

My invention relates to a new and useful manicuring set for use by professional manicurists in beauty parlors and similar establishments and one which may be equally well used by private 5 persons at home, the idea being to provide a compact set which is adapted to contain and support the instruments, pomades, lotions, etc., which are ordinarily used in the process of manicuring, in a readily accessible and yet constantly assem-

10 bled or "packed" manner.

My invention still further relates to a manicuring set of this general character which is also equipped with a sterilizer wherein the tools employed may be kept in a sterile manner to pre-15 vent infection which can be caused or trans-

mitted by a non-sterile instrument. My invention still further relates to a compact, sanitary manicuring set of the general character described, which is also provided with an

- 20 overhanging, flexible lamp adapted to shed light on the hand receiving treatment, said lamp being provided with a hinged shade which is adapted to swing on the light socket into and out of operative position.
- ²⁵ My invention still further relates to a compact, sanitary manicuring set which is self-sufficient, in that it is capable of being placed upon a table, dresser, or the like, without the necessity of any additional support and which at the same time ³⁰ may serve as a smoke stand.

To the above ends, my invention consists of a platform, a drawer or sterilizer carried by the under side thereof, an instrument receiving groove along one edge of said platform, a series of removable cups engaging seats in the upper side of said platform, a stepped bottle rack adapted to

support bottles containing various lotions to be used, an ash tray, or the like, pivotally and detachably supportable at either end of said plat-40 form, with or without a flexible light carried by

and overhanging said platform. My invention still further consists of various

other novel features of construction and advantage, all as hereinafter further described and claimed in connection with the accompanying

drawing, in which: Figure 1 represents a front elevation of my novel manicuring set.

Figure 2 represents a section on line 2-2 of ⁵⁰ Figure 1.

Figure 3 represents a section on line 3-3 of Figure 2.

Figure 4 represents a section on line 4-4 of Figure 2.

55 Figure 5 represents a fragmentary side eleva-

tion of the upper portion of the light shown in Figure 1 showing a hinged shade for said light.

Referring to the drawing in which like reference characters indicate like parts, 1 designates a platform supported by the legs 2, which are 60 preferably provided with rubber pads or other cushioning material firmly to rest upon a table surface or the like. Under the platform 1 is carried the drawer 3 which can serve as a sterilizer for the instruments used, the rear or inner edge 65 4 of the drawer 3 being adapted to engage the stop 5 in the under side of the platform 1 to prevent complete withdrawal of the drawer 3 and the consequent spilling of its contents. In the upper side of the platform 1 is provided the lon- 70 gitudinal groove 6 which serves as a temporary seat or receptacle for the instruments during use and the removable cups 7 which engage corresponding seats in the upper side of the platform 1, said cups being adapted to contain pomades, 75 ointments, etc., as may be necessary. In the rear portion of the platform 1 are provided the stepped seats 8 which are adapted to seat the bottles 9, the upper ends of which bottles are adapted to extend through slotted bracket or cross arm 11. 80 The cups 7 are kept normally closed by the hinged cover 10 which can be opened in the direction of the arrow shown in Figure 2 to afford access to the contents of said cups. An electrical conductor 12 passes through a suitable opening in 85 the rear portion of the platform 1 and through the hub 13 into the flexible shaft 14 which supports a light socket 15 carrying the valve 16 which is shaded by the shade 17. The shade 17 is hinged at 18 and may be swung in the manner 90 illustrated in Figure 5, the edge 19 of the shade 17 when abutting against the front edge 20 of the socket serving as a stop to limit the downward motion of the shade. At either end of the plat-95 form 1 are provided the apertured lugs 22 which are adapted to support a bowl containing the soap solution (which is not shown, as it may be of any desired type) or it may support the ash tray 23, the stem 24 of which detachably and pivotally engages one of the lugs 22. The ash tray 23 com- 100 prises a conventional well and peripheral depressions for resting a cigarette, as well as a match box support 25. In the periphery of the ash tray 23, I provide a removable cup 26 which engages a corresponding seat and in which ashes and used 105 matches may be placed, said cup being removable from the ash tray so that it may be emptied without complete disengagement of the ash tray from the platform 1. In actual manufacture I find it advantageous to omit the hub 13, the flexible shaft 14 and the lamp carried thereby, since tures in the upper surface thereof, a plurality the platform 1 with its adjuncts heretofore described constitutes a sufficient unit to which the lamp may or may not be added, as desired.

Having thus described my invention, what I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent is:

1. A manicuring set comprising a base having a tool receiving groove and a plurality of aper-10 tures in the upper surface thereof, a plurality of removable cups positioned in said apertures and a sterilizer drawer carried by the underside of said base.

2. A manicuring set comprising a base having 15 a tool receiving groove and a plurality of aper-

of removable cups positioned in said apertures and a sterilizer drawer carried by the underside of said base in combination with a light carried by and overhanging said base, and a hinged reflector for said light.

3. A manicuring set comprising a base having a tool receiving groove and a plurality of apertures in the upper surface thereof, a plurality of removable cups positioned in said apertures and 85 a sterilizer drawer carried by the underside of said base in combination with a support detachably securable to a plurality of points along said base and adapted to carry a receptacle.

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
