IT IS ORDERED BY THE COMMISSION that an appropriation in the amount of \$5,540.00 be and is hereby made to cover the cost of cleaning and painting the Brazos River Bridge, located at the Washington-Waller County Line on <u>U. This Minute shall become effective upon receipt of a formal resolution from the Texas Turnpike Authority requesting the State Highway Commission to make studies and pay all such preliminary expenses required, and stating that the payments so made shall be reimbursed to the State Highway Commission from the first sale of revenue bonds; and, further, that the State Highway Engineer be authorized to proceed with this Advance Engineering Project in accordance with the provisions of this Minute.

In <u>BAYLOR COUNTY</u> on <u>U. S. HIGHWAY 82</u>, IT IS ORDERED that Minute Order 34582, which authorized widening and resurfacing from Knox County Line to Seymour, a distance of approximately 12.0 miles, at an estimated cost of \$221,000.00, be and is hereby cancelled.

HIGHWAY 66</u>, in the City of Amarillo, from Fillmore Street to Lake Street, the City and the State are in agreement as to respective responsibilities for construction of the presently programmed City street facility, such work to be accomplished in accordance with the governing municipal policy as set forth in Minute 25211, and

WHEREAS, engineering studies have established the need for a drainage outlet outside the City limits to service the highway and the street facility, and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that this drainage outlet constructed to normal rural design could be accomplished at approximately one-half the cost of the drainage system which is needed due to urban influence and development.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the State Highway Engineer proceed with the improvement as authorized from Fillmore Street to Lake Street, including the needed drainage facility outside the City Limits, it being understood the Department will participate to the extent of one-half the cost of the drainage facility in the rural area.

WHEREAS, in POTTER AND RANDALL COUNTIES it is the desire of the officials of Potter and Randall Counties and the City of Amarillo that the Highway Department take steps to develop a more adequate and safe facility for U.S. HIGHWAY 87 from near the intersection of U.S. Highway 60, north of Canyon, to and through the City of Amarillo, and

WHEREAS, the rapid development and expansion of the area make it imperative that action be taken as early as possible and protective right-of-way measures placed in motion to assure the ultimate right-of-way width within economical bounds, and

WHEREAS, the accomplishment of the objectives of providing a facility adequate for the expeditious and safe movement of automotive traffic requires the cooperative and coordinated efforts of the respective responsible agencies of government for the finance and construction thereof,

NOW, THEREFORE THE HIGHWAY COMMISSION makes the following tender to Potter and Randall Counties and the City of Amarillo. Provided the proper officials of the local governments will:

- 1. Declare the portion of the route lying within the corporate limits of Amarillo a Freeway in accordance with the provisions of House Bill 451, 52nd Legislature, and execute the Texas Highway Department's standard form for construction and maintenance of highway projects inside incorporated cities and towns.
- 2. Furnish free of cost to the State and clear of obstructions and encumbrances the following minimum right-of-way widths, it being understood that additional widths will be required for such special conditions as interchanges, grade separations and where rough terrain exists:
  - (a) From near the intersection of U. S. Highway 60, north of Canyon, along the present route of U. S. Highway 87 to a point near the intersection of Farm to Market Road 288 300 feet.
  - (b) From near the intersection of Farm to Market Road 288 along the present route, namely South 36th Avenue and Fillmore Street or in the immediate vicinity thereof, to the point of beginning of a four street dispersal system in the vicinity of South 15th Avenue in Amarillo 260 feet with an absolute minimum of 220 feet. The exact width shall depend upon a proper balance between property damage costs and construction costs. An alternate route with the same right-of-way requirements, South and East of the present route between Farm to Market Road 288 and South 36th Avenue will be acceptable.
  - (c) For that portion of the route included in the dispersal system on Polk, Taylor, Fillmore and Buchanan Streets no additional right-of-way will be required except that which may be necessary for terminal connections and to provide for future railroad grade separations.
  - (d) From the point of terminus of the dispersal system in the vicinity of North 15th Avenue, generally along

the present route of U. S. Highway 87 (except in the vicinity of Pleasant Valley) to a point on the existing route approximately one mile north of Pleasant Valley - 260 feet with an absolute minimum of 220 feet. The exact width shall depend upon a proper balance between property damage cost and construction costs.

3. For the full length of the proposed four street dispersal system the City of Amarillo will pass and enforce ordinances providing for one way traffic operations on these streets and prohibit or require parallel parking on the individual streets as future engineering studies may dictate.

The Highway Department will:

- 1. By this action express its intent to develop the ultimate route of U. S. Highway 87 from a point near the intersection of U. S. Highway 60 north of Canyon to a point approximately one mile north of Pleasant Valley as a Freeway in accordance with the provisions of House Bill 451, 52nd Legislature.
- 2. Develop the Freeway facility as funds become available. It is anticipated that future allocations will be made on the basis of traffic needs and on continuous usable sections of highway where all right-of-way for ultimate development has been acquired.

This Order and its acceptance by Potter and Randall Counties and the City of Amarillo shall be construed as a long range work plan intended to secure the orderly, economical and expeditious completion of the desired improvements.

This Minute will become operative upon acceptance by the proper officials of Potter and Randall counties and the City of Amarillo. If the Minute is not accepted within one hundred and eighty days, it shall become automatically cancelled.

Declare the portion of the routes lying within the corporate limits of El Paso a Freeway in accordance with the provisions of House Bill 451, 52nd Legislature, and execute the Texas Highway Department's standard forms for construction and maintenance of highway projects inside incorporated cities and towns.

(d) From near the east end of the Main Street Viaduct to near Santa Fe Street - generally along Main Street from Viaduct to near Davis Street and then generally along Missouri and/or Franklin Street to Santa Fe Street;

- (f) From near Campbell Street to near Piedras Street generally along Missouri Street;

From Campbell Street to Cotton Avenue - 220 foot minimum

From Cotton Avenue to Piedras Street - 270 foot minimum

- (g) From near Piedras Street to near Loop 16 (Hawkins Way) generally along Madera, Manzana and Stephenson Streets 300 foot minimum.
- (h) From near Loop 16 southeasterly to near the junction of present U. S. Highway 80 with Farm to Market Road 76 300 foot minimum.
- (i) On U. S. Highway 54, from proposed U. S. Highway 80 Freeway near Cotton Avenue to Dyer Street generally along the line of the Southern Pacific Railroad (Tucumcari Branch) 200 foot minimum.

The Texas Highway Department will:

- 1. By this action express its intent to develop the ultimate Interstate route of U. S. Highway 80 throughout El Paso County and U. S. Highway 54 between the Interstate route of U. S. Highway 80 and Dyer Street as Freeways in accordance with the provisions of House Bill 451, 52nd Legislature.
- 2. Initiate development by stages of the Freeway facility on continuous usable sections of the route where all right-of way for ultimate development has been acquired. The sequence of development shall approximate the following:

- (a) From a point on the existing route near Courchesne School to east of the new Main Street Viaduct.
- (b) From near Campbell Street to near Piedras Street.
- (c) From Piedras Street to near Loop 16.

- (e) From east end of Main Street Viaduct to near Santa Fe Street.
- (f) Two Street System from near Santa Fe Street to Campbell Street.
- (g) U. S. Highway 54 from U. S. Highway 80 Interstate Freeway to Dyer Street.
- 3. Make such improvements on the existing route of U. S. Highway 80 outside the limits described above as is necessary to accommodate traffic, deferring Freeway development until work hereinabove outlined is completed.

It should be understood that construction of the ultimate facilities will depend upon traffic needs and availability of funds. This Order, and its acceptance by El Paso County and the City of El Paso shall be construed as a long range work plan intended to secure the orderly, economical and expeditious completion of the desired improvements.

This Minute will become operative upon acceptance by the proper officials of El Paso County and the City of El Paso. If this Minute is not accepted within ninety (90) days hereof it shall become automatically cancelled.

In HALL COUNTY, since the City of Memphis has expressed a desire for the development of a more direct route for <u>U.S. HIGHWAY 287</u> to be located on South Front Street through the City, the State Highway Engineer is directed to tender the following proposal to the City.

Provided the City of Memphis will:

- 1. Furnish a clear and unobstructed right-of-way along South Front Street to be 70' in width for the limits of the proposed relocation except in the restricted two block area between Noel and Brice Streets where a 65' width will be acceptable in order to avoid excessive property damage.
- 2. Make all necessary utility adjustments.
- 3. Pass and enforce whatever ordinances may be needed to prohibit parking, and execute the Texas Highway Department standard forms for construction and maintenance of highway projects inside incorporated cities and towns.
- 4. Provide sidewalks and driveways as may be required now or in the future, and for any storm sewer construction which may be considered essential to proper design of the project.

5. Take into the City Street System all streets which by reason of the proposed rerouting of U. S. Highway 287 will no longer be traversed by a State or Federal highway.

The State Highway Department will:

- 1. Construct a street section designed to provide a minimum of four lanes for moving traffic.
- 2. Maintain all items listed above as its construction responsibility.

Upon acceptance of the provisions of this Order by the City of Memphis, the State Highway Engineer is directed to proceed with the development of plans to accomplish the proposed relocation, and upon completion of plans and the fulfillment by the City of its obligations the State Highway Engineer shall submit the work for finance consideration by the Highway Commission.

This Minute shall become operative upon acceptance by the City of Memphis and if not accepted within ninety days hereof shall be automatically cancelled.

In CORYELL COUNTY, on FARM TO MARKET ROAD 1783, from Farm to Market Road 116, 4.0 miles southwest of Gatesville to Slater, a distance of approximately 12.040 miles, the construction of grading, structures, base and surfacing is expected to exceed the original allotment of funds and the State Highway Engineer is hereby directed to proceed with the work as planned at a revised estimated cost of \$162,700.00.

In ELLIS COUNTY a FARM TO MARKET ROAD is hereby designated extending from Farm to Market Road 66 at Maypearl, northwest to road intersection, a distance of approximately 4.8 miles, and the State Highway Engineer is directed to proceed in the most feasible and economical manner with the construction of grading, structures and surfacing, at an estimated cost of \$127,000.00.

In ELLIS COUNTY, IT IS ORDERED that FARM TO MARKET ROAD 1446, extending from Farm to Market Road 877 in Waxahachie southwest to road intersection, a distance of approximately 5.8 miles, be removed from the State Highway System and the road returned to Ellis County and the City of Waxahachie.
