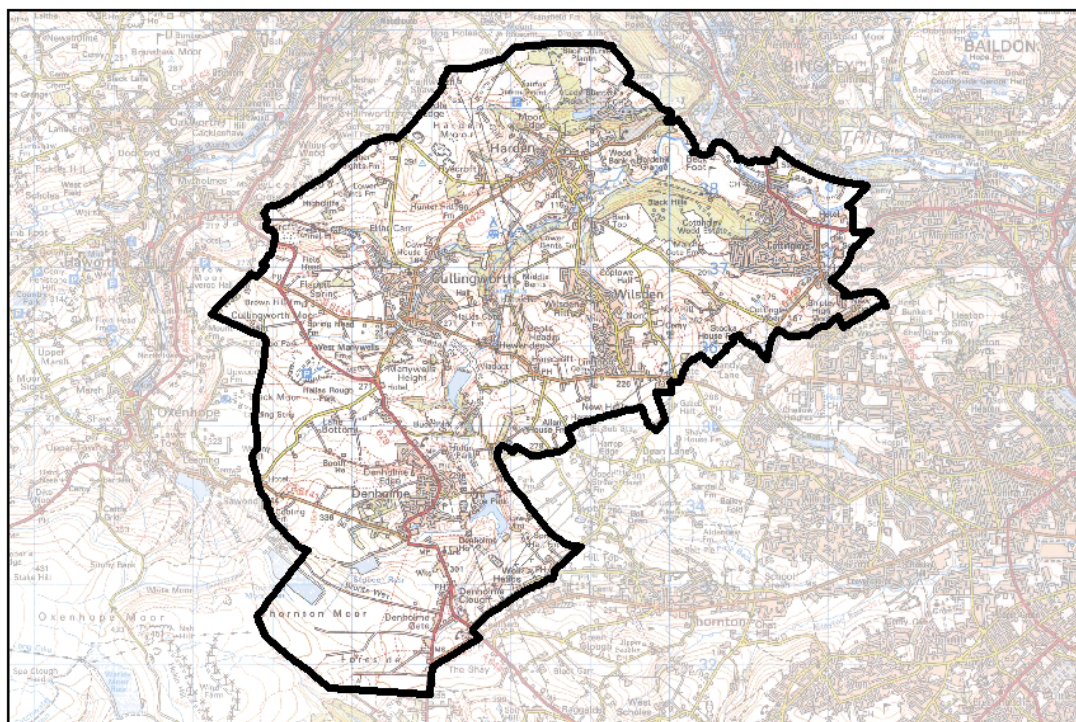


## CENSUS 2001 BRADFORD DISTRICT WARD PROFILES

### 3. Bingley Rural

Bingley Rural stretches from the village of Harden in the north to the District's border with Calderdale in the south. It also includes the villages of Cottingley, Cullingworth, Denholme and Wilsden, and the surrounding farmland. These communities were once based on the agricultural and the textile industries, but are now largely commuter settlements.



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### Population

The population of Bingley Rural is 16,649. It has an older age profile than the District as a whole. 28.9% of the population is under 24 years of age, compared to a District average of 35.9%. 27.6% of the population is between 45 and 65 years of age, compared to 21.7% for the District as a whole. 15.2% of the population is over 65 years of age. The District average is 14.4%.

### Household Composition

In Bingley Rural, 23.7% of households are all pensioner households. This is similar to the District average of 22.8%. Households consisting of a couple with dependent children account for 23.6% of all households in this ward. The proportion of lone parent families, 5.1% of households, is lower than the District average of 7.4%.

(1) A dependent child is a person in a household aged 0 - 15 years (whether or not in a family) or a person aged 16-18 years who is a full-time student in a family with their parent(s).

## **Household Characteristics**

In the case of household characteristics this ward compares well to the District average. Only 3.8% of households are considered to be overcrowded, compared to 8.3% of households for the District as a whole. 14.9% of households are without central heating or the sole use of a bath and inside toilet and 18.8% do not have access to a car /van. Nearly one third of households have at least one occupant with a long term illness.

(1)The figures for the 2004 wards have been calculated by aggregating output area data. Output areas are small areas of between 100 and 125 households. Due to the rounding of this information for confidentiality reasons, the total household figure in this table varies slightly from the figure in the previous table.

(2) Overcrowding is defined as the number of households having one room too few for the household. A single person household is assumed to require two 'common' rooms (not including a bathroom) and a bedroom. Families are assumed to require two 'common' rooms (not including a bathroom) and a bedroom for each couple, lone parent, any other person over 16 years, each pair aged 10-15 years of the same sex, each pair formed from a remaining person aged 10-15 years and a child aged under 10 of the same sex, each pair of children aged 10 years and under and each remaining person. This is the definition of overcrowding used by government.

(3) Households without central heating or sole use of a bath and inside toilet.

(4) People who responded 'yes' to the question 'Do you have any long term illness, health problems or disability which limits your daily activities or the work you can do?' A prompt asked people to include any problems due to old age.

## **Housing Type**

Semi-detached houses account for over 40% of the housing stock in this ward. 29.8% of all dwellings are terraced houses and 21.9% detached homes.

## **Housing Tenure**

In Bingley Rural, 81.8% of households are owner occupiers. 9.7% of households rent their accommodation from a social housing provider and 8.5% rent from a private landlord.

## Work (1)

In Bingley Rural, 71.4% of all people in this ward between the age of 16 and 74 are either working or seeking work. This is higher than the District average of 63.4%. The percentage of people who are economically active but unemployed is 3.2%. This is lower than the District average of 6.9%.

Of those who are economically inactive, nearly ½ are retired. The remainder are students (11%); people looking after families and home (16.8%); the permanently sick or disabled (15.5%); and people who are economically inactive for other unspecified reasons (7%).

## Unemployment (1)

29.5% of the unemployed in this ward have not worked for two or more years. This is lower than the District average. 10.7 % of those who are unemployed have never worked. 32.7% are under 24 years of age and 19.2% over 50.

## Qualifications <sup>(1)</sup>

24.3% of the population in this ward aged between 16 and 74 have no qualifications. This is lower than the District average of 35.1%. 20.7% have a professional / degree level qualification.

## Ethnic group

97.9% of the population in this ward describe themselves as White, while people with a Pakistani ethnic background are the second largest ethnic group, at 0.6% of the population.

## Health and unpaid caring

In the 2001 Census, 8.4% of the population in Bingley Rural described their health as 'not good'. This is slightly lower than the average for the District, 10.1%. 17% have a long term illness or disability which limits their daily activities. This may include any problems related to old age. In terms of unpaid caring, 11.4 % of the population provide some form of unpaid care. 17.9% of carers provide over 50 hours of care a week.
