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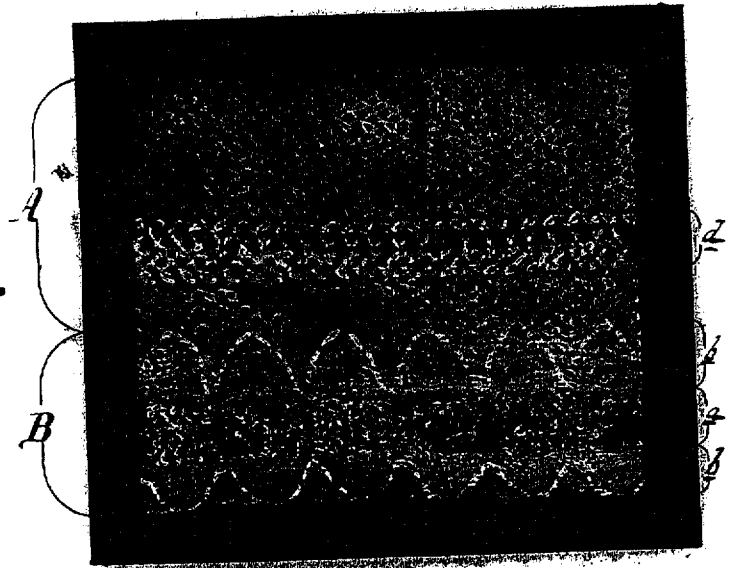
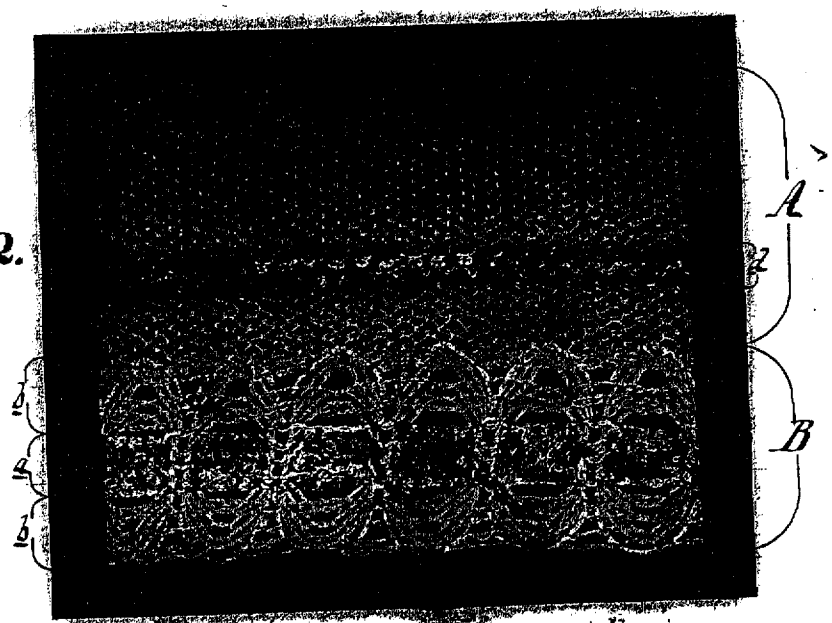

DESIGN FOR KNITTED FABRIC.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same

I, THOMAS DOLAN, of Philadelphia, county of Philadelphia, State of Pennsylvania, have invented or produced a Design for a Knitted Fabric, of which the following is a specification.

Figures 1 and 2, in the accompanying drawing, illustrate my design for a knitted fabric, there being a slight difference between the two figures, but the general character of the design being the same in both.

A represents a portion of the body of the knitted fabric, and

B, the border or edging forming a continuation of the body.

Near the edge of the fabric is a stripe, *a*, and on each side of the latter is a scalloped ornament, *b*.

One or more strips, *d*, may be formed in the fabric at a short distance from the ornamental edging.

Irrespective of the colors employed—

I claim—

The design for a knitted fabric, substantially as described and illustrated in and by the accompanying drawing.
