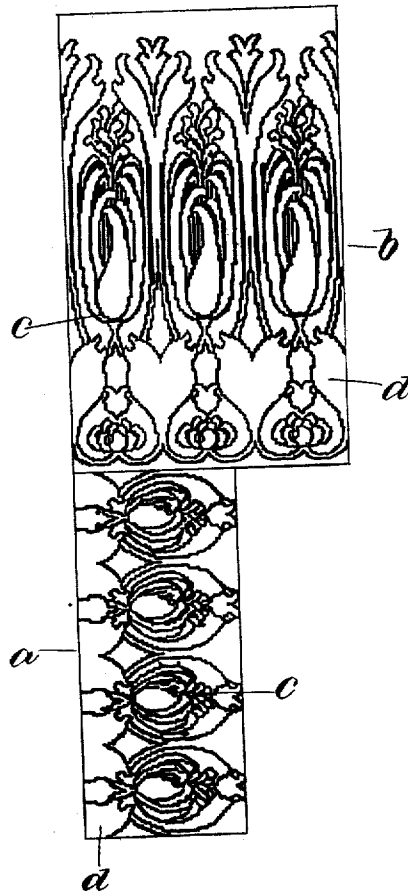

## DESIGN FOR CARPET.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 28,829, dated June 7, 1898.

Application filed May 3, 1898. Serial No. 679,644. Term of patent 3½ years.

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, ANNA K. MAY, a citizen  
of the United States, residing at the city of  
Philadelphia, in the county of Philadelphia  
and State of Pennsylvania, have invented and  
produced a new and original Design for a Car-  
pet or other Fabric, of which the following is  
a specification, reference being had more par-  
ticularly to the accompanying drawing, illus-  
trating the same and forming part thereof.

The leading feature of my design is a mor-  
ris style pattern of conventionalized water-  
flower forms arranged in rows.

In the drawing, *a* is the body, *b* the border,  
and *a b* the complete carpet.

*c* are conventionalized water-flowers, best  
understood by reference to the drawing, and

*d* is the ground, upon which these flower forms  
are arranged.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to  
secure by Letters Patent, is—

1. In a design for a carpet, the body *a*, sub-  
stantially as shown.

2. In a design for a carpet, the border *b*,  
substantially as shown.

3. The design for a carpet consisting of the  
body *a*, and border *b*, substantially as shown.
