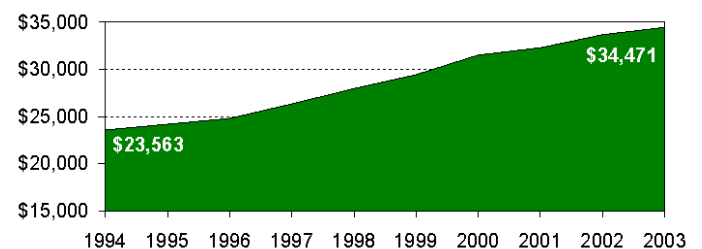

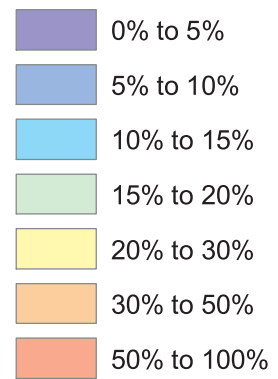
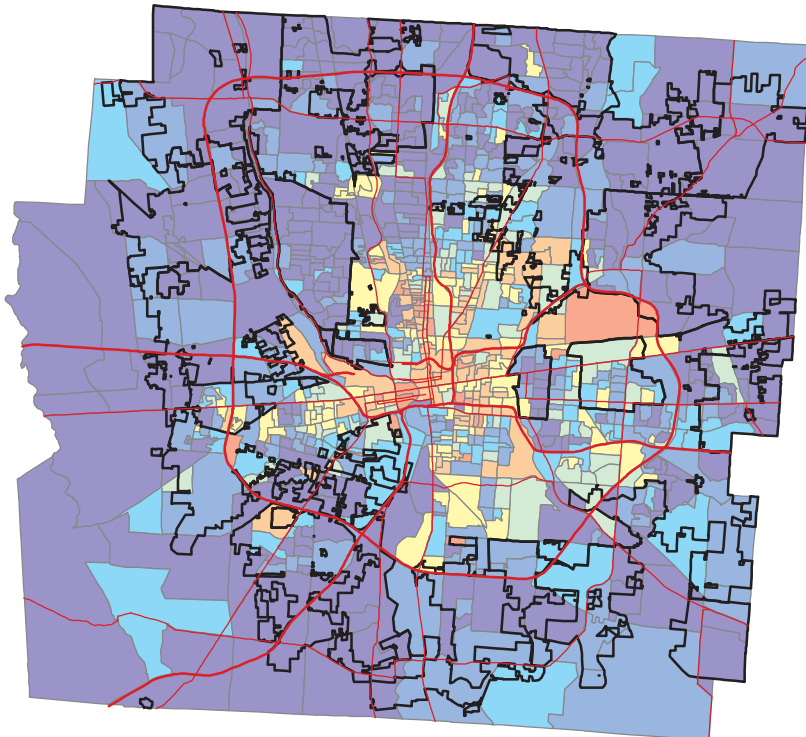
Percent of Persons 25 and Older
