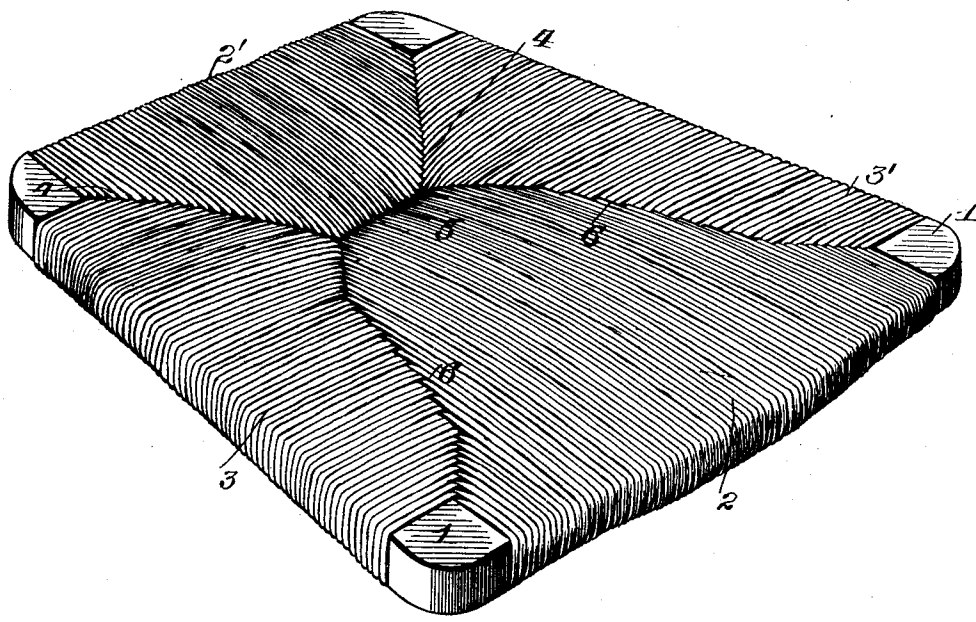

DESIGN FOR A CHAIR-SEAT.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 34,186, dated March 5, 1901.

Application filed February 1, 1901. Serial No. 45,656. Term of patent 7 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, STANLEY KUREK, a citizen of the United States, residing at Rochester, in the county of Monroe and State of New York, have invented and produced a new and original Design for Chair-Seats, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming a part thereof.

My design relates to chair-seats and consists in the particular configuration of the surface thereof.

The design which is illustrated in the drawing consists of a frame, the exposed corners of which are indicated by 1. The surface of the seat is composed of panels 2 2', provided with ribs or corrugations extending longitudinally, and of the panels 3 3', having similar surfaces on which the ribs or corrugations

extend transversely of the former, the various panels meeting in the broken lines 4, which converge from the rear corners of the frame and are joined by the line 5, from the ends of which the broken lines 6 extend to the forward corners of the seat-frame.

Having described my invention, what I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for a chair-seat substantially as herein shown and described.
