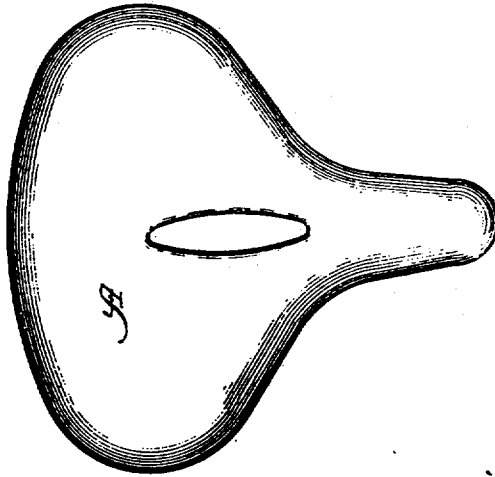

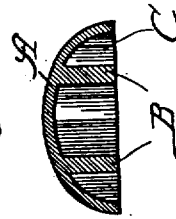
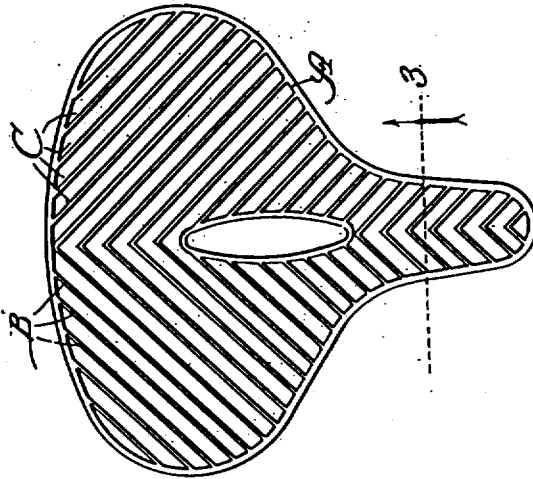

WILLIAM I. BUNKER, OF LA GRANGE, ILLINOIS.

DESIGN FOR A SADDLE-SEAT.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 28,759, dated May 31, 1898.

Application filed May 6, 1898. Serial No. 879,852. Term of patent 14 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM I. BUNKER, a citizen of the United States, residing at La Grange, in the county of Cook and State of Illinois, have invented and produced a new and useful Design for Saddle-Seats, of which the following is a specification.

In the accompanying drawings, Figure 1 is a plan view of one side of the cushion or saddle-seat; Fig. 2, a plan view of the opposite side thereof, and Fig. 3 a cross-sectional view taken on line 3 of Fig. 1.

The leading feature of my design consists in the seat portion of a saddle having one side formed of or provided with a number of

straight ribs extending inwardly and backwardly from the outer edge or rim and so arranged as to form or present to the eye a number of corresponding grooves.

A is the saddle portion, B the ribs, and C the grooves, the whole presenting to the eye a harmonious and ornate figure, as shown in the drawings.

I claim—

The design for a saddle-seat substantially as herein shown and described.
