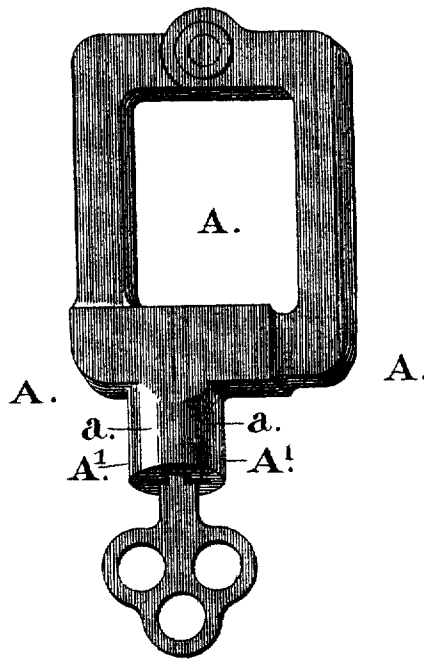

DESIGN FOR A PADLOCK-CASE.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 27,265, dated June 29, 1897.

Application filed June 18, 1896. Serial No. 596,079. Term of patent 7 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, EDWARD T. FRAIM, a citizen of the United States, residing at Lancaster, in the county of Lancaster and State of Pennsylvania, have invented and produced a new and original Design for a Padlock-Case; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming a part thereof.

The drawing presents a perspective view of a sprocket-chain padlock-case, showing my design.

The leading feature of my design consists in the padlock-case A, having the general contour shown, being practically a parallelepiped in form with a cylindrical projection A' from the lower face and somewhat nearer to

one end thereof, which is rounded off, as shown at *a*, the entire surface of the case being perfectly smooth or polished and the end of the cylindrical projection provided with a key-hole.

Having now described my invention, what I do consider new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for a padlock-case, substantially as hereinbefore described and shown in the drawing.
