



The Issues 2006: Voters Will Agree to Disagree

Public Schools

Everyone and their mother has been jumping on this one with five schools slated for closing, charter schools being shut down for failings and parents leaving the city because they feel that the District of Columbia Public Schools system doesn't make the grade. Anyone who has set foot in Eastern High School or a similarly dilapidated building will understand such displeasure as they dodge rodents and admire the mosaics of chipped paint.

Every mayoral hopeful has expressed a plan for public school revitalization that either includes structural takeover – which is illegal under current District law – or some kind of increased oversight of the Office of the Superintendent such as making the position a Cabinet post. In the forums and few debates voters have enjoyed over the summer, most candidates have pointed to the billion-dollar School Modernization Bill as a safety option when they don't really seem to have much else to go on.

The outcry over public schools has gotten more darkly humorous as the primary approaches. D.C. Council Chair and mayoral candidate Linda Cropp has come after her fellow frontrunner, Adrian Fenty, over his recent voting record on education. It is a pretty bold move, when one remembers that the Chairwoman Cropp was president of the School Board throughout the 1980s.

Needless to say, whoever takes outgoing Mayor Anthony A. Williams' place will have his or her hands full with DCPS' woes. D.C. Council members can create legislation, but their powers are limited, regardless of what they tell you. A word to the wise: watch the general election in November just as closely on this one. The city still has a School Board, something that Ward 3 candidate Eric Goulet seems to understand better than most.

In a Washington Post article on the weight of the education vote in Upper Northwest, he said, "There's only so much a council member can do." Well, yeah.

Affordable Housing/Development

On to the second "sexy" issue in the race – affordable housing and development – there is quite a tightrope to walk here. At least a third of the candidates swear that people have been left behind in the wake of the city's

massive financial resurgence. A less cryptic way of phrasing it is that poorer District residents – anyone making less than the six figures a year needed to purchase most homes west of the Anacostia River – cannot afford to buy the \$500,000 condos that dot the District these days.

Yuppie newcomers to the city don't really have much to complain about because the resurgence is meant to cater to them and their corporate employers. Poor residents have good reason to be scared as low-income housing developments such as Sursum Corda and Temple Courts in Northwest and Barry Farm in Southeast, the places they have called home, are scheduled to be replaced under a plan that requires "one-forone replacement" that supposedly will allow them to return to rehabilitated buildings in redeveloped neighborhoods with franchise coffee shops and organic markets.

That is, of course, if they are able to return at all.

Candidates – and voters – have a dilemma. No one with any kind of political mind is going to say no to the millions of dollars brought in by development, but no self-professed public servant can continually dodge the argument that many native Washingtonians are being priced or bought out of homes that they grew up in.

It was probably less problematic when it was only poorer residents disappearing from census lists. Now, middle-income residents and young professionals are griping about spending what their parents put down on a monthly mortgage payment for a shoebox studio apartment. The definition of affordable – or workforce – housing is what's at stake here. The new question to ask is, "Affordable for whom?"

Hot on the heels of the affordable housing conundrum is the development phenomenon that is moving steadily east and south and knocking at the door of ... guess where?... Southeast. Anacostia, Congress Heights, etc.

With a multimillion-dollar base-ball stadium slated to rise from a slate-gray crater on the Anacostia Waterfront along South Capitol Street, and the U.S. Coast Guard bringing its national headquarters to the vacant West Campus of St. Elizabeth's Hospital-- a section of the city known for being predominantly Black and predominantly poor--voters are wondering what awaits it at this decade's end.

A straight shot north of the new stadium has Sursum Corda and Temple Courts waiting to take their places at the vortex of Northwest One, a redevelopment plan introduced as part of Mayor Anthony Williams' New Communities Initiative. Barry Farm – just down the street from The Informer office – awaits its sister's fate.

At the moment, the redevelopments look like Old Town Alexandria – comfy and packed with retail and shiny glass – so some residents, tired of open-air drug markets and gain-less employment, are optimistic. Experience with gentrification's ebb and flow has others fearing that the new neighborhoods will tease them with jobs they won't have and homes they can't afford.

So voters in and around these communities can watch and wait and hope that they might escape the development push that may have sent friends and family packing for Prince George's County. Ward 3 Councilwoman Kathy Patterson, currently running for Council chair, told me that the housing bubble was as fat as it was going to get.

Maybe now I can move out of my shoebox and into a cabinet.

Public Safety

In a predominantly Black city, you can count on race to create public discourse like nothing else. In the first 12 days of July, over a dozen people were murdered in the District with muggings on the National Mall to boot. Dark as it may sound, premature death is nothing new to many residents in the District of Columbia, resurgence or not.

Then a prominent Jewish lobbyist has his throat slashed on Q Street N.W. in Georgetown – less than a block away from where I used to rent a room – and Mayor Anthony Williams is pressing a vacationing Council to sign off on a crime emergency bill to put surveillance cameras on the streets, extend police access to offender records and put a 10 p.m. curfew on teenagers under age 16.

Like clockwork, many Black Washingtonians in the city's eastern wards are outraged and charge that their constant crime emergency has been overlooked by the folks at the Wilson Building for ... well, forever. Like a cup of water during a marathon, the race for the primary picks up on the crime emergency and runs with it.

Some candidates join the bill's detractors, saying that race and class motivated the new vigilance; others express concern or disbelief that any-


one would entertain such a thing.

Ward 5 Councilman and mayoral hopeful Vincent Orange is part of the former group; At-large incumbent Phil Mendelson is part of the latter. Depending on their home ward, all the other hopefuls take sides accordingly. Even Congressional Delegate Eleanor Holmes-Norton said that it is financially detrimental to let crime hijack the city's biggest tourist draw – the National Mall.

How this shakes-out for voters probably depends on how one felt before last month. In Ward 5, home to a Trinidadian go-go club where youths got into a brawl complete with stray gunfire earlier this month, public safety is a big concern, especially for the elderly. The seeds of the crime emergency were probably sown – and. apparently, reaped - in Ward 3 where retired New York Times reporter David Rosenbaum was mugged and left to die near his home in January. Fast-forward seven months and even Northwest residents say that city emergency services are unresponsive.

So, this year's primary may very well see something special for the District. White and Black Washingtonians agreeing on something. Or, at least, agreeing to disagree.


