

Langley George Hancock's own words describing historic November 22nd 1952 discovery flight

"In November of 1952, I was flying down south with my wife Hope, and we left a bit later than usual and by the time we got over the Hamersley Ranges, the clouds had formed and the ceiling got lower and lower. I got into the Turner River, knowing full well if I followed it through, I would come out into the Ashburton.

On going through a gorge in the Turner River, I noticed that the walls looked to me to be solid iron and was particularly alerted by the rusty looking colour of it, it showed to me to be oxidised iron."

1953

Returning to discovery area, I anding in spinifex and collecting samples for more than 50 miles and sending to Perth for analysis. After analysis, real isation he had found an iron ore zone of possible world significance.

Established family company, Hancock Prospecting Pty Ltd

1953-1960

Lobbied for lifting of Iron Ore export embargo by Federal Government. Continued exploration. Establ ished committee for North West devel opment with pastoral ist friends Frank Thompson and Bill Lesl ie and proposed and I obbied for tax incentives, with the provision that monies be invested in the North West.

1961-1962

Together with E.A Wright, negotiated agreements with Rio Tinto for the purpose of further development of Hancock's discoveries. Hosted the visit of Tom Price of Kaiser Steel, USA, which brought the involvement of Kaiser Steel into what became the new company, "Hamersley Iron". Increased exploration efforts with Dr Bruno Campana of Rio Tinto Austral ia, and mapping of the entire Hamersley Iron Province. Identified and named "Campana's Horizon", al so known as "Bruno's Band".

1962

Hosted the visit of Dr Muraoka and staff from Marubeni Japan, util ising Hancock's "Hamersl ey Station" as headquarters for Marubeni's, and Hancock's continuing expl oration efforts. The expl oration report of Dr Muroaka brought the Japanese Steel industry's interest into the Pil bara.

1963-1964

Arranged and hosted the visit of the worl d's then richest man, Daniel K Ludwig, and interested him in presenting a cost saving proposal to the West Austral ian government for the buil ding of a large central port and unified rail way system to service the entire Pil bara Iron Ore region, to enhance the region's competitiveness.

1966

Tom Price commissioned, and Port and town of Dampier establ ished.

1969-1971

Hosted the visit of Dr Edward teller to the Pil bara for the purpose of investigating the peaceful use of nuclear explosives to more economical I v mine ore, construct dams, and construct a deep water port near Ronsard. Brought Hamerslev Iron executives to Paraburdoo and interested them in devel oping Paraburdoo, after initial ground samples taken by Lang Hancock's cousin, Bill Newman. Sought to interest Texasgul f of USA, CSR, MIN, Utah and Consol idated Gol dfiel ds into participation in Hancock's and Hanwright's exploration teams.

1969

Established with WPPL the newspaper

"The Sunday Independent"

1970-1971

Hanwright explored with the co-operation of Mr Hancock's brothers in I aw Jim and Bill Nicholas, and friend Don Rhodes, the West Angel as, which Mr Hancock named after E.A. Wright's daughter, but these areas were then confiscated by the West Australian government, and later given to a competing company.

1970-1971

HPPL and WPPL established with TexasGul f the Iron Ore (Rhodes Ridge) Agreement with the West Australian government. HPPL and WPPL established with the Iron Ore (Wittenoom) Agreement with the West Australian government. HPPL and WPPL established with MIM. Utah and Consol idated Gol dfiel ds the Iron Ore (McCameys) Agreement with the West Austral ian government.

Pil bara's potential

1975

Arranged and hosted the visit of close friend, and Premier Joh Bjel ke-Petersen and party to the Pil bara, and promoted the establ ishment of a rail way I ine across Austral ia I inking the Pil bara's Iron to Queensl and's coking coal.

After years of effort with Marandoo, and completing the feasibil ity study, received 'Letter of Interest' from Nippon Steel, allowing Nippon Steel to participate up to 1/3 in the Marandoo project.

1976

Acquired HPPL Sydney headquarters at Circul ar Quay, and named the buil ding "Hope House", in honour of his wife, Hope Hancock.

1979

Wrote and rel eased first book "Wake Up Austral ia" (I aunched on June 10 by Premier Joh Bjelke-Petersen and his daughter Gina, in his absence due to il I heal th) on "Wake Up Australia" jumbojet tour of Austral ia's mineral assets and potential ..
