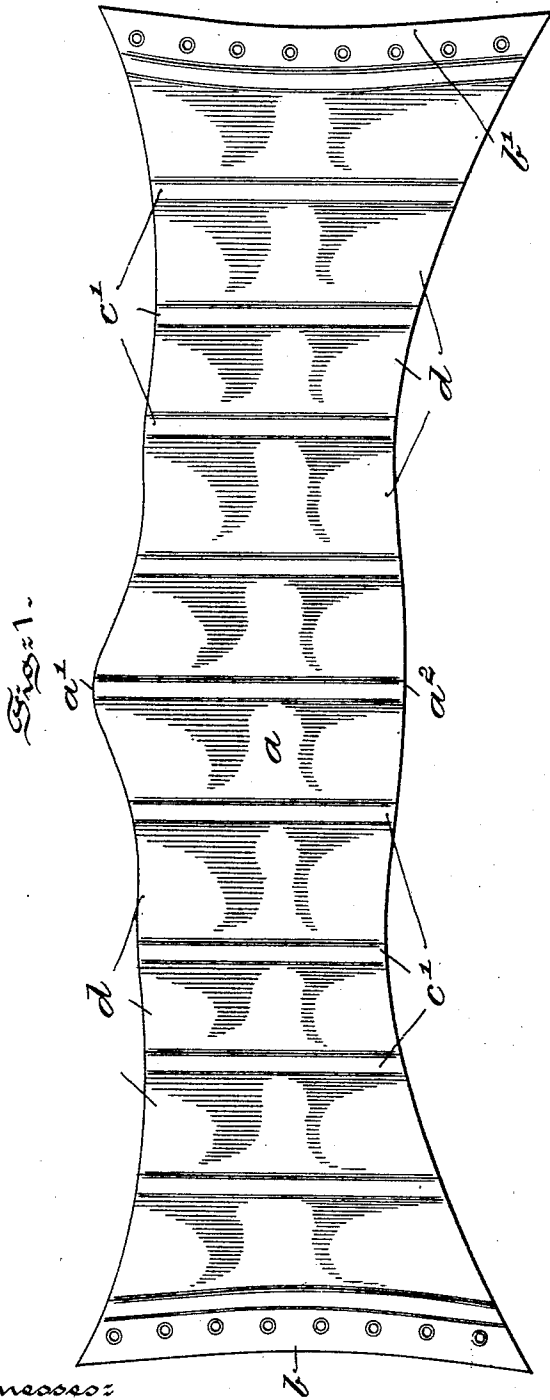

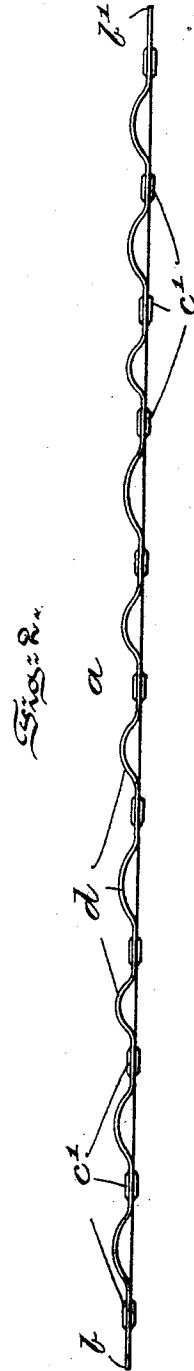

DESIGN FOR A CORSET AND WAIST LENGTHENER.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 34,807, dated June 16, 1901.

Application filed June 6, 1901. Serial No. 63,481. Term of patent 7 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ELLA K. PILLING, a citizen of the United States, residing at the city of Philadelphia, in the county of Philadelphia and State of Pennsylvania, have invented and produced a new and original Design for Corset and Waist Lengtheners, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming part hereof, in which—

Figure 1 is a plan view of a corset and waist lengthener illustrating my new design, and Fig. 2 is an edge view thereof.

As illustrated in the drawings, the leading or material features of my design consist in the configuration or outline of the corset or waist lengthener and ornamentations thereof.

When viewed in plan, as illustrated in Fig. 1, the design consists of the body portion *a*, of curved outline, humped at *a'* near the middle at the top and slightly bowed, as at *a''*, at the bottom and for some distance in the length of the body portion and flaring out in both

directions toward the ends into elongated pointed portions *b* and *b'* of slightly curved outline and provided with a series of circular open ornamentations in the said ends. In the body portion on both sides at suitable distances apart therein are provided raised projections *c'*. The surfaces between the respective projections *c'* when viewed from the upper edge of the article are bowed or curved at *d*, as clearly illustrated in Fig. 2.

Having thus described my invention, what I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for a corset and waist lengthener, as herein shown and described.
