In Jefferson County, under authority of House Bill 9 of the Forty-third Texas Legislature, the State Highway Commission has accepted the tenderof aid from the U. S. Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works in the amount not to exceed \$1,141,742.00 for the construction of the Neches River Bridge on State Highway 87, PWA Docket 8080-R and has also accepted the net proceeds of a bond issue of Jefferson County in the amount of \$701,745.67 and by Commission Minute 11344 has appropriated State Highway funds in amount of \$645,463.10, making available for construction of the Neches River Bridge project an amount of \$2,488,950.77;

Whereas, by Minute 11664 on December 21, 1935 the Commission awarded Contract 1 for substructure work in the amount of \$828,740.00 and by Commission Minute on June 17, 1936 awarded Contract 2 for superstructure work and superstructure work amount to \$2,442,240.00, to which amount must be added 10%, or \$244,224.00, for engineering and contingencies, making grand total of project equal to \$2,686,464.00, which is in excess of the amount of funds now available for the construction of this project by an amount of \$197,513.23;

It is therefore the order of the Commission that an appropriation of \$197,513.23 State Highway funds be appropriated to cover the difference in total cost of project and the funds now available.

The Commission having accepted the tender of aid in the form of a grant from the United States Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works for the construction of the Neches River Bridge on State Highway No. 87, P.W.A. Docket 8080-R, in the amount of not to exceed \$1,141,742.00, and having by Minute 11664, awarded Contract No. 1 for substructure work to the Union Bridge and Construction Company in the amount of \$828,740.00, and on June 17, 1936, awarded contract No. 2 for the superstructure work to the Taylor-Fichter Steel Construction Company of New York City in the amount of \$1,613,500.00, and to which the allowance of \$244,224.00 for engineering and contingencies is added making a total estimated cost of the project of \$2,686,464.00, which amount is in excess of the amount of funds available by \$197,513.23. The funds originally set up for this project are as follows: Jefferson County \$701,746.67; State Highway Funds \$645,463.10; and Federal Grant \$1,141,742.00, making a total of \$2,488,850.77. Since the amount of County Funds are badly needed for many other necessary road and bridge projects in the State of Texas, therefore

IT IS ORDERED by the Commission that the State Highway Engineer be and is hereby authorized to make application for a supplementary grant to the United States Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works in the amount of forty-five per cent of the excess funds required for the completion of the project which is estimated to be \$88,881.00.

In Angelina County, it is ordered by the Commission that an appropriation of \$2,957.74 be made to cover the cost of tearing down the present temporary garage, material laboratory, and records room on the Division Headquarters Grounds and rebuilding a three-car garage materials laboratory, and records room on the Angelina County Maintenance Warehouse Site at Presser. This work is to be done under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Maintenance Division.

This appropriation is made and this work authorized, because of the necessity of changing all signs for the opening of new Highway No. 66 and the routing of Highway No. 9 traffic through San Antonio.

In Brazoria County, an increased appropriation of \$4,062.43

It is ordered that the surfaced sections of this road be taken over for Maintenance.

In Eastland County, it is ordered that a project be added to the 1934 National Recovery Program providing for surfacing of Highway 67, in Eastland, extending from one block south of courthouse south on Seamon Street, a distance of approximately 0.7 mile, with an assignment of \$12,000.00 NRM funds; and the State Highway Engineer is directed to submit a request to the U. S. Bureau of Public Roads providing for this program addition.

WHEREAS, the additional cost was observed to be caused by good and sufficient reasons, not reasonably to have been anticipated, all of which are set forth in a letter dated January 24th, 1936, from the State Highway Engineer to Mr. Harold L. Ickes, Administrator; and

WHEREAS, the State Highway Commission, realizing the extreme merit of the project, the necessity for immediate action, and feeling its obligation to assure the construction of this improvement, did appropriate the additional funds above referred to, although it had been determined that the amount required was in excess of the maximum expenditure, consistent with reasonable distribution of the limited State Highway funds available; and

WHEREAS, the additional appropriation would require the utilization of funds previously reserved for other purposes, and will require the abandonment of necessary work already Programmed; and

WHEREAS, there has been placed on the Texas Highway Department a financial burden, which was not contemplated, and which it is poorly able to assume.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be spread upon the minutes of this City Council and that a copy thereof be at once prepared and forwarded, by the City Secretary, to the State Highway Department."

The Commission recognizes the distinguished services given by Roy B. Inks, not only to his community but to the State of Texas, and it is hereby ordered that the request of the City of Llano be granted and that the bridge over the Llano River at Llano is hereby named THE ROY B. INKS BRIDGE, and that the name plates of such bridge be revised to show on the top of said plate "THE ROY B. INKS BRIDGE."
