FIG. 14 is a front elevational view of the embodiment shown in FIG. 7, with a broken line showing of a coin displayed in a display pocket; and,

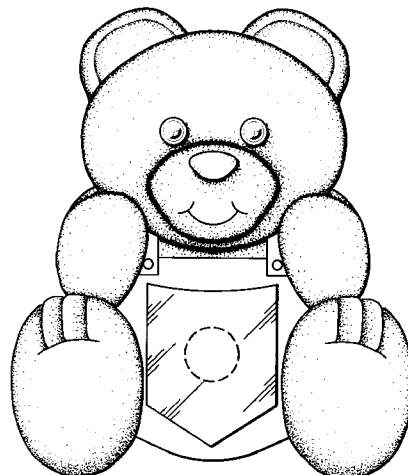
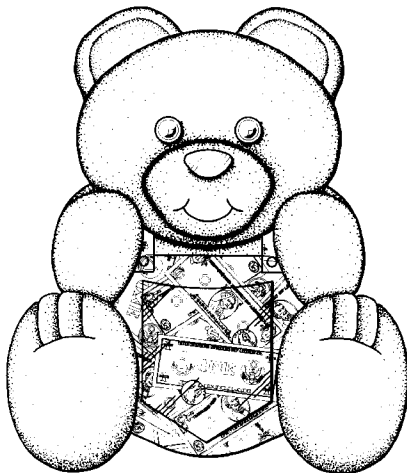
FIG. 15 is a rear elevational view thereof.

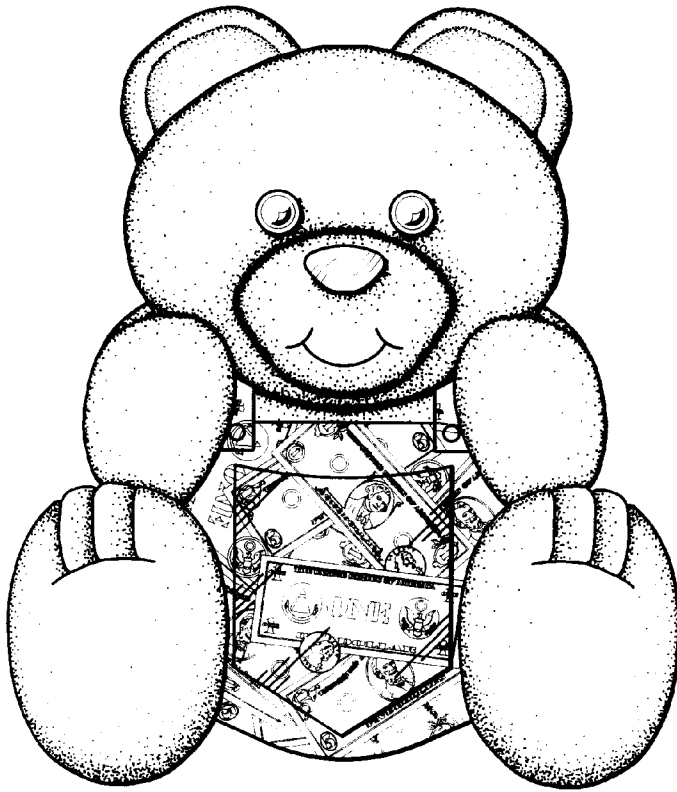

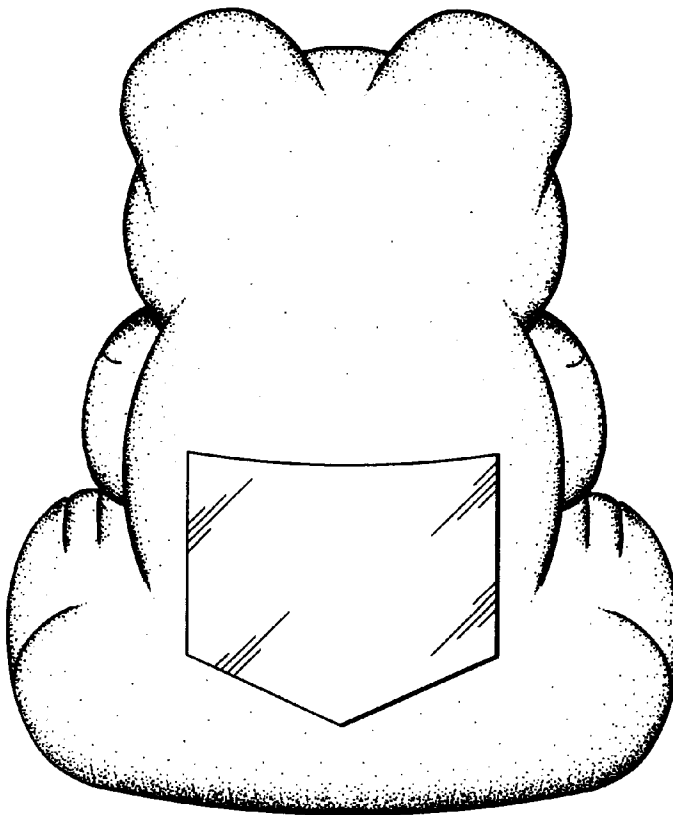

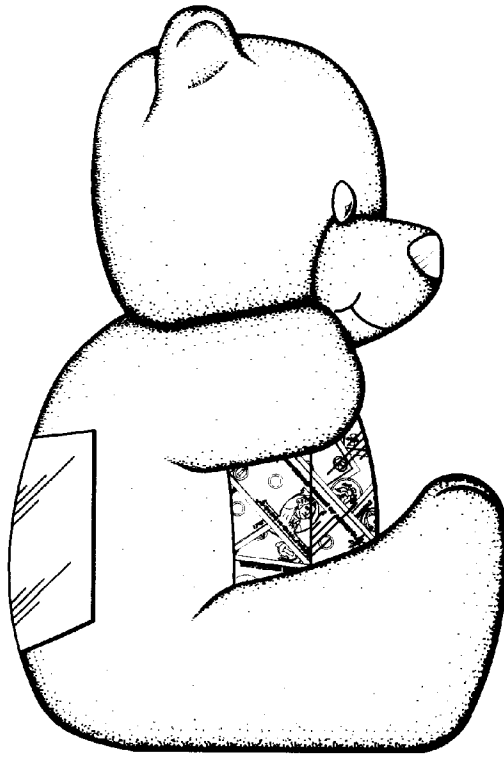

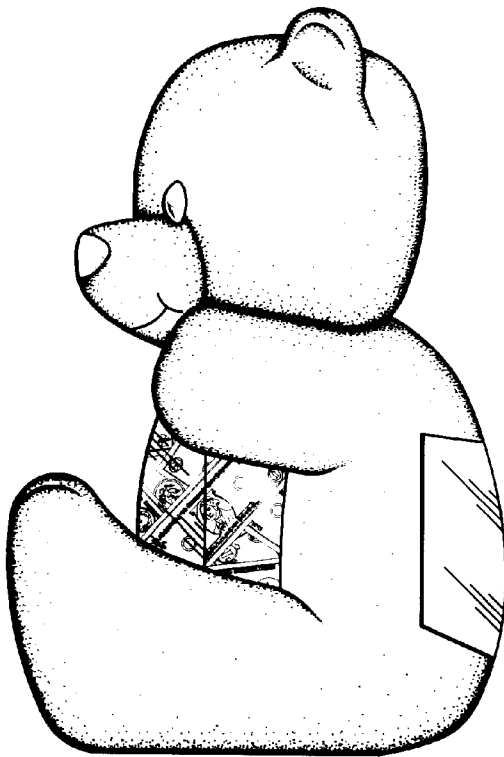

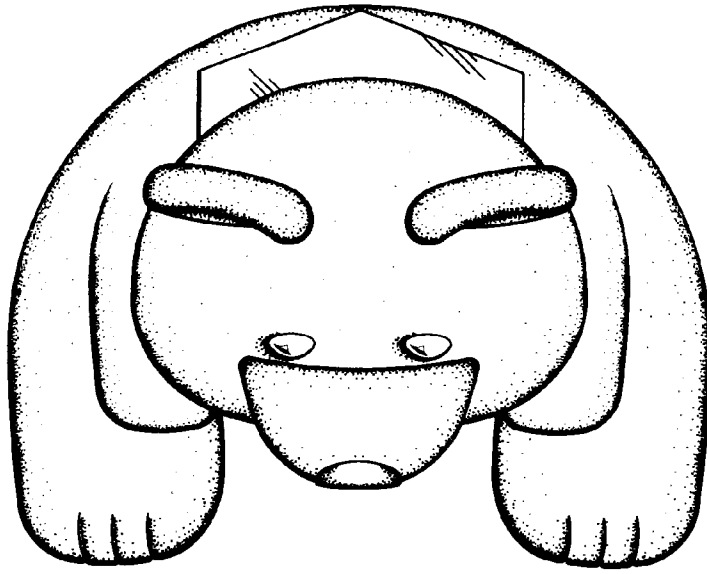

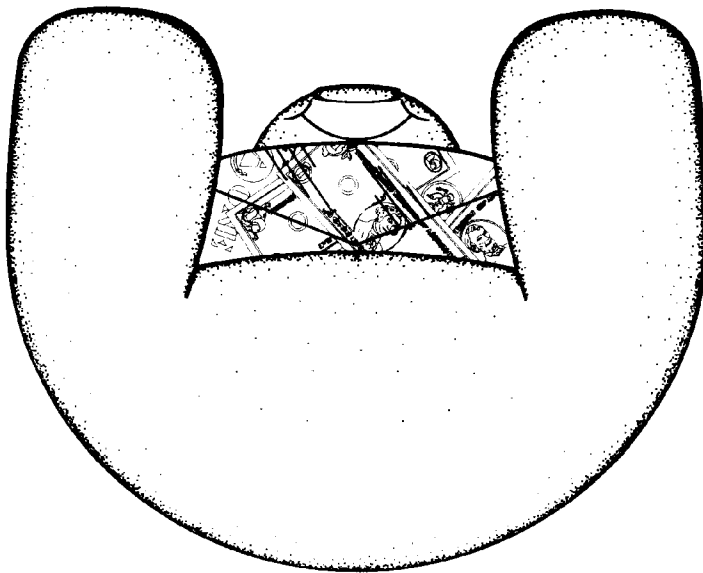

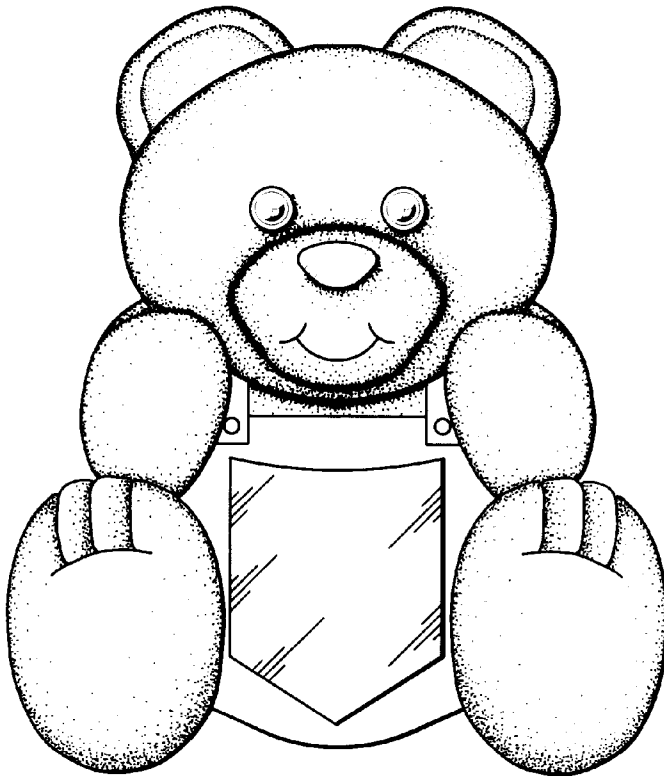

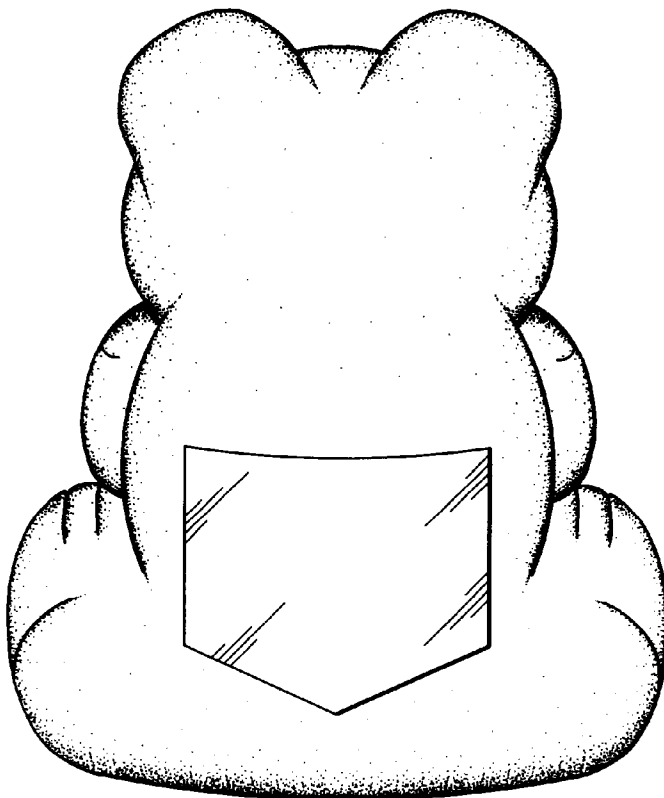

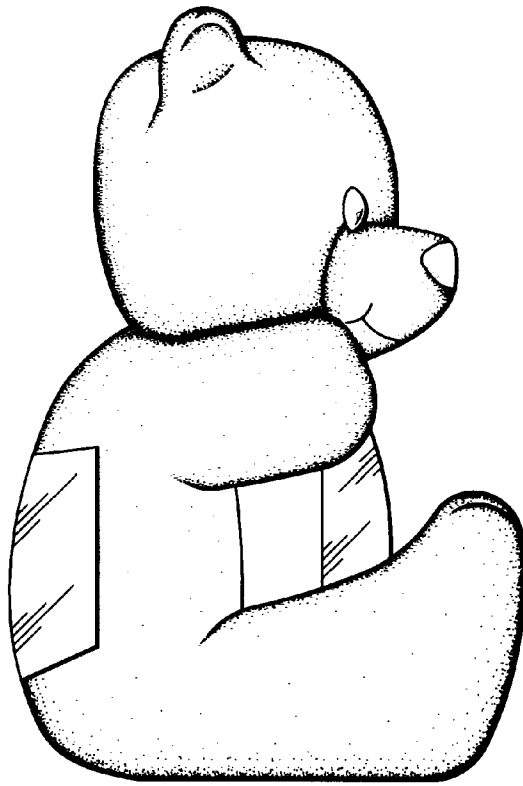

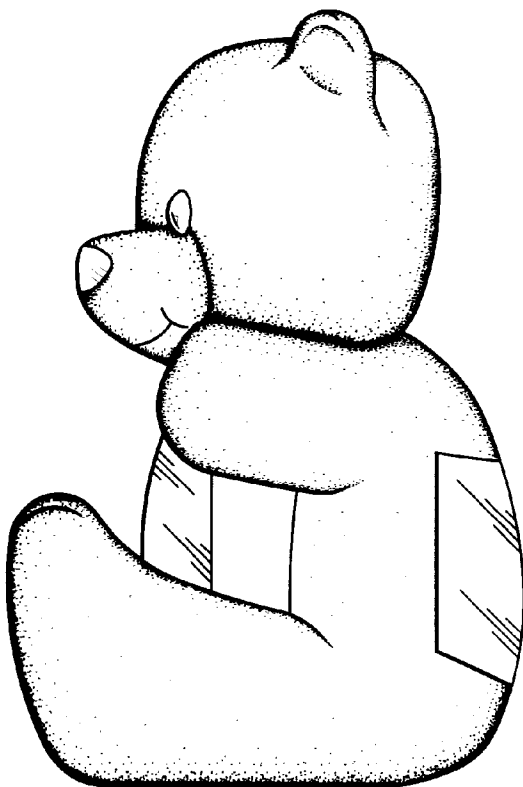

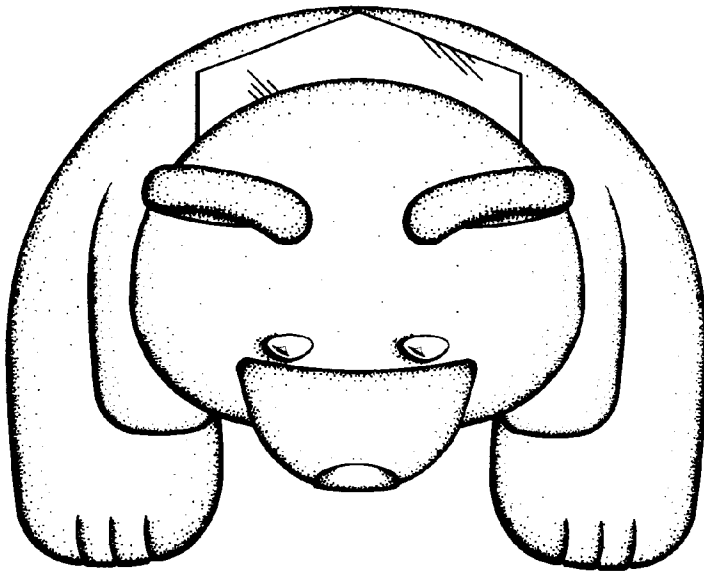

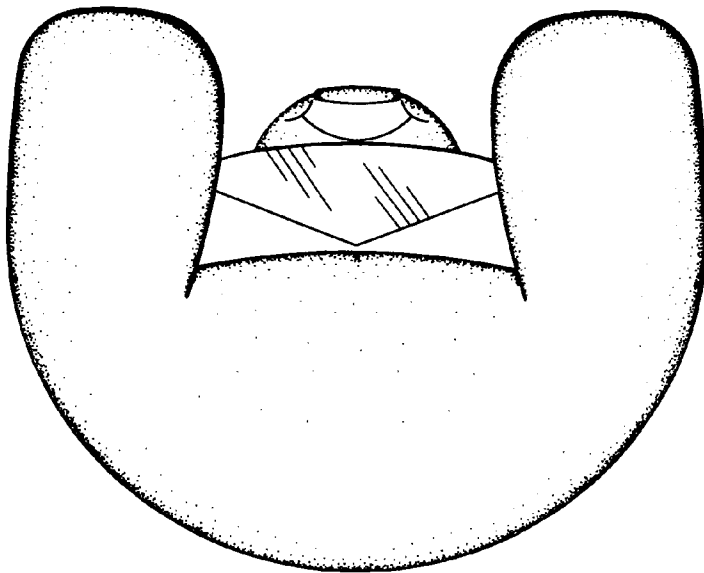

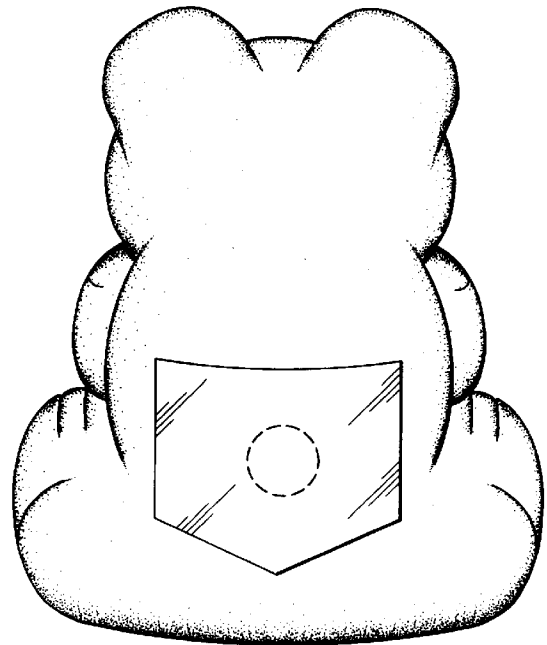
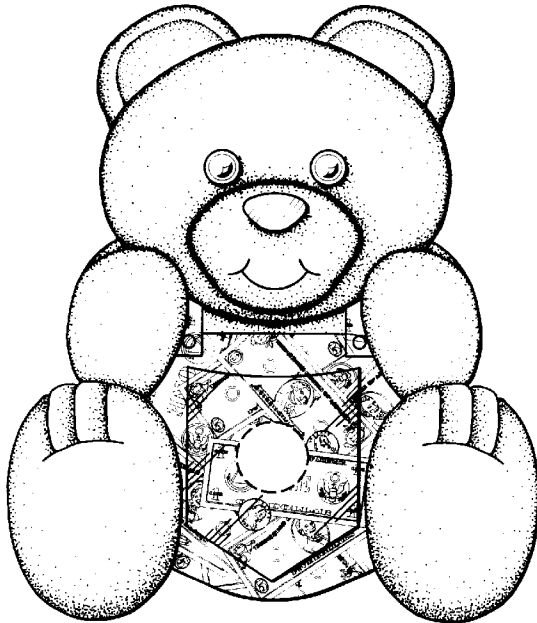

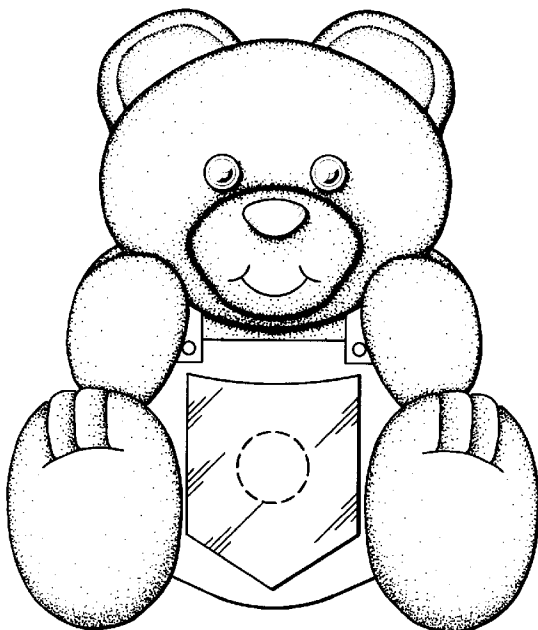
