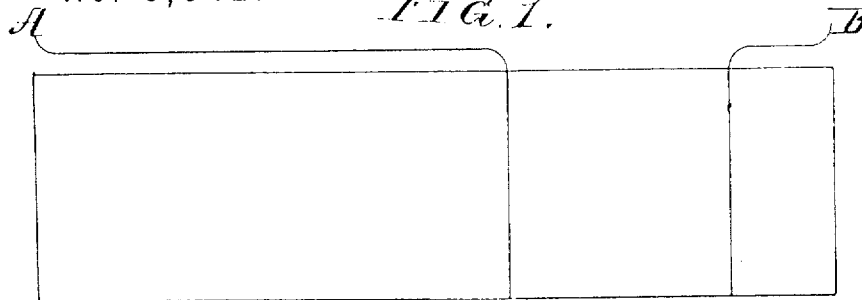

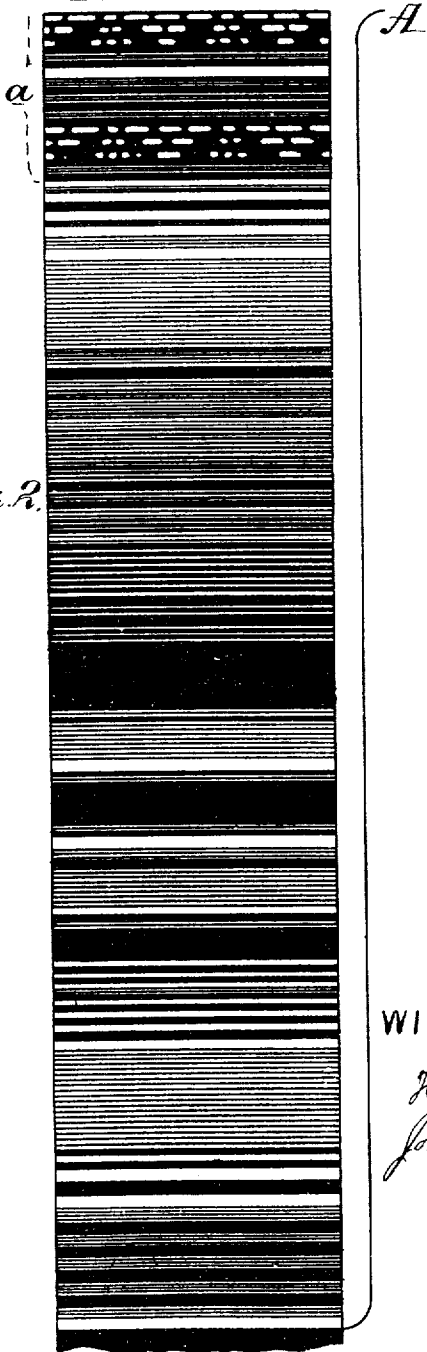
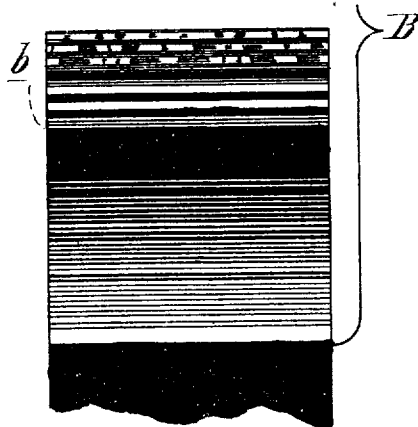

## DESIGN FOR SHAWL-PATTERN.

Specification forming part of Design No. **6,812**, dated September 2, 1873; application filed August 9, 1873.  
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, FREDERICK WINK, of the city and county of Philadelphia, State of Pennsylvania, have invented a Design for Shawl-Pattern, of which the following is a specification:

In the accompanying drawings, Figure 1 is a diagram, showing the arrangement of the stripes A and B, of which the pattern is composed; Fig. 2, a view of one-half of the stripe A; Fig. 3, a view of one-half of the stripe B.

The stripe A has a central rib, *a*, ornamented by plain parallel bars, and by groups of dots and dashes, arranged as shown, the said stripe being otherwise composed of a number of minor parallel plain stripes, of different widths and

shades or colors. The stripe B has a central rib, *b*, with ornaments of the same character as those of the rib *a*, and at either side of the same are adjoining parallel plain bars or ribs, arranged as shown.

Irrespective of the colors employed, I claim—

The design for a shawl-pattern, as described, and as illustrated in and by the accompanying drawing.
