## Georgia Wins National Title

The University of Georgia men's tennis team closed out its perfect season, capturing the NCAA Championship at the Dan Magill Tennis Complex. The Bulldogs defeated Illinois, 4-0 in the final. The title-clinching match came from senior Matic Omerzel as he took down Ruben Gonzales, 7-6(5), 6-1 from the fourth singles position.

The Bulldogs began by capturing the doubles point. UGA finished the year having won the doubles point 31 times in 32 matches. First to finish was the freshman tandem of Jamie Hunt and Nate Schnugg as they took down GD Jones and Marc Spicijaric, 9-7, at the third position. Georgia's 16th-ranked duo of junior Travis Helgeson and Omerzel then beat Brandon Davis and Gonzales, 8-6, to clinch the point at the second position. The match at the top spot went unfinished with No. 1-ranked John Isner and junior Luis Flores trailing No. 8-ranked Kevin Anderson and Ryan Rowe, 7-8.

In singles play, 95th-ranked Schnugg gave Georgia a 2-0 lead as he topped Jones, 6-4, 6-1 in the fifth slot. No. 1-ranked Isner then made it a 3-0 lead with a 6-1, 7-6(1) victory at the top spot over No. 5-ranked Anderson, setting Omerzel up for the clinch.

Manuel Diaz has now led the Bulldogs to three NCAA Team National Championships (1999, 2001 and 2007) in his 19-year career as the head coach. He was also an assistant coach under Dan Magill when UGA captured the 1985 and 1987 NCAA crowns. His career record stands at 436-93.

## Team-by-Team Notes

### Alabama

The Crimson Tide ended the 2007 season with a No. 14 national ranking, tying the 1983 team for the third-highest final ranking in school history. The No. 14 ranking is also the highest ranking since 1993, when the Tide ended the season at No. 9. Alabama posted 22 team wins this season, making it the only team in 20 years to have a 20-plus win season. Senior Joseph Jung became the winningest player in Alabama history and produced 20 or more wins in each of his four seasons at the Capstone, a feat unmatched by any other Tide player. Billy Mertz entered the record books this season by posting 27 singles victories. That number ties him for sixth all-time for singles victories in a season.

### Arkansas

Arkansas' Blake Strode defeated Andreas Weber of Hawaii, 4-6, 6-4, 7-6 (10-8) on the opening day of play in the NCAA Singles Championship. After winning in three grueling sets in the round of 64 on Wednesday, Strode fell to No. 16 Andre Begemann of Pepperdine, 6-3, 6-3, in the round of 32. Strode ends the season with a record of 27-11 overall. In 2007, Strode was 10-7 against ranked opponents and finished the regular season with six straight wins, the last five coming against ranked foes. Against the top 50, he posted a record of 6-5. A first-team All-SEC honoree, Strode was ranked as high as No. 43 by the ITA. He has now compiled 54 wins in his two short seasons as a Razorback. For his outstanding work in the classroom, Strode was named CoSIDA Academic All-District with the potential to be named Academic All-American after another round of voting. Strode has maintained a 4.0 GPA as double major in International Economics and Spanish. He is also a member of Arkansas' Honors College and is a recipient of the prestigious Bodenhamer Fellowship, a full-academic scholarship. In doubles play, Strode and partner Colin Mascall fell to Marco Born and Andreas Siljestrom of Middle Tennessee, 6-2, 6-4. The duo ends the season with a record of 19-10 overall.

### Auburn

The Auburn men's tennis team concluded the 2007 season with a 15-10 record, marking the fourth straight season the Tigers have posted a winning ledger and the 13th winning record for head coach Eric Shore. With a final ranking of 29th in the Fila/ITA poll, the Tigers have now finished seven consecutive seasons with a top-50 ranking. Auburn earned a trip to the NCAA Tournament and fell to the eventual National Champion Georgia, 4-0, in the second round. The NCAA Tournament appearance marked the 13th time in the last 14 seasons Auburn has made post-season play. Robbert Lathouwers and Alex Schweizer concluded their collegiate careers at the NCAA Singles Championship on May 22. Lathouwers was named First Team All-SEC to become the 26th Tiger to earn All-SEC honors. It was the seventh straight year Shore has had at least one individual named All-SEC.

### Florida

Florida advanced to the NCAA Round of 16 for the sixth-straight year and the 14th time in the last 17 by coming back from a 3-0 deficit to defeat Florida State in Tallahassee, Fla., to go to Athens, Ga.\*For the second straight season, the Gators lost to the eventual national champions in the Round of 16 as UF dropped a 4-0 decision to Georgia\*Florida was 17th in the

preseason ITA polls and finished up at No. 16\*Florida continued its streak of earning a bid to the NCAA tournament as the Gators are one of three teams nationally (Georgia and UCLA) to do so each year since 1991\*Finished in a four-way tie for third-place in the SEC marking the sixth-straight season the Gators have finished third or higher in the league\*Earned the No. 3 seed in the SEC Tournament and advanced to the semifinals of the event for the fifth consecutive season and the 11th time in school history\*Were ranked No. 26 or higher all season and peaked at No. 7 (Feb. 6)\*Finished with a 10-1 home record\*Continued their success against in-state opponents under head-coach Andy Jackson as they are now 27-1\*Knocked off two top 10 opponents in 4-3 victories in Gainesville. The first came over then No. 2 Baylor (Feb. 4) and the second was against then-No. 10 LSU (March 25).

### Georgia

Georgia won its fifth team national championship (1985, '87, '99, 2001, '07) and were ranked No. 1 wire-to-wire. Three Bulldogs were named ITA All-Americans: John Isner (S&D), Luis Flores (S&D), Travis Helgeson (S), while Isner and Flores also took home the ITA Doubles Team of the Year award. Isner became the all-time winningest player at UGA in singles and doubles. and also became Georgia's 7th four-time All-American and 8th four-time All-SEC. In addition, he became only two-time SEC Player of the Year in history of the award. The Bulldogs completed their first undefeated season in school history, winning their 24th SEC Regular-Season championship and 7th SEC Tournament championship, both conference records.

### Kentucky

Kentucky concluded the season with a first-round SEC Championship loss to Auburn. It was the second consecutive season the Wildcats dropped their opening round match-up. Sophomore Bruno Agostinelli concluded the season ranked 78th in the country in the ITA polls and ended the season with the most individual wins for the Blue and White. Kentucky will only lose senior Peter Bjork next season, returning the bulk of their experienced lineup including Agostinelli, juniors Marcus Sundh and Will Ward.

### LSU

The LSU men's tennis team finished the season with an 18-7 record after falling to Ohio State in the NCAA round of 16. Associate head coach Mark Booras was named ITA Assistant Coach of the Year. Danny Bryan received the ITA/Arthur Ashe Jr. Award for Leadership and Sportsmanship. Three Tigers were named ITA All-Americans as Ken Skupski received singles honors and Danny Bryan and Colt Gaston were recognized in doubles. Skupski reached the round of 16 in the NCAA singles tournament before falling to top-seeded John Isner of Georgia. Bryan and Gaston advanced to the NCAA Doubles Quarterfinals where they were defeated by the defending champs of Kyle Anderson and Ryan Rowe of Illinois.

### Ole Miss

The Rebels captured their sixth consecutive SEC Western Division Championship and advanced to the NCAA "Sweet Sixteen" for the 12th time in the history of the program. Their final national ranking of No. 7, marked the 12th time in the

last 14 years for them to earn a top-10 finish. The Rebels hosted an NCAA Regional for the seventh year in a row and posted their 10th 20-win season (24-5) in the program's history. The team did not have a loss outside the top 15. The Rebels tied with three other teams for the most All-Americans (three) as Erling Tveit, Robbye Poole and Eric Claesson earned the honor. Tveit became the first Rebel to earn All-America honors multiple times in singles and doubles. Poole became the program's 20th All-American. Tveit and Claesson's final ranking of No. 10 in doubles marked the second year in a row for the NCAA quarterfinalists to end the year among the top 10. Seven members of the team earned at least a 3.0 or above for the spring semester, including Tveit, Matthias Wellermann and Bram ten Berge posting 4.0s.

### Mississippi State

Bulldog juniors Ivan Bjelica and Philippe Frayssinoux finished 2007 among the nation's best in the ITA Rankings and were both accorded all-SEC honors as well. Bjelica ended the year 41st nationally in singles, while Frayssinoux was 67th. The players also teamed to finish 42nd in the country in doubles together. MSU head coach Sylvain Guichard announced his resignation at the end of the 2007 season. Guichard led State to four NCAA appearances in six years as head coach and was named SEC Co-Coach of the Year in 2005.

### South Carolina

South Carolina finished with a 11-14 overall record and a 2-9 mark in the SEC. The Gamecocks NCAA Tournament streak ended at 13 trips when they failed to make the post-season field. South Carolina fell to No. 16 Alabama, 4-1, in the first round the Southeastern Conference Tournament. In addition to battling numerous injuries, Carolina faced a particularly tough schedule in 2007. The Gamecocks played 16 matches against 15 teams that made the NCAA field and posted three wins over postseason teams (UNLV, Charlotte and Georgia Tech). Head coach Kent DeMars loses just one starter and returns eight lettermen for the 2008 season.

### Tennessee

The Tennessee men's tennis team ended its season with a 17-8 record after advancing to the second round of the NCAA tournament before falling to second-ranked Ohio State. The Vols had one entry in the NCAA singles championship and one entry in the doubles championship. Kaden Hensel dropped his first round match to San Diego State's Markus Dickhardt. Adam Hubble and Ben Rogers advanced to the second round of the doubles championship before falling to Georgia's Luis Flores and John Isner 7-6, 7-6. The Vols lose three seniors from this year's squad, Ben Rogers, Kiril Tcherveniachki and Johnny Thornton and sophomore Derek Stephens left the program. Rogers and Tcherveniachki both had fantastic senior seasons finishing the year with a record of 33-7 in dual-match singles. UT returns six lettermen including Hensel, Bobby Cameron and Davey Sandgren who were all ranked in singles at some point this past season.

### Vanderbilt

The Vanderbilt men's tennis team advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament with an upset-victory over Tulsa in Baton Rouge, La. Second-year Head Coach Ian Duvenhage was making his first postseason appearance with the Commodores. After bowing out to host LSU, the

Commodores closed the year with a final record of 11-13. Vanderbilt notched three victories over Top 30 opponents this year, including No. 23 Clemson, No. 29 Auburn and No. 22 Tulsa, on its way to earning a No. 37 final ranking from the ITA. Junior Ryan Preston was the lone Commodore invited to NCAA individual play. He finished the season ranked No. 53. Sophomore Nik Cromydas also found his way into the ITA's final national rankings at No. 122.

### Southeastern Conference

The Southeastern Conference men's tennis programs continue to be the nation's leader on the collegiate hardcourt. The conference made another strong national showing in 2007 as Georgia men took the national title in front of their home crowd in Athens, Ga. It was the fifth national team title for the league, all having been captured by Georgia (1985, 1987, 1999, 2001, and 2007). Alabama, Florida, LSU and Ole Miss also made it through to the Round of 16.

Georgia senior John Isner played in the finals of the singles, being defeated by Virginia's Somdev Devvarman, 7-6(7), 4-6, 7-6(2). Overall the SEC has 16 NCAA singles champions in men's tennis dating back to 1930, with eight of those titles coming since 1984. The league also has eight runner-ups in singles play.

In doubles action four SEC teams made it to the quarterfinals. Isner and partner Luis Flores, LSU's tandem of Danny Bryan and Colt Gaston, Ole Miss' Eric Claesson and Erling Tveit, and Florida duo Jesse Levine and Greg Ouellette were all eliminated in the round. Six of the league's ten doubles titles have come since 1993, with five different SEC schools being represented. Another four league duos took home runner-up honors.

*From 1953-1989 the SEC Champion was determined by the accumulation of points in an individual flighted tournament. In 1990, a team dual match format was instituted for the conference tournament and a points system was put in place to determine the SEC champion. From 1990-98, the SEC Champion was determined by a total aggregate points accumulated at the conclusion of the conference tournament: one full point is awarded for each regular-season conference win, one-half point for wins in the first two rounds of the conference tournament, one-half point for receiving a first-round bye in the conference tournament and one full point for a win in the conference tournament semifinals and finals. For the 1999 season, the same points system was in place with a couple of changes: one full point for first-round bye in the conference tournament and one full point for a win in any round of the conference tournament. In 2000, the SEC changed the determination of its tennis champions to the team with the best winning percentage in conference regular-season dual matches (11 matches).*
