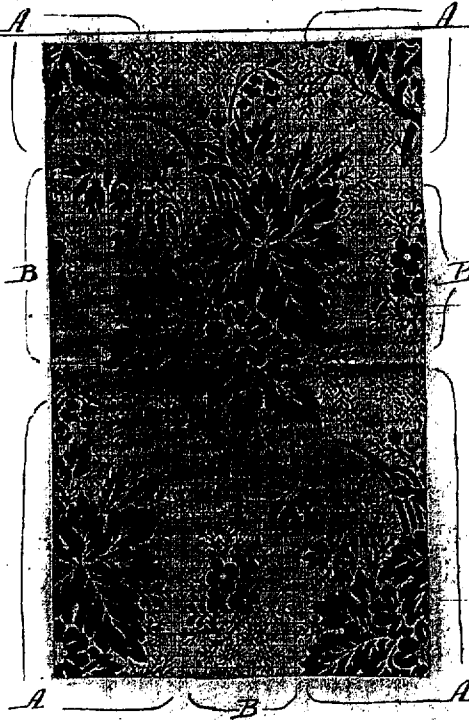

DESIGN FOR A CARPET-PATTERN.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

I, HUGH S. KERR, of Philadelphia, county of Philadelphia, State of Pennsylvania, have invented or produced a Design for a Carpet-Pattern, of which the following is a specification.

The accompanying drawings represent sufficient of a carpet-pattern to illustrate my design, which consists of the figures A, so arranged upon the body of the carpet as to afford space for the smaller intervening figures B, both of said figures consisting of flowers, leaves, and stems, the arrangement of which is so clearly shown in the drawings as to render minute description unnecessary.

Irrespective of the colors employed,

I claim—

1. The design for the figures A, substantially as shown and described.
2. The design for the figures B, substantially as described and illustrated.
3. The design for the whole pattern, including the figures A and B.
