on 17 March, 2011.

2. In this Bye-law—

“catch and release” in relation to angling for salmon and sea trout in the specified waters, means carefully handling any fish caught and immediately returning the fish alive to the waters;

“fish” means either salmon or sea trout or a combination of both;

“salmon” means fish of the species *Salmo salar* (Atlantic salmon);

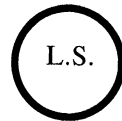
“sea trout” means fish of the migratory form of *Salmo trutta*, but does not include a sea trout which is 40 centimetres or less in length measured in a straight line from the tip of the snout to the fork of the tail;

“specified waters” means the waters of the River Nore in the No. 3 or Waterford District.

3. Notwithstanding Article 4 of the Conservation of Salmon and Sea Trout (Bag Limits) Bye-law No. 874, 2010, prohibiting the taking or having in possession of more than a specified number of salmon or sea trout, a person shall not take by rod and line more than 5 fish from the waters of the River Nore during the period from 17 March to 30 September 2011 but no more than 1 fish on any day during that period.

4. Subject to Article 5, it is prohibited for a person where he or she has taken the number of fish permitted under Article 3, to take by rod and line any further fish from the specified waters other than by catch and release.

5. A person angling for fish in accordance with Articles 3 and 4 shall not use or attempt to use worms as bait or any fish hooks, other than single barbless hooks.
