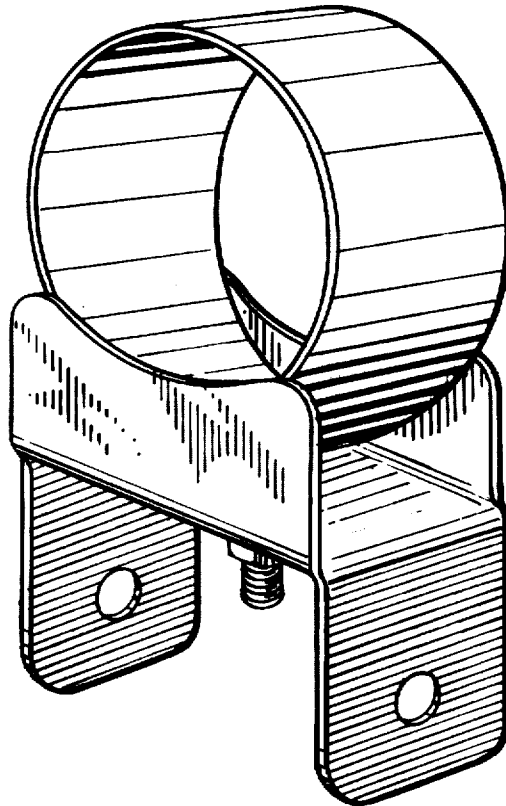

 FIG. 5 is a side elevational view thereof, and the opposite side elevational view being substantially a mirror image thereof.



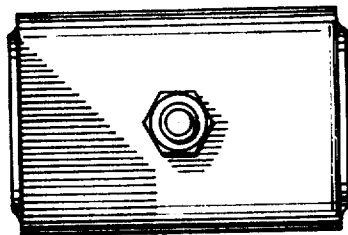
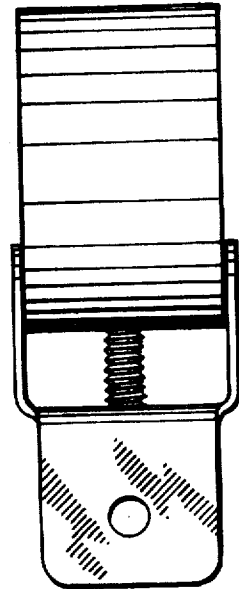
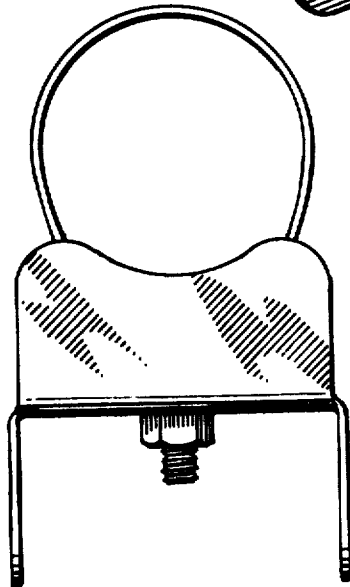
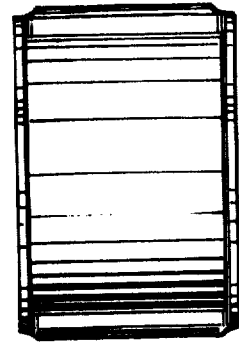
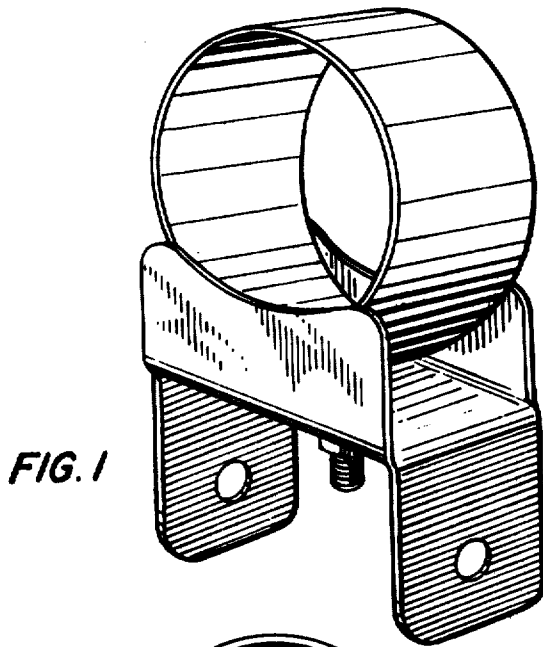
