# CLUB OF HONOR 2002

Eight members of the University of Michigan athletic family were honored Saturday, February 2nd with induction into the Michigan Hall of Honor. Members of this year's class distinguished themselves and the University through significant and outstanding accomplishments while in college and following graduation.

Inductees in the 17th Hall of Honor ceremony include Edsel Buchanan, gymnastics and cheerleading; Anthony Carter, football; Herman Fishman, basketball and baseball; Bennie McRae, track and field and football; Elmer Dayton Mitchell, Director in Intramural Sports; Bill Mogk, baseball; Penny Neer, basketball, softball, and track and field; and Michael "Campy" Russell, basketball.

"This year's class is a very special class having not only made outstanding contributions to their respective sports but also have made significant contributions to their communities following their time at the University of Michigan," said Bill Martin, U-M Director of Intercollegiate Athletics.

The University of Michigan Hall of Honor was established in 1978 to recognize those persons who have made significant

contributions as athletes, coaches, and administrators to upholding the tradition of Wolverine athletics as well as enhancing the image and reputation of the University of Michigan.

This year was also special since it is the first year that the Letterwinners "M" Club joined the Athletic Department in honoring and sponsoring the inductees.

"The tie-in between the Letterwinners "M" Club and the Athletic Department in regards to the Hall of Honor is a natural and a winwin for both groups," said Lynn Evans, president of the Letterwinners "M" Club. "As an organization representing all prior Michigan letterwinners, and with a history of almost 90 years, the club is excited about this year's induction and continuing the long-term relationship between the "M" Club, the Athletic Department and the University."

The inductees were honored with a reception at the U-M Golf Course preceding the Michigan-Wisconsin basketball game. They were also honored at halftime of the basketball game at Crisler Arena. The next induction will be in the Fall of 2003 and then every other year.













# **2002 INDUCTEES**



### Edsel Buchanan

Edsel Buchanan competed as a gymnast for the University of Michigan for four years and was a five-year member of the varsity cheerleading team. Buchanan was a Big Ten trampoline champion (1949) and a three-time NCAA national champion (1949-51), becoming the only athlete to win three consecutive national trampoline championships. Based on these accomplishments Buchanan was inducted into the U.S. Trampoline association in 1965. Today, Buchanan continues to be involved in several intramural organizations.



### Anthony Carter

Anthony Carter had a "hall of fame" career at Michigan that is accented by his inclusion into the U-M Hall of Honor, the third major Hall of Fame induction for the famed Wolverine #1. Carter earned four letters as a Michigan wide receiver, played on a pair of Big Ten championship teams, and earned All-America honors three times (1980-82), becoming only the second Wolverine three-time All-American. Carter was Big Ten player of the year in 1982 and twice named team MVP. Carter went on to a successful 14-year professional career that included 11 years playing in the NFL.



### Herman Fishman

Herman Fishman earned six letters at the University of Michigan, lettering three times in basketball (1936-38) and three times in baseball (1936-38). As a basketball guard, Fishman led the conference in scoring and competed in a total of 54 games for the Wolverines. Fishman was also a star pitcher for the Michigan baseball team and in 1936 he carried a 0.86 earned run average, which was a conference record. After completing his athletic career Fishman went on to start a boys' athletic camp, Camp Michigama, which continues to be successful today.



### Bennie McRae

Bennie McRae was a two-sport standout while at Michigan in both track and field and football. While competing for the track team, McRae won four Big Ten titles over a two-year period. In 1961, McRae was listed by Track and Field News as one of the top 10 hurdlers in the world. Despite his stellar track success, most remember McRae for his strong performances as left halfback for the football team which eventually helped him become an All-Big Ten selection in football.





# **2002 INDUCTEES**



### Elmer Dayton Mitchell

Dr. Elmer Dayton Mitchell continues to be renowned throughout the country and the world as the "Father of Intramurals." In 1919, Mitchell became the Director of Intramural Sports at U-M and worked under the motto "Athletics for All." Under Mitchell's administration, the University intramural program received national recognition and acclaim and in time served to be a model for future intramural directors.



### Bill Mogk

Bill Mogk had an outstanding four-year (1950-53) baseball career at Michigan and earned three varsity letters for the 1951, '52 and '53 seasons. Legendary coach Ray Fisher asked Mogk to fill in many different gaps and play many different positions. Mogk played second based as a sophomore but moved to first base as a junior. During that year, he did not make a single error, becoming the first Wolverine to play errorless for an entire season. Mogk went on to compete for the Detroit Sandlots and continues to be involved as a coach for Grosse Pointe (Mich.) South High School.



### Penny Neer

Penny Neer earned eight letters in three different varsity sports at U-M, competing in basketball, track and field, and softball. Neer was a three-time Big Ten discus champion in 1980, '81 and '82. During her junior year, she became U-M's first woman All-American in track and field, and as a senior, Neer won the national title in discus, making her the first U-M woman to win a national title in track and field. Neer also holds the Michigan discus record, is a member of Michigan Sports Hall of Fame, and was named to the Big Ten All-Decade team.



### Michael "Campy" Russell

Michael "Campy" Russell was a U-M basketball standout who was elected by a near unanimous vote to be Big Ten Player of the Year in 1974, and he was also selected to the All-America team that same year. During the 1974 season, he led the Big Ten in scoring with 24 points per game and was second in rebounding with 11.3 rebounds per game. Russell continued on to a successful professional career, competing 10 years in the NBA. Today, Russell continues to be involved in several community organizations and has also served on the Pontiac (Mich.) city council.






































# Women's Sports Pioneer and Honorary "M" Marie Hartwig Passed Away December 23, 2001

Former University of Michigan professor and athletics administrator Marie Hartwig, one of the leading pioneers for women's sports both on a local and national level, passed away Sunday, Dec. 23 at the age of 95.

Marie, the first woman to be inducted into the University of Michigan Athletic Department Hall of Honor, was an associate athletic director for the Wolverines in the 1970's. She was an avid sportswoman, talented musician and a dedicated educator. She started her career here at the University of Michigan in 1930 before retiring in 1976.

Then U-M athletic director Don Canham named the Hartwig Building after Marie in 1984. The building today houses the Wolverine athletic ticket department, media relations office, marketing and promotions, and information technology.
