## DESIGN FOR SHAWL-PATTERN.

Specification forming part of Design No. 6,842, dated September 2, 1873; application filed August 9, 1873.

[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, FREDERICK WINK, of the city and county of Philadelphia, State of Pennsylvania, have invented a Design for Shawl-Pattern, of which the following is a specification:

In the accompanying drawings, Figure 1 is a diagram, showing the arrangement of the stripes A and B, of which the pattern is composed; Fig. 2, a view of one-half of the stripe

A; Fig. 3, a view of one-half of the stripe B.
The stripe A has a central rib, a, ornamented by plain parallel bars, and by groups of dots and dashes, arranged as shown, the said stripe being otherwise composed of a number of minor parallel plain stripes, of different widths and

shades or colors. The stripe B has a central rib, b, with ornaments of the same character as those of the rib a, and at either side of the same are adjoining parallel plain bars or ribs, arranged as shown.

Irrespective of the colors employed, I claim— The design for a shawl-pattern, as described, and as illustrated in and by the accompanying
