Dr. Károly Kapronczay was born in Budapest, Hungary, on February 28, 1928. He graduated from the Eötvös Lóránd University of Budapest with degrees in History and Library Sciences. His doctoral thesis addressed Hungarian-Polish Relations (1918-1929).

He has held leadership positions in Budapest's Semmelweis Library Archives and Museum and the Interior Ministry of the Hungarian Government.

His scholarly interests are numerous, extending to cultural and medical history. He has published several hundred scholarly and popular articles. He has also written scripts for 16 documentary motion pictures.

Dr. Kapronczay is Vice-President of the historical committee of the Hungarian Health Sciences Association, and of the Association of Polish Health Sciences.

He is the recipient of numerous academic honors from both Hungarian and Polish organizations. For his work on a Polish documentary film, he received the Polish Cross for Cultural Achievements and Polish Quality Standard Award.
