


Fig. 1 is a front elevational view of a furniture leg, embodying my new design;

Fig. 2 is a side elevational view thereof, with the ferrules and feet removed;

Fig. 3 is an enlarged sectional view thereof taken along the line 3—3 of Fig. 2;

Fig. 4 is an enlarged sectional view thereof taken along the line 4—4 of Fig. 2;

Fig. 5 is an enlarged sectional view thereof taken along the line 5—5 of Fig. 2; and

Fig. 6 is a rear elevational view of the furniture leg, with the ferrules and feet removed.

The characteristic feature of my design consists in the provision of a horizontal elongated supporting member for furniture or similar article which has a generally elliptical cross section in the central part thereof and

tapers lengthwise on opposite sides of said central part, said member having a centrally disposed groove on opposite sides thereof and the longer axis of the elliptical cross section becoming smaller as the taper progresses.

The broken line showing of a table top is for purpose of illustration only.

I claim:

The ornamental design for a furniture leg, substantially as shown and described.
