DESIGN FOR SHAWL-PATTERN.

Specification forming part of Design No. **6,848**, dated September 2, 1873; application filed August 9, 1873. [Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, FREDERICK WINK, of the city and county of Philadelphia, State of Pennsylvania, have invented a Design for a Shawl-Pattern, of which the following is a specification:

My design is fully illustrated by the figure in the accompanying drawing, and consists of the stripes A and B upon a plain ground, D. The stripe A has a rib, a, near each edge, ornamented by parallel rows of alternate dots and dashes, and the stripe B is also ornamented by a rib, b, of similar character, both of the said stripes being otherwise composed of minor parallel plain stripes or bars or ribs of

varying widths and different shades or colors, some strongly contrasted and others blended into each other, as shown.

Irrespective of the colors employed, I claim-

- 1. The design for the stripe Λ , as shown and described.
- 2. The design for the whole pattern, including the stripes A and B.
