

DESIGN FOR CARPET.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 28,829, dated June 7, 1898.

Application filed May 3, 1898. Serial No. 679,644. Term of patent 31 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ANNA K. MAY, a citizen of the United States, residing at the city of Philadelphia, in the county of Philadelphia 5 and State of Pennsylvania, have invented and produced a new and original Design for a Carpet or other Fabric, of which the following is a specification, reference being had more particularly to the accompanying drawing, illus-

to trating the same and forming part thereof.

The leading feature of my design is a morris style pattern of conventionalized water-

flower forms arranged in rows.

In the drawing, \bar{a} is the body, b the border, 15 and a b the complete carpet.

c are conventionalized water-flowers, best understood by reference to the drawing, and

d is the ground, upon which these flower forms are arranged.

What I claim as my invention, and desire 20

to secure by Letters Patent, is—
1. In a design for a carpet, the body a, substantially as shown.

2. In a design for a carpet, the border b,

substantially as shown. 3. The design for a carpet consisting of the body a, and border b, substantially as shown.
