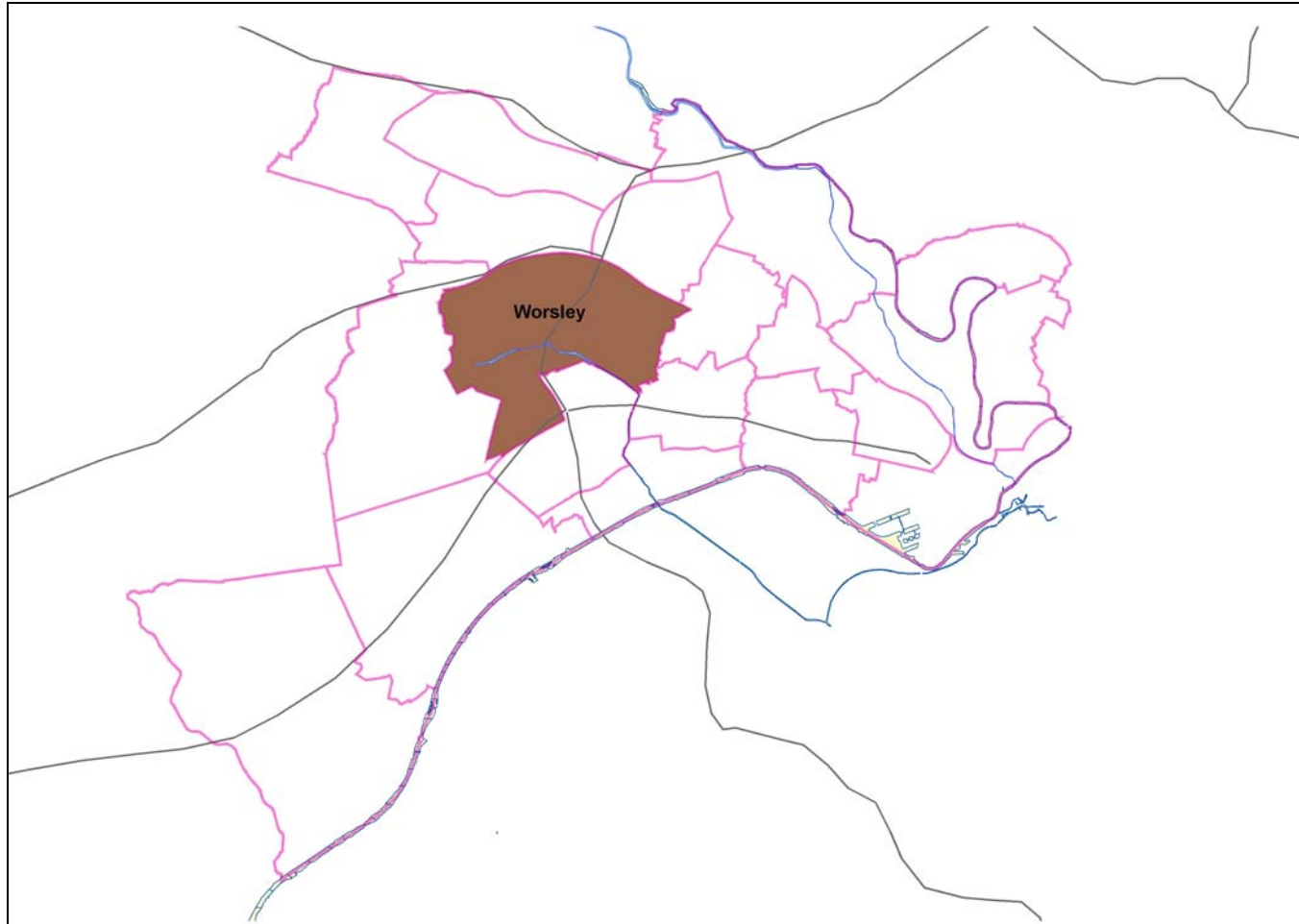

City of Salford: Worsley ward profile

This ward profile is one of a series of 20 that provides an overview of major issues within Salford. The ward is highlighted in the map on the front page. The profile is based on statistical information available to the council from a range of sources including the 2001 census and the 2004 Index of Multiple Deprivation. The profile looks at situations in the ward in relation to the rest of the city, the region and the country.

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Salford's wards were revised in 2004. Census data in this report relates to new wards and has been compiled using rebased 2001 Census data. Rebased data uses proportioned Output Area level data and not the individual source returns. Only the map showing indicative total population change for Salford wards 1991-2001 uses census data that is not rebased and refers to the Salford wards that existed before the 2004 ward boundary changes. All other information in the profile is for new wards.

In the 2001 Census very small numbers were masked for confidentiality. In some tables numbers do not add to the total because of this. Definitions used in the 2001 Census are available from <http://www.statistics.gov.uk/statbase/Product.asp?vlnk=12951>.

The Index of Multiple Deprivation 2004 (IMD 2004) is a Super Output Area (SOA) level measure of multiple deprivation and is made up of seven SOA level domain indices. There are two supplementary indices (Income Deprivation Affecting Children and Income Deprivation Affecting Older People).

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Summary

Background

Worsley

- is the 5th least populous ward in Salford with around 9,950 people and 4,150 households
- is the 3rd least densely populated ward in Salford, with around 23 people per hectare excluding green belt areas
- experienced a population gain between 1991 and 2001
- has relatively more people than the city as a whole in all the age groups from 45-59 and older
- has proportionally more of the population identifying as White British than the city as a whole
- has a higher proportion of families made up of married couples with and without children than Salford as a whole
- has a lower proportion of lone parent families than average for Salford.

Improving health in Salford

- According to IMD 2004, health is generally better than other wards in the city.
- Proportionally more people said they were in good health at the time of the last census than in the city as a whole
- Proportionally fewer people are economically inactive through sickness or disability compared with Salford as a whole.
- The proportion of babies born with low birthweight is below the Salford average.

Reducing crime in Salford

- The picture in relation to crime is varied; some areas have severe problems while others are among the best in the country.
- The crime rate in the ward overall is lower than the city average.
- The rate of dwellings burgled has come down.
- The rate of theft from motor vehicles fluctuates, while for theft of vehicles it is more stable and lower than the city as a whole.

Encouraging learning, leisure and creativity in Salford

- The adult population tends to be qualified to a higher level than the city average.
- Primary school results for pupils who live in the ward for Key Stage 2 are below the city levels.
- GCSE attainment for pupils living in Worsley is well above city and national averages.
- Results for all pupils taking GCSE in 2006 at Moorside High School show greater underachievement compared with their Key Stage 2 attainment than pupils in the city and country as a whole.
- Childcare provision for 0-8 year olds as a proportion of the population of this age is high compared with the city as a whole.

Investing in young people in Salford

- At Moorside High School the proportion of school leavers not in education, training, or employment is around the city level but they are more likely to stay in full time education than the city average.
- Lone parents are twice as likely to work full time as those in the city as a whole.

Promoting inclusion in Salford

- All of the population is outside the 30% most deprived in England, according to IMD 2004.
- Relatively more people are employers, managers and professionals than the Salford population in general.
- The proportion of households claiming housing or council tax benefits has risen a little over the last two years, but is well below the city average.

Creating prosperity in Salford

- Unemployment rose in the year to April 2006 but remains the lowest rate in Salford.
- The dependency ratio is 1:1, representing near parity between those employed and all other residents except students, whereas across the city there are more dependents than people employed.
- People tend to work longer hours than the city average.
- IMD 2004 for employment shows the entire ward is outside the 30% worst.

Enhancing life in Salford

- The IMD living environment map shows the ward is generally good to live in, except for the easternmost area, which is within the 20% worst in England.
- Four-fifths of households live in detached or semi-detached houses compared with less than half across the city as a whole.
- Home ownership is much higher than the city rate, especially outright ownership.
- Over the last ten years the number of dwellings increased across Salford as a whole, and by over 200 in Worsley.
- Whereas average house prices are twice the Salford average, incomes have been rising at a lower pace than citywide.
- House purchase locally is more difficult for Worsley residents than generally across the city.
- The rate of dwellings vacant is lower than the Salford average but has been rising, unlike the city trend.
- The pattern of households moving home mirrors that in the city as a whole, though at a lower rate.
- Car ownership is high compared to Salford as a whole.

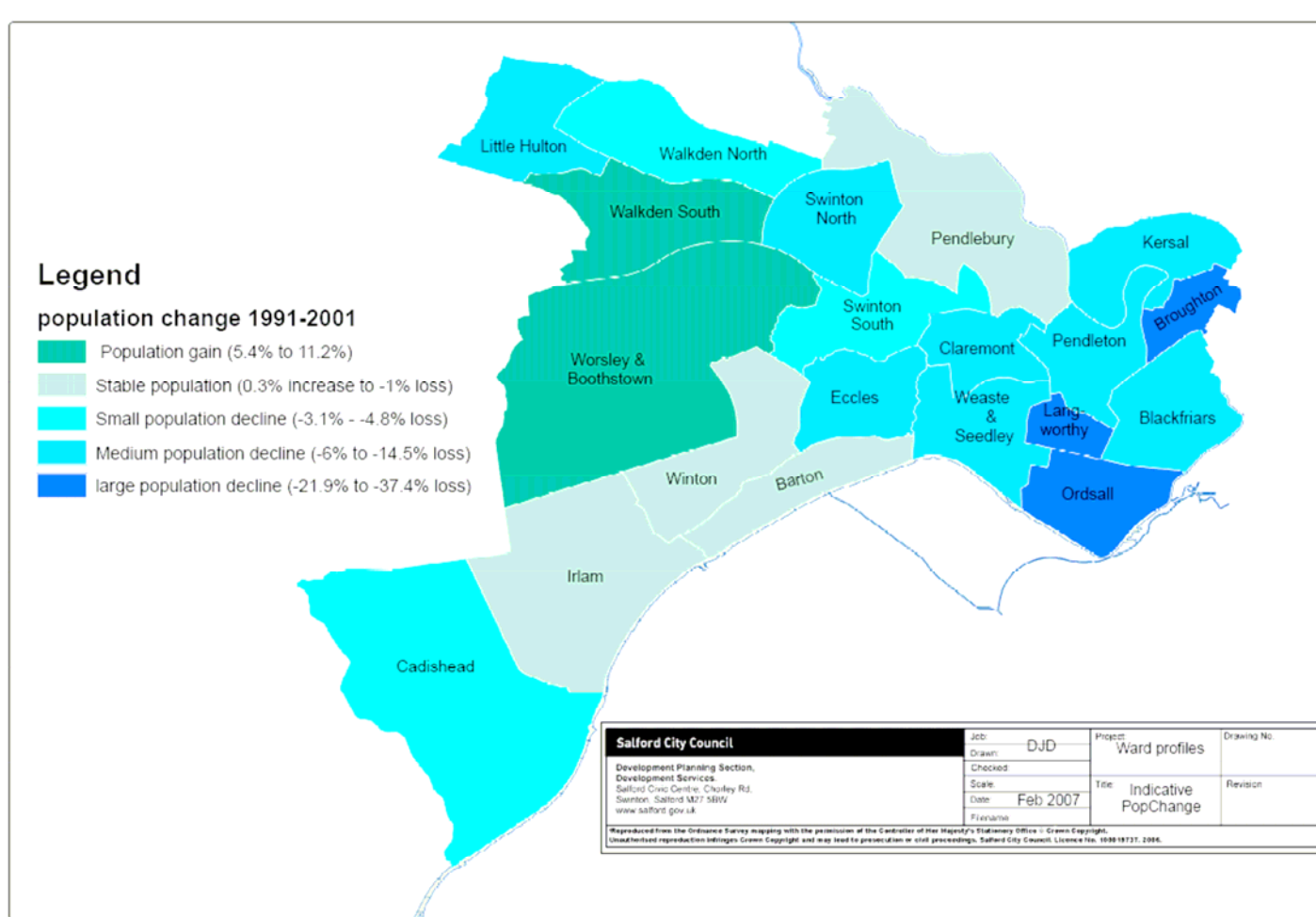

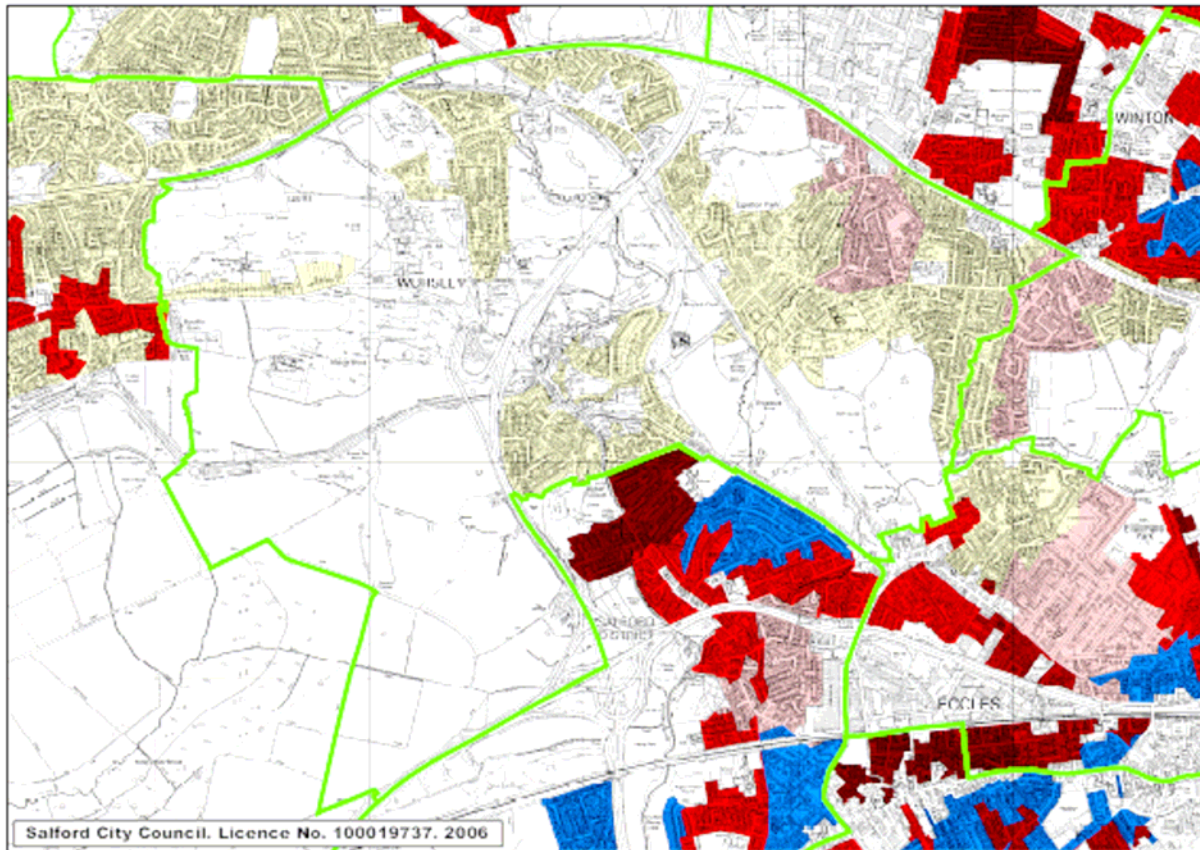

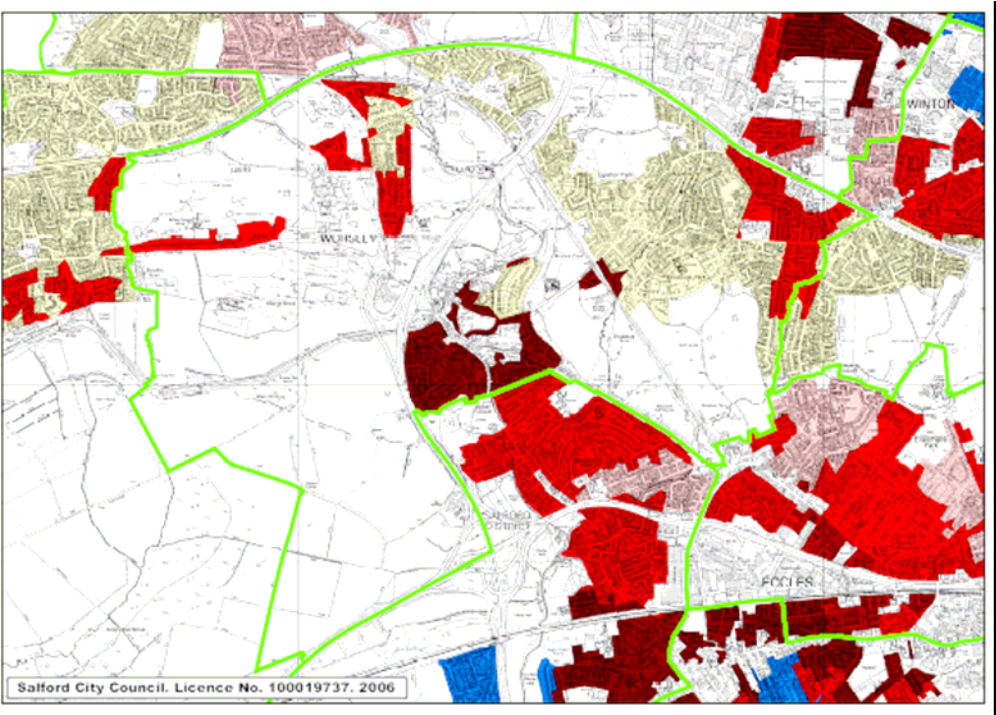

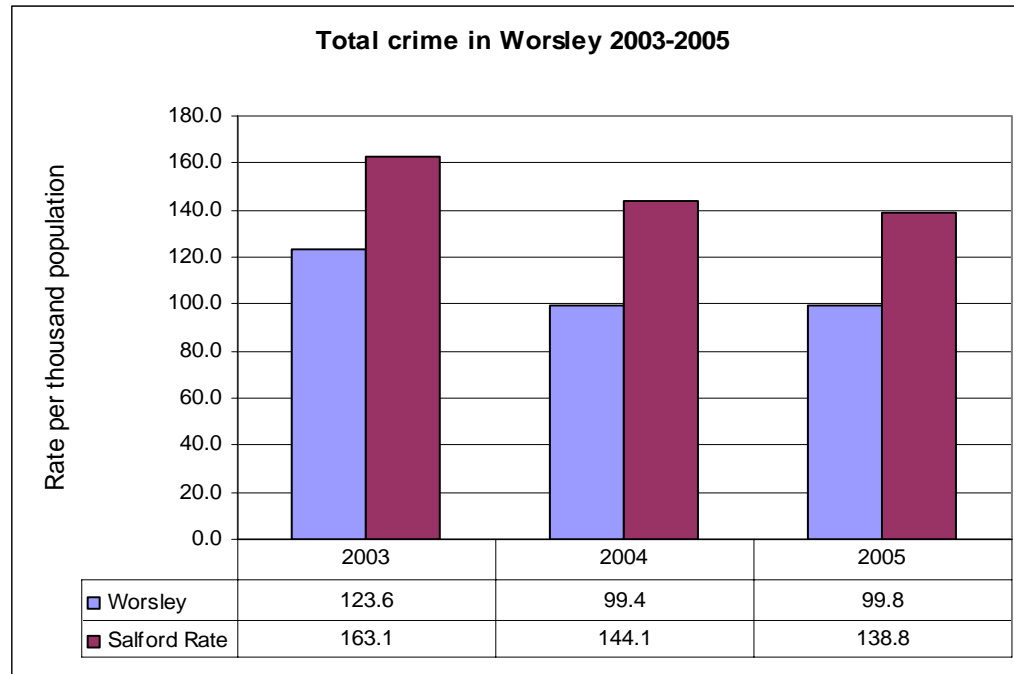

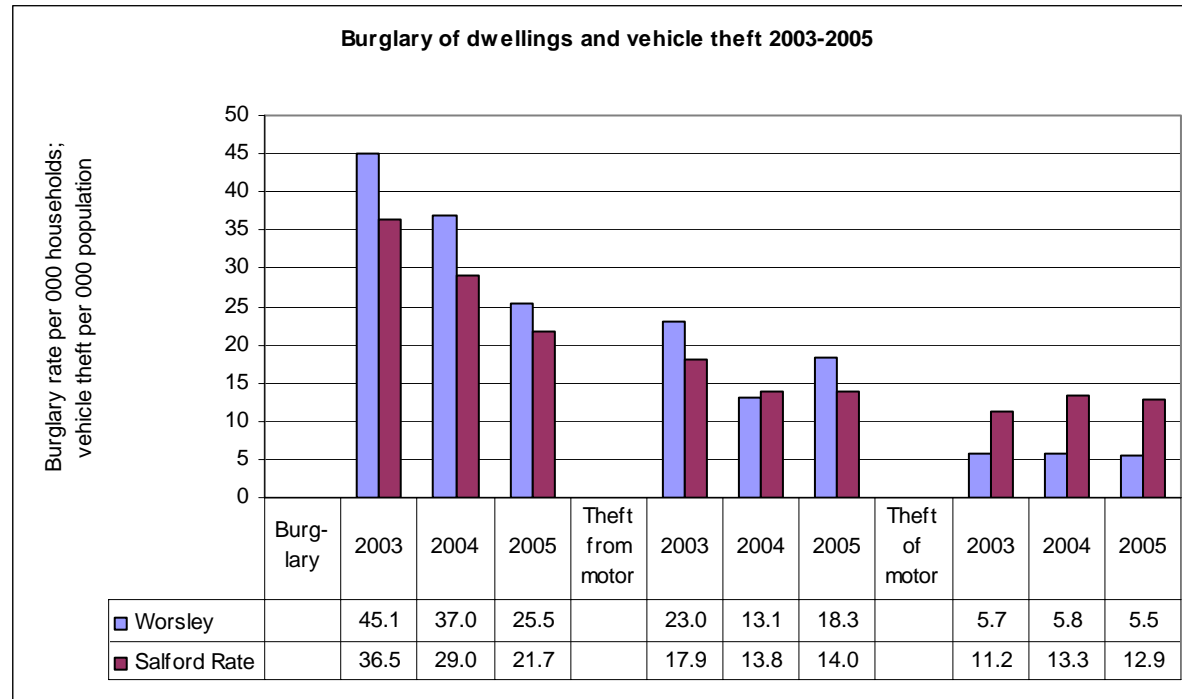

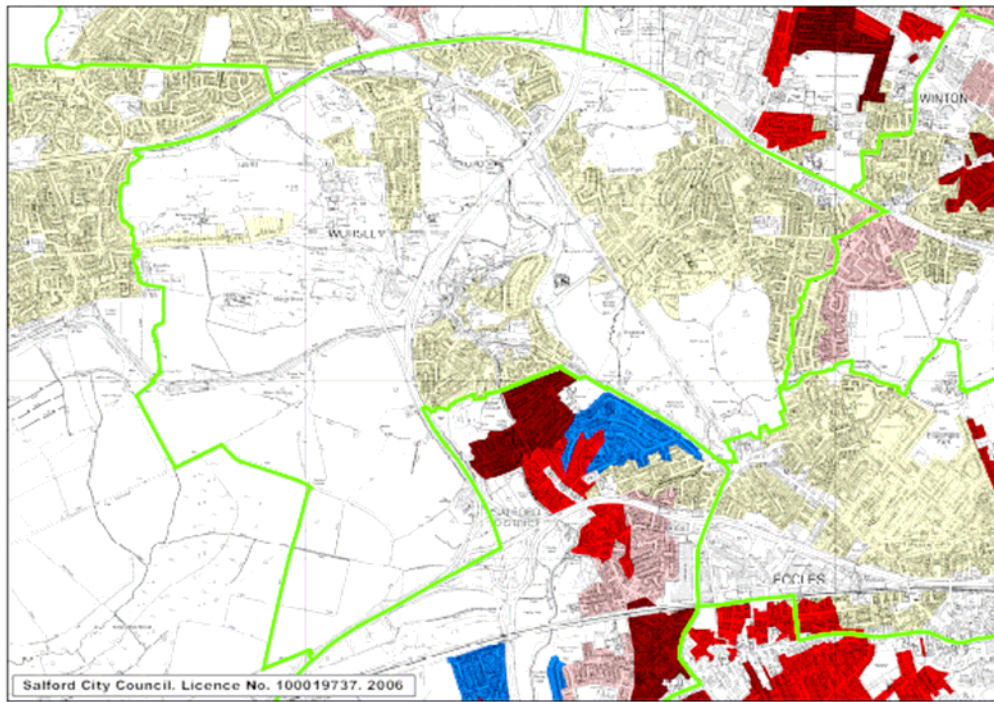

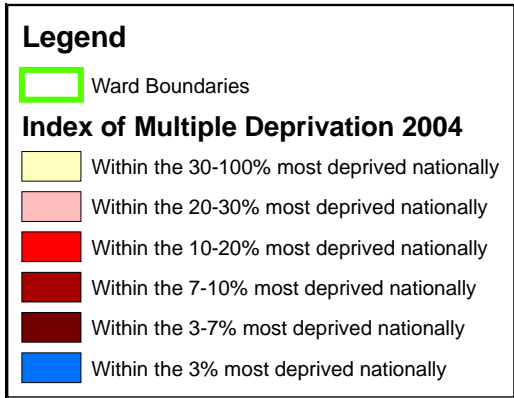

Definitions:

Level 1 qualifications include: 1+ O-level,CSE,GCSE; NVQ level 1; foundation level GNVQ.

Level 2 qualifications include: 5+ O-levels; 5+ GCE (grade 1s); 5+GCSE (grades a*-c); school certificate; 1+A/AS-levels; NVQ level 2; and intermediate GNVQ.

Level 3 qualifications include: 2+ A-levels; 4+AS-levels; Higher School Certificate; NVQ level 3; advanced GNVQ.

Level 4/5 qualifications include: first degree; higher degree; NVQ levels 4/5; HNC; HND; qualified teacher status; qualified medical doctor; qualified dentist; qualified nurse; midwife; and health visitor.

Other qualifications include: City & Guilds; RSA/OCR; BTec/Edexcel; other professional qualifications.

Pupil attainment by place of residence

Pupils aged 5 to 16 in state schools must be taught the National Curriculum. This is divided into 'Key Stages' that generally depend on children's ages

Key Stage 2 tests are taken normally in year 6 when children are 11 years old. The subjects covered are English, mathematics and science.

Key Stage 2 Level 4 is the level expected of most 11 year olds. Level 5 means pupils are achieving beyond the expected level.

Each pupil's value added score comes from comparing their best eight results at GCSE and equivalent and the median performance of other pupils with the same or similar results at Key Stage 2. Individual pupil scores are added together and averaged to produce the school value added measure, presented as a number based around 1000. This indicates the value the school has added on average for its pupils.

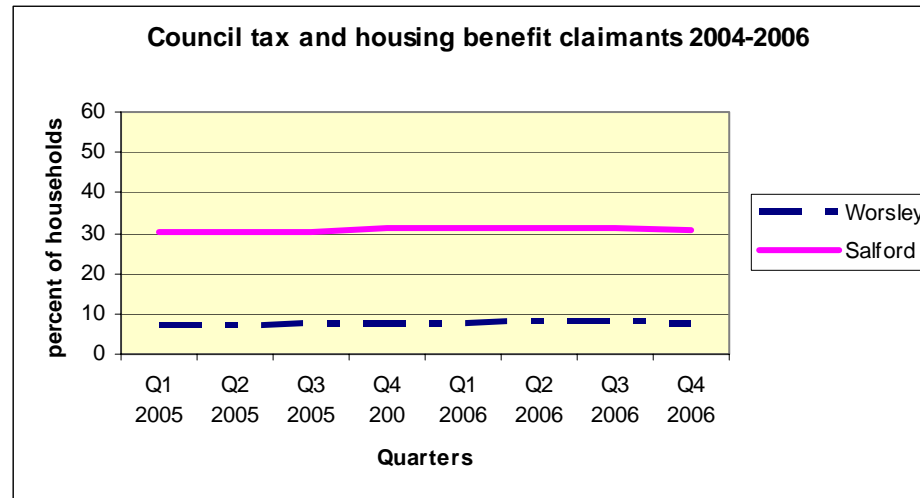

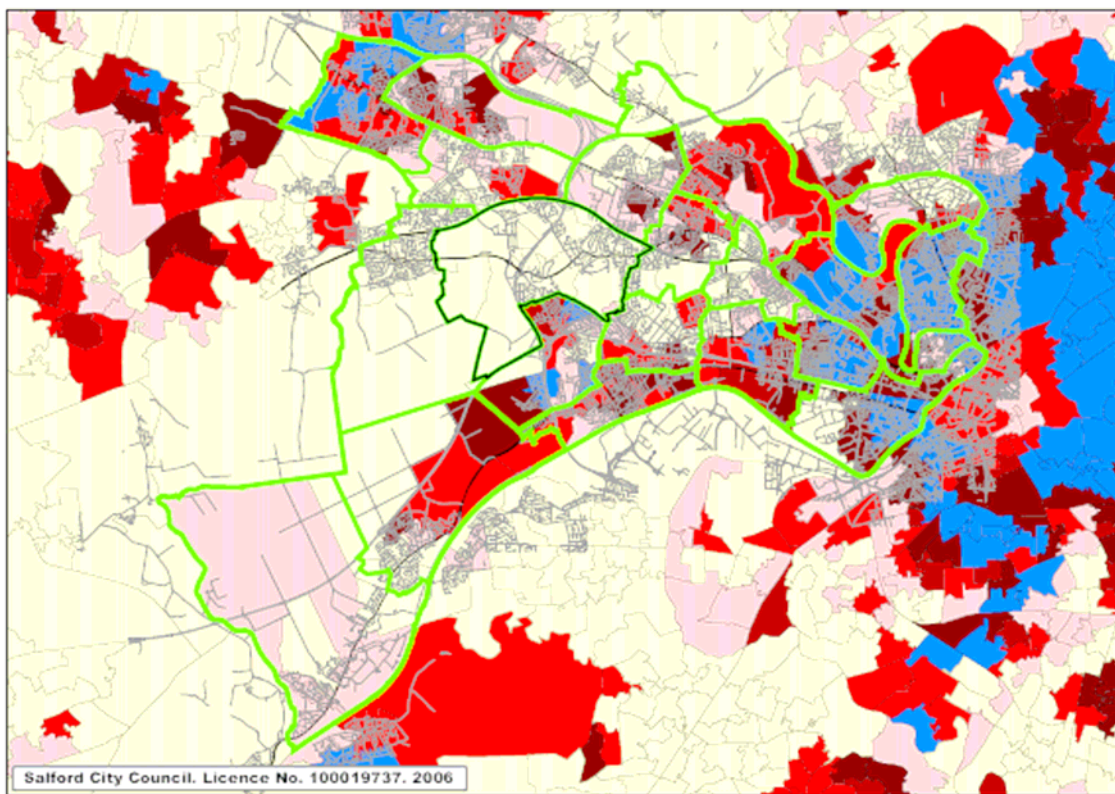

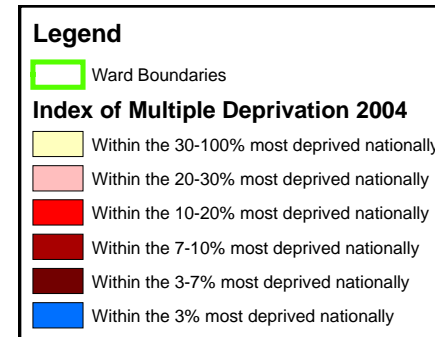

Map 5 Index of Multiple Deprivation Worsley, Salford and surrounding areas



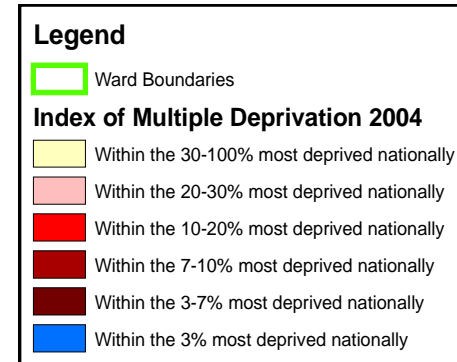
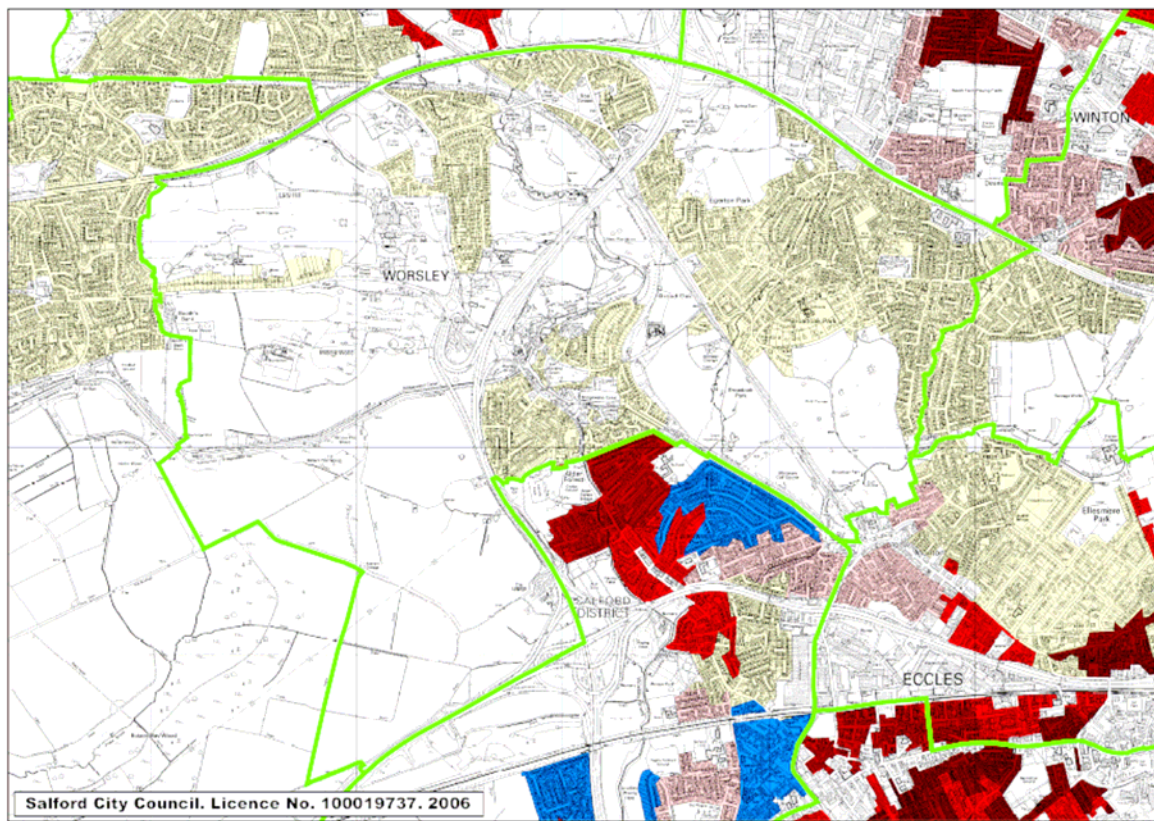

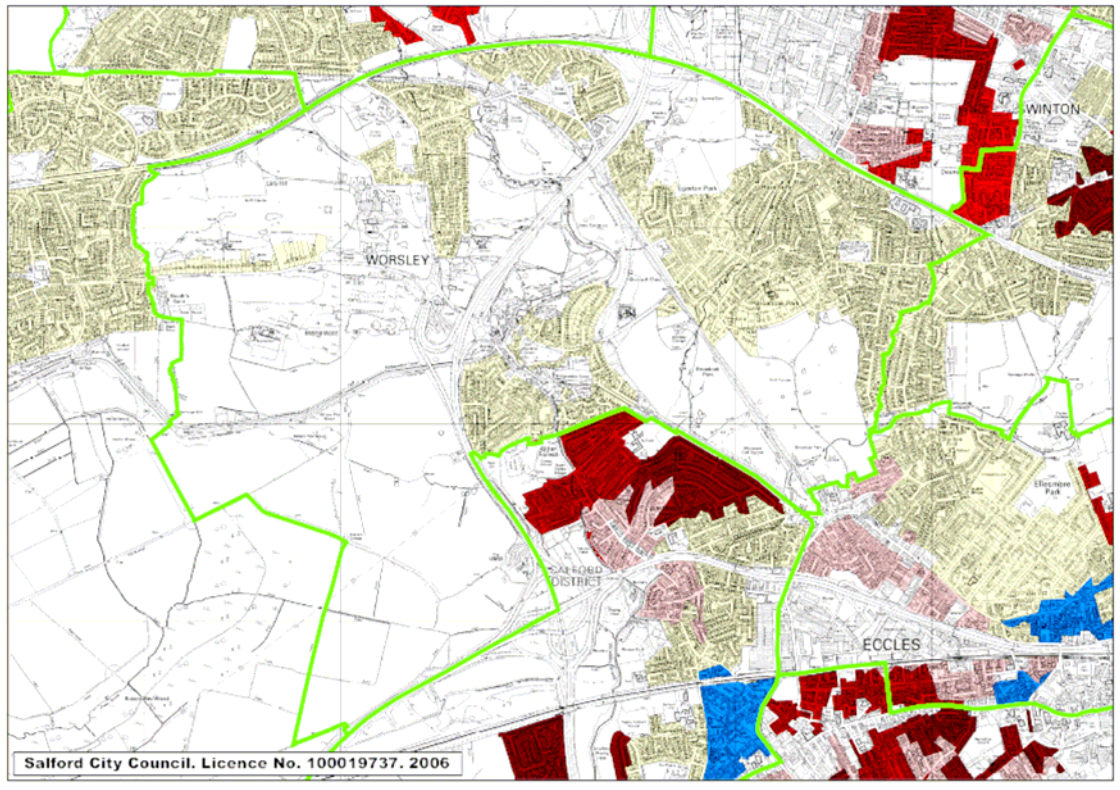

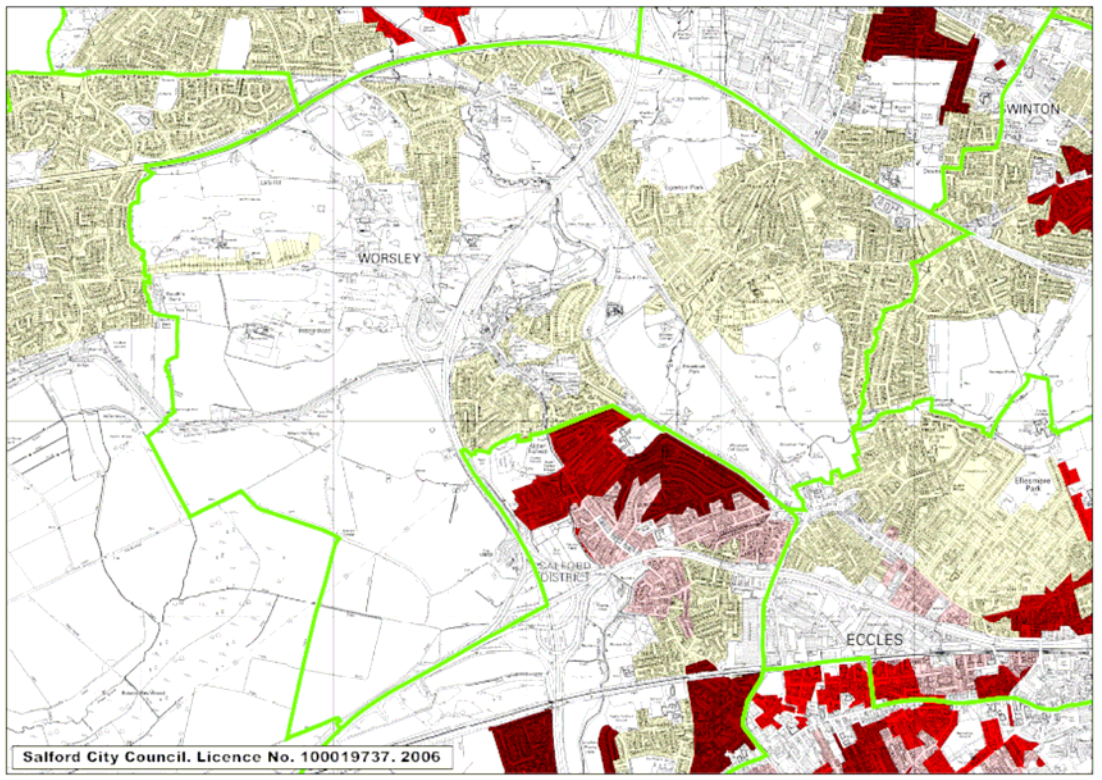

Map 8 Index of Multiple Deprivation income domain

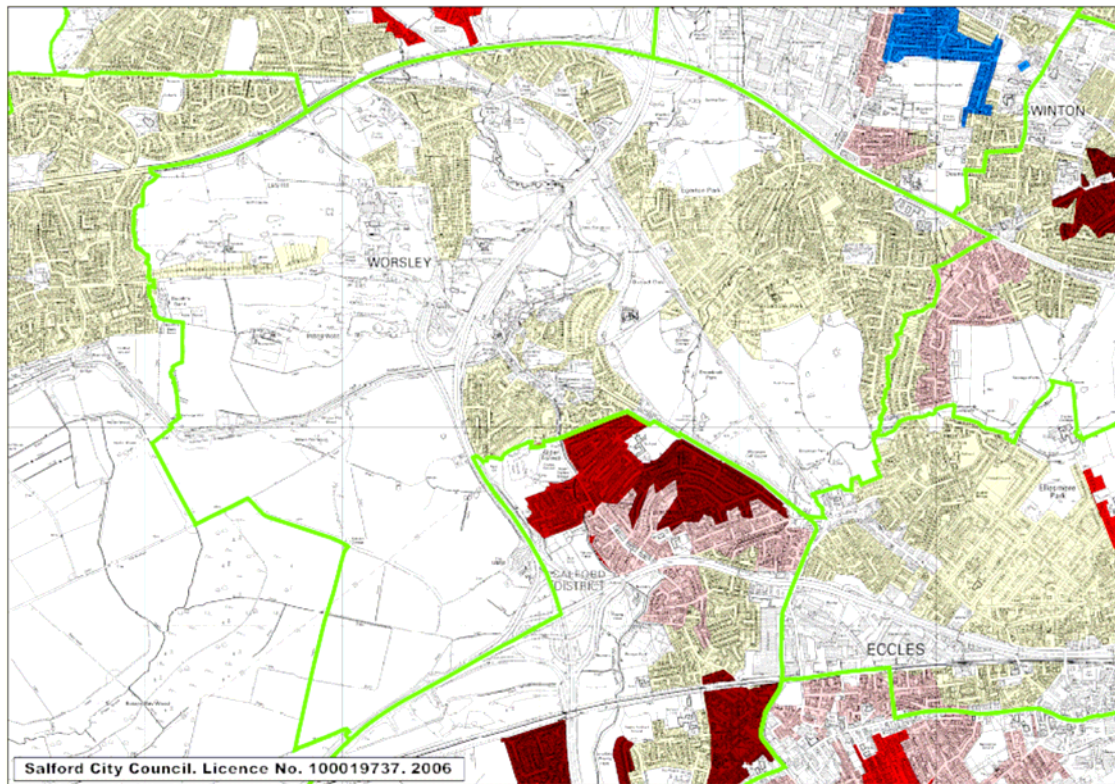

Map 9 Income deprivation affecting children

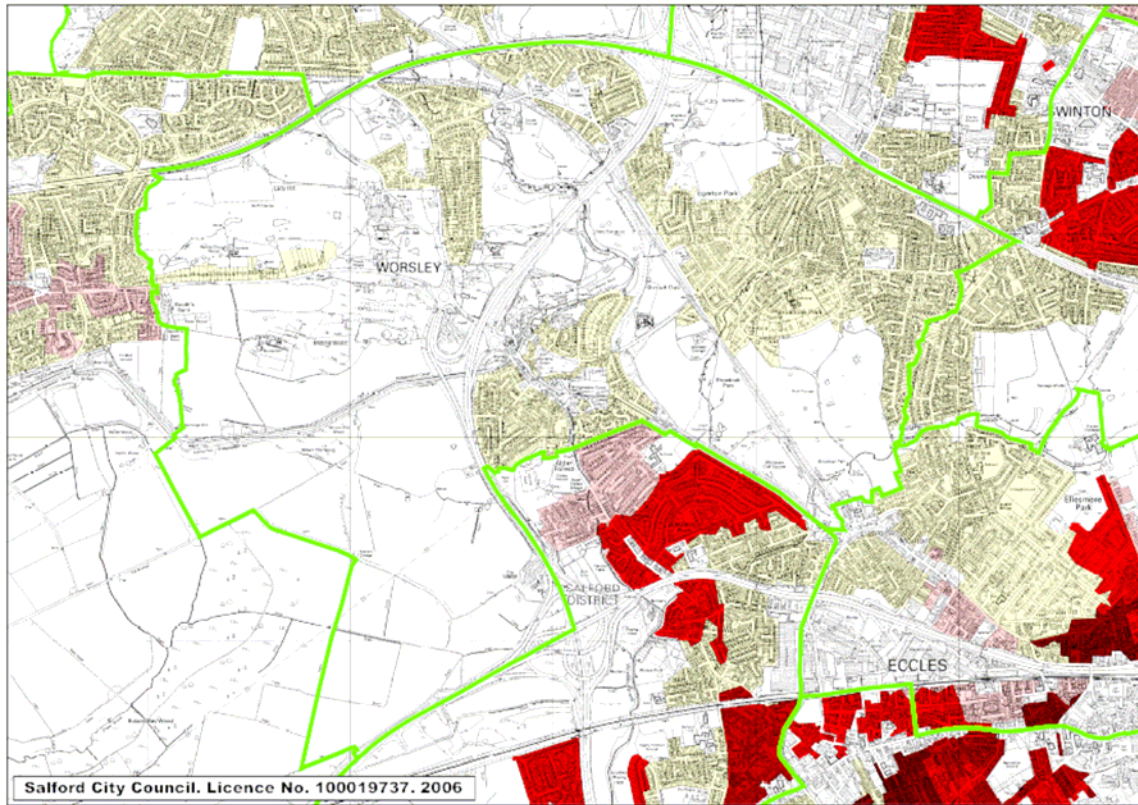

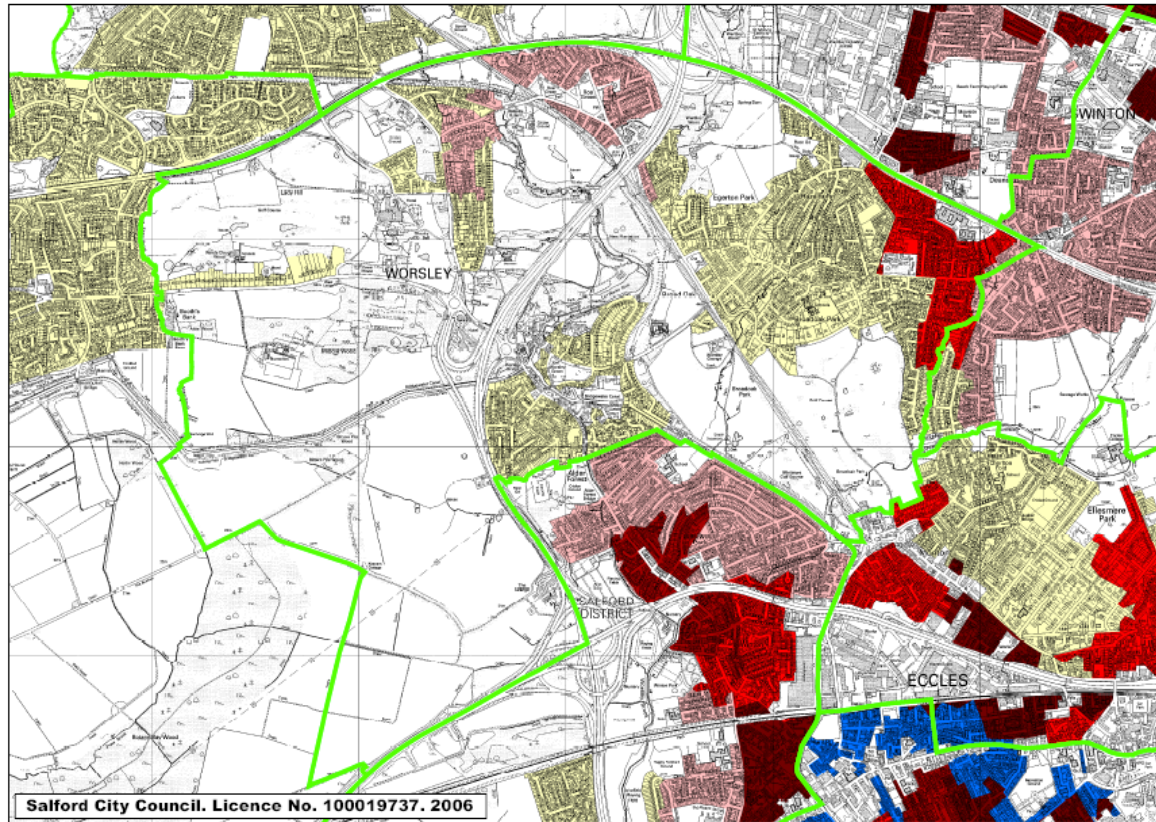

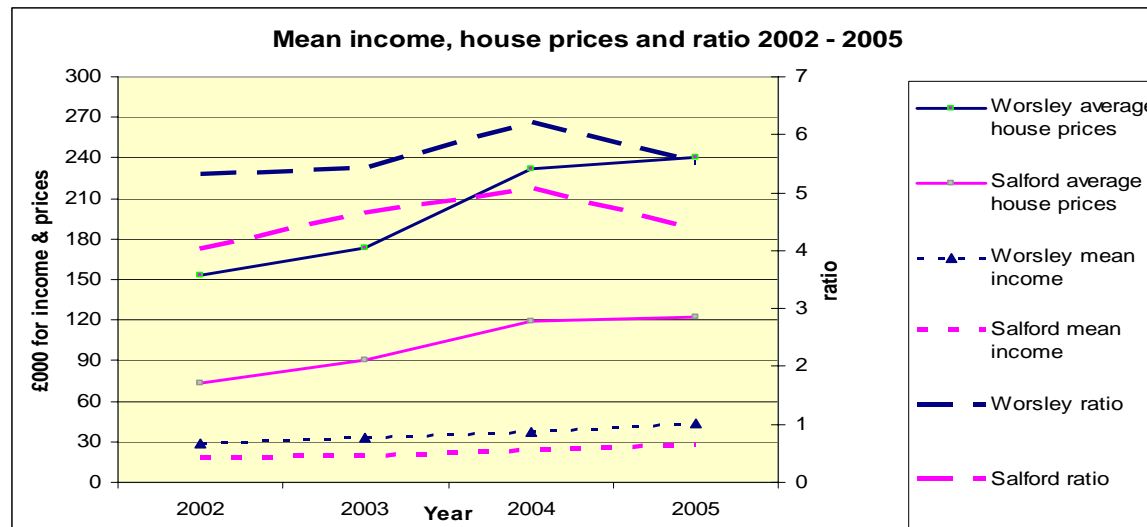

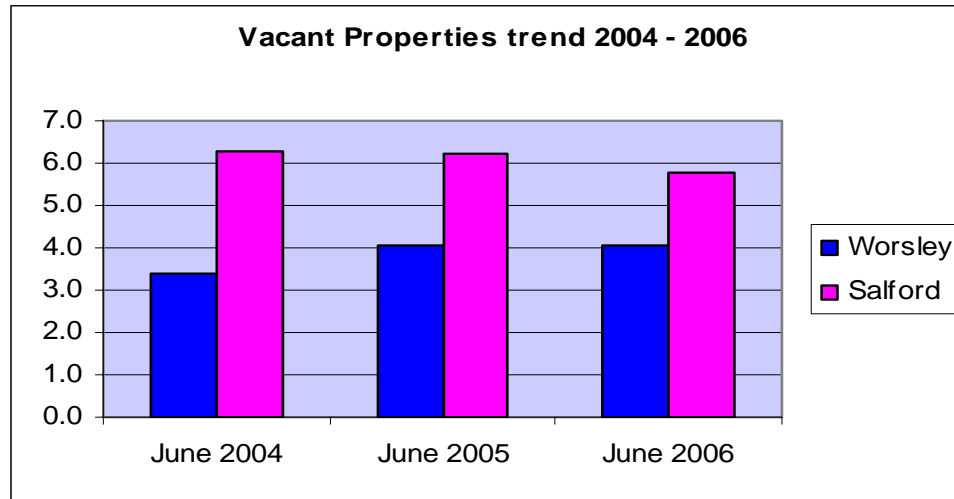

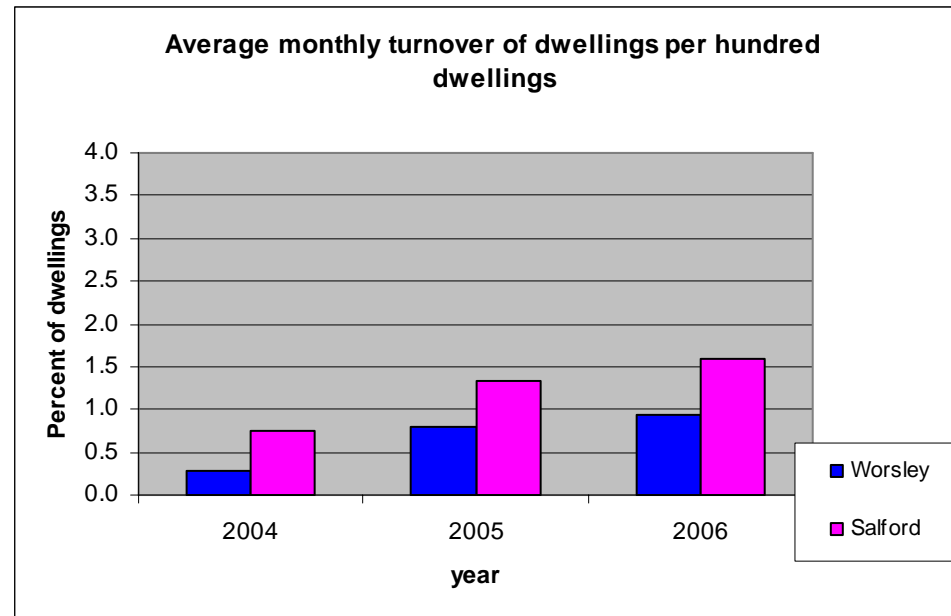
