

POCKET ARTICLE HOLDER.

Application filed June 6, 1928. Serial No. 283,374.

In accordance with the present invention, 5 the holder is improved first by providing it with an outside pocket for receiving an automobile driver's license card. Secondly, the holder is improved by providing the central portion of the leather holder, on its inner 10 surface, with a backing and reinforcing plate, which prevents collapsing of the holder and bending or distortion of the license card.

These improvements will be better understood from the following detailed description

15 and drawings.

In the drawing:

Figure 1 is a perspective view of the holder constructed in accordance with the present invention, showing the card pocket.

Figure 2 is a perspective view showing the

inside construction.

Figure 3 is a central longitudinal section

through the central part of the holder.

Referring now to the drawings by reference numerals, it will be seen that the leather folder comprises a central section 4 having a longitudinal edge flap 5 foldable over the backing and reinforcing metal plate 6. This pocket formed on the exterior of the cenplate is of an area as shown in Figure 2 and is riveted to the inner surface of the portion 4.

On the outer surface of this portion is a piece of leather or the like 7, which is fastened in place to provide a pocket for re-35 movable reception of a driver's permit or license card 8. One end of the plate is provided with longitudinally spaced knuckles 9, between which ball connectors 10 are ar-

This invention relates to an improved ar- ranged in the customary manner, these conticle carrier or holder of the leather holder nectors carrying hooks 11, on which keys 12 40 type, used for carrying keys and the like or the like are placed. The advantage of this construction is based particularly upon the plate 6. This reinforces the central portion 4 of the leather folder and prevents the keys from being pressed against the license 45 card to bend or crack it. In addition, it maintains the pocket straight at all times, to facilitate easy insertion and removal of the card.

> The simplicity of the improvement is such 50 as to permit a clear understanding of the invention to be had, after reading the description in connection with the drawings. Therefore, a more lengthy description is regarded unnecessary.

Minor changes in the shape, size, and rearrangement of parts coming within the field of invention claimed, may be resorted to, if desired.

I claim:

As a new product of manufacture, an article holder for pocket use comprising a folderembodying a central section and longitudi-nal edge flaps adapted to be folded into overlapping relation, an open ended card 65 tral portion of the folder, a backing and reinforcing plate fastened to the inner surface of said central portion and occupying substantially the full area of said central 70 portion and formed at one end with a multiplicity of knuckles, and a plurality of key hooks hingedly connected with said knuckles.
