
CENSUS 2001 BRADFORD DISTRICT WARD PROFILES 4. Bolton and Undercliffe

The new ward of Bolton and Undercliffe includes most of the old Bolton ward together with a large part of the Undercliffe ward. This largely residential area stretches from Undercliffe Cemetery in the south to Five Lane Ends in the north.

Population

The population of Bolton and Undercliffe is 15,507. The ward has a slightly older age profile than the District as a whole. 32.7% of the population are under 24 years of age. The average for the District is 35.9%. The proportion of the population over 65 years of age (15.7%), is greater than the average for the District as a whole (14.4%).

Household Composition

In Bolton and Undercliffe nearly $\frac{1}{4}$ of all households are pensioners. This is just slightly higher than the District average of 22.8%. The proportion of households comprising a couple with children is similar to the District average - 23%, compared to 22.4% for the District as a whole. The proportion of lone parent families, 7.2% of all households is just lower than the District average of 7.4%.

Household Characteristics

In Bolton and Undercliffe, there are fewer overcrowded households than the average for the District. ¼ of all households do not have central heating or sole use of a bath and inside toilet, compared to 23.2% of households for the District as a whole. The proportion of households who do not have access to a car/van (28.7%) and the proportion of households with occupants with a long term illness (35.6%) are lower than the respective District average.

Housing Type

Semi-detached houses account for over $\frac{1}{2}$ of the housing stock in this ward. 26.5% of all dwellings are terraced houses and 9.5% are detached.

Housing Tenure

The vast majority of households in Bolton and Undercliffe are homeowners. Only 9.4% of households rent accommodation from a social housing provider. The proportion of households who live in privately rented accommodation is 9.9%.

⁽²⁾ Overcrowding is defined as the number of households having one room too few for the household. A single person household is assumed to require two 'common' rooms (not including a bathroom) and a bedroom. Families are assumed to require two 'common' rooms (not including a bathroom) and a bedroom for each couple, lone parent, any other person over 16 years, each pair aged 10-15 years of the same sex, each pair formed from a remaining person aged 10-15 years and a child aged under 10 of the same sex, each pair of children aged 10 years and under and each remaining person. This is the definition of overcrowding used by government.

⁽³⁾ Households without central heating or sole use of a bath and inside toilet.

⁽⁴⁾ People who responded 'yes' to the question 'Do you have any long term illness, health problems or disability which limits your daily activities or the work you can do?' A prompt asked people to include any problems due to old age.

Work (1)

In Bolton and Undercliffe, 68.6% of all people between the age of 16 and 74 are either working or seeking work (economically active). This is higher than the District average of 63.4%. The percentage of people who are economically active but unemployed is 5.3%. This is lower than the District average of 6.9%.

Of those who are economically inactive in this age range, 43.7% are retired. The remainder are students, people looking after families/home, the permanently sick or disabled, or people who are inactive for other reasons. The proportion of people who are economically inactive due to permanent sickness or disability (17.7%) is higher than the District average of 16.7%.

Unemployment (1)

Over $\frac{1}{4}$ of the unemployed in this ward have not worked for two or more years. This is lower than the District average of 31.9%. 8.6% of the unemployed have never worked. Over $\frac{1}{4}$ are under 24 years of age and 16% are over 50.

Qualifications (1)

34.2% of the population in this ward aged between 16 and 74 have no formal qualifications, which is slightly lower than the average for the District as a whole - 35.1%. 12.2% have a professional / degree level qualification, compared to 15.9% for the District as a whole.

82.9% of the population in this ward describe their ethnic origin as White, while 7.1% have an Indian ethnic background and 4.8% have Pakistani ethnic origins.

Health and unpaid caring

The health and unpaid caring data for this ward mirrors the picture for the District as a whole. In the 2001 Census, 9.8% of the population described their health as 'not good'. The average for the Bradford District is 10.1%. 18.5% of the population, also the District average, have a long term illness that limits their daily activities. This may include any problems related to old age. In terms of unpaid care, 10.7% of the population provide some form of unpaid care. 20% of carers provide over 50 hours of unpaid care a week.
