

COAT.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ISIDORE M. COHEN, a citizen of the United States, residing at Philadelphia, county of Philadelphia, and 5 State of Pennsylvania, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Coats, of which the following is a specification.

This invention relates to improvements in apparel, and has particular reference to a

10 coat.

An object of the invention is to provide an improved coat of simple construction having a neat interior appearance and wherein pockets of the coat are constructed and

15 supported in position in a novel manner.

The above and other objects will appear more clearly from the following detailed description, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawing, which illus-20 trates a preferred embodiment of the in-

ventive idea.

In the drawing-Figure 1 is a fragmentary plan view of the interior of the coat constructed in ac-25. cordance with the invention;

Figure 2 is a fragmentary perspective view showing the manner of securing the

pockets in position; and

Figure 3 is a sectional view on the line 30 3-3 of Figure 2 also illustrating the man-

ner of mounting the pockets.

The coat, in its preferred form, is shown as consisting of the back part 4 to which is joined on opposite sides thereof the front 35 parts 5, only one of which is illustrated in Figure 1, the other part being a duplicate of the one shown. The front and back parts are joined along the seam 6 from which the edges or flaps 7 extend.

The coat is provided with a lining which does not fully cover the interior of the coat, the same consisting of side sections 8 and the middle or top section 9. These sections are secured together adjacent the armitoles

10 and entirely surround the latter, the lin- 45 ing including a relatively narrow strip 11 which extends along the lower edge of each armhole.

The side pockets 12 are secured to the interior of the coat and in order to reduce 50 the cost of production and the time consumed in making the coat only the forward portion of the upper edge of each pocket is sewed to the front 4, as indicated at 13, the remaining or rear portion of said upper 55 edge and the rear vertical edge of said pocket being unattached by stitching. In order that the rear upper corner of the pocket will not fold over but be held in flat relation to the body of the coat there is provided a flexible connection 14, preferably a thin strip of the lining, one end of which is secured to said corner while the other end is extended in substantial parallelism to said upper edge and secured to an adjacent flap 65 7 rearwardly of said vertical edge. In this manner the corner of the pocket which is not attached directly to the body of the coat will be in flat position and prevented from folding over on the main portion of 70 the pocket.

What is claimed is:

A garment including a pocket having a straight upper edge with only the forward portion thereof secured to the interior of 75 the garment, and a flexible connection between the rear end of the unsecured portion of said upper edge, said unsecured portion, together with the rear vertical edge of the pocket, being otherwise free of the 80 garment, and said connection projecting from said upper edge in substantial parallelism thereto and being constantial parallelism. ism thereto and being secured to said garment at a point rearwardly of said vertical
