

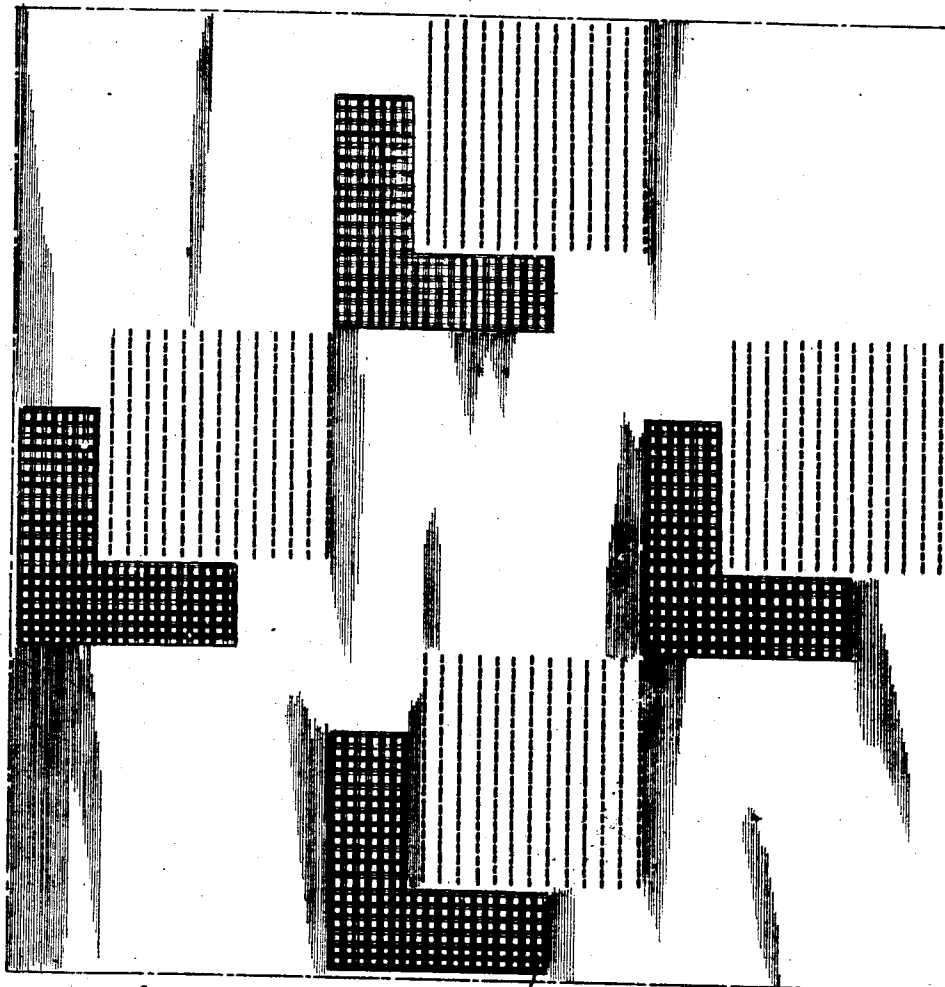

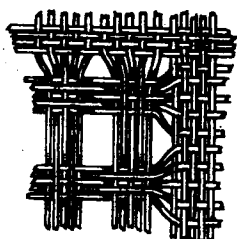

## UNITED STATES PATENT OFFICE.

JAMES A. ADAMS, OF WALTHAM, MASSACHUSETTS.

DESIGN FOR A TEXTILE FABRIC.

Application filed March 15, 1924. Serial No. 8,948. Term of patent  $3\frac{1}{2}$  years.

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, JAMES A. ADAMS, a citizen of the United States, residing at No. 27 Pleasant Street, Waltham, in the county of Middlesex and State of Massachusetts, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for Textile Fabrics, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming a part thereof.

Fig. 1 is a plan view of a portion of the textile fabric showing my new design;

Fig. 2 shows on a larger scale the open-work portions.

The dotted lines represent cords showing upon the face of the fabric, held in place by the weft threads. The background consists of warp and weft threads while the portions marked 3 are open-work portions, see Fig. 2. Contrasting colors may be used to bring out the design.
