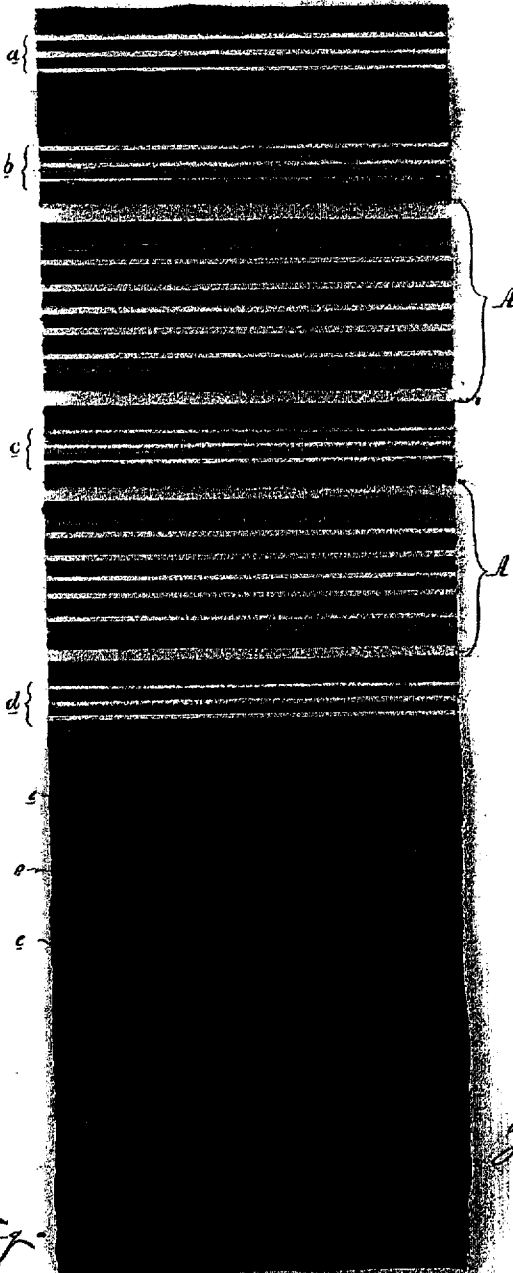

DESIGN FOR STOCKING FABRIC.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

I, THOMAS DOLAN, of Philadelphia, county of Philadelphia, State of Pennsylvania, have invented or produced a new and original Design for a Stocking Fabric, of which the following is a specification.

The figure in the accompanying drawing which forms a part of this specification illustrates a strip of knitted fabric made in accordance with my design, the main feature of which consists of two principal stripes, A and A', each composed of a series of minor stripes, or ribs, arranged in a manner too clearly shown in the drawing to need description.

In addition to these main stripes are smaller stripes *a*, *b*, *c*, and *d*, and single ribs *e e*, all clearly indicated in the drawing.

Irrespective of the colors employed,
I claim—

The design for a stocking fabric, substantially as described and illustrated in and by the accompanying drawing.
