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The Comedy of Errors continues the summer season at Shakespeare's Globe

Shakespeare's most farcical comedy, *The Comedy of Errors*, is the next play to burst onto Globe stage as part of its 2006 *The Edges of Rome* theatre season. Directed by **Christopher Luscombe**, with designs by **Janet Bird** and music by **Julian Philips**, the production runs from 22 July to 7 October.

A Renaissance spin on a Roman story by Plautus, *The Comedy of Errors* is a short and boisterous comedy about 'Errors and Confusions' which takes place during one manic day of misadventures. A trade war between Syracuse and Ephesus is the background to the chaotic story of estranged twin brothers (both called Antipholus) and estranged twin servants (both called Dromio). Mixing extremes of farce and romance, the increasingly hectic action is a frenzy of storms, shipwrecks, losses at sea, conjugal conflicts and creditors chasing debts, before the final restoration of sanity.

Christopher Luscombe has directed *The Rocky Horror Show* (Playhouse & UK tour; 2006); *Masterpieces* (Birmingham Rep; 2002) and *The Shakespeare Revue* (RSC & Vaudeville; 2000) - both of which he devised and directed with Malcolm McKee - as well as his own adaptation of Coward's *Star Quality* (Apollo; 2001). He has also acted in seasons at Bristol, Northampton, Colchester, Harrogate, Basingstoke, Leatherhead, Chester, Bath, Guildford, Cardiff and Windsor.

Janet Bird's designs for theatre include *The Rocky Horror Show* (Playhouse & UK tour, 2006) and *Pete And Dud: Come Again* (Venue, 2006).

Composer **Julian Philips** is a dynamic young talent who has worked extensively in the theatre. He has composed music for ENB's *Les Liaisons Dangereuses* (2004) and has collaborated on numerous productions with director Michael Grandage including *As You Like It* (Lyric Hammersmith, Crucible) which went on to win the South Bank Theatre Award (2001). Julian teaches composition at the Guildhall School of Music & Drama.

The Comedy of Errors is part of The Edges of Rome theatre season this year at Shakespeare's Globe which includes Shakespeare's Coriolanus, Titus Andronicus and

Antony and Cleopatra, along with two world premieres, Under the Black Flag (by Simon Bent) and In Extremis (by Howard Brenton).
