Greg Lonigro enters his first season as Arizona's Northeastern Regional Supervisor after two years as its Eastern Supervisor and nine seasons as an area scout. He joined the D-backs in 1998, covering New York, West Virginia and Pennsylvania. This is his 22nd year in professional baseball.

In 1986, Lonigro was drafted by the Cincinnati Reds in the first round (seventh overall) out of Florida Junior College. He played parts of six season in the Reds' organization before being traded to the Chicago White Sox in 1992, also seeing time with the Chicago Cubs and Florida Marlins before ending his playing career in 1995. He makes his home in Connellsville, Pa.



E MCALLISTER Midwestern Regional Supervisor





Steve McAllister enters his first season as the D-backs' Midwestern Regional Supervisor after four years as Central Supervisor. He worked as a full-time scount in the Midwest region from from 2002-2004.

McAllister has been involved in professional baseball for the past 28 years, first as a player and then as a scout. In 1981, he was drafted out of Bradley University as the Houston Astros' fifth-round selection. He played six seasons in the minor leagues before starting his scouting career. He has previously scouted the Midwest for the Milwaukee Brewers, California Angels and the Boston Red Sox.

McAllister is an inductee in both the Chillicothe (Ill.) High School Athletic Hall of Fame and the Bradley University Athletic Hall of Fame.



HOWARD McCULLOUGH Southeastern Regional Supervisor



Howard McCullough enters his first season as the D-backs' Southeastern Regional Supervisor after serving as a scout since joining the club in October, 1995. He previously spent 10 years with the Boston Red Sox, serving as a national scout in 1993-94. He was named the D-backs Scout of the Year in 2005, was inducted into the Mid-Atlantic Association Scouts Hall of Fame in 2007 and will be inducted into the Topps Baseball Company Professional Baseball Scouts Hall of Fame in 2009, with his plaque to be displayed at Joseph P. Riley, Jr. Park in Charleston, S.C.

McCullough was the pitching coach for the University of North Carolina from 1982-85 after serving as the head coach for Webb High School in Oxford, N.C., from 1978-81. He played two years at Louisburg (N.C.) Junior College and two years and East Carolina University, earning his Master's degree in education from ECU in 1977.

McCullough makes his home in Greenville, N.C., with his wife, Eva. The couple has a son, Clayton, who manages the Lansing Lugnuts (A) in the Toronto Blue Jays' organization.



Western Regional Supervisor



Bob Minor enters his third season as Arizona's Western Supervisor after spending 25 years with the New York He started there in November 1981, spending 13 years as an area scout and 12 years as a crosschecker. Minor resides in Garden Grove, Calif., with his wife, Patty, and two sons, Jimmy and Billy.

Special Assistant to the General Manager/Director of Latin Operations



Junior Noboa was promoted to Special Assistant to the General Manager, Latin American Operations on Feb. 20, 2007, after serving as the Director, Latin America Operations since October 2003. He also works as the Director of the D-backs' baseball academy in the Dominican Republic.

He was the organization's first international hire in August 1995 and a month later signed the organization's first two players. In 1997, he was the first recipient of the Roland Hemond Award, bestowed upon a member of the baseball department who best exemplifies the "Diamondback" approach to their work. In 1999, Noboa signed Geraldo Guzman, a carpenter who had not played professionally since 1992 but went on to pitch in 17 games for the Diamondbacks from 2000-01.



JIM MARSHALL

Senior Advisor, Pacific Rim Operations





Jim Marshall continues to serve as the club's Senior Advisor, Pacific Rim Operations, a role he has filled since coming on-board in 1996. His main duty is to maintain relations with baseball organizations in Australia, Japan, Korea and Taiwan. He also works as a major league and advance scout for the D-backs.

Marshall played in the big leagues from 1958-62, logging time with the Baltimore Orioles, Chicago Cubs, San Francisco Giants, the original 1962 New York Mets and the Pittsburgh Pirates. He managed the Chicago Cubs from 1974-76 and the Oakland Athletics in 1979.

His first visit to Japan was in 1960 as part of a goodwill tour with the Giants. Three years later, he signed with the Chunichi Dragons of the Japanese Central League and hit .268 with 78 home runs and 252 RBI over three campaigns.



MACK HAYASHI

Director, Pacific Rim Operations



Makoto (Mack) Hayashi enters his second season with the Arizona Diamondbacks as Director, Pacific Rim Operations. Hayashi scouts players in Australia, Japan, Korea and Taiwan while also maintaining relationships with teams in professional baseball leagues in those countries.

Prior to joining the D-backs, Hayashi spent eight years working for agent Alan Nero, who had an inroad among agents for advising players from Japan. Hayashi was credited with maintaining Nero's strong client base in Japan with players such as Seattle Mariners' catcher Kenji Johjima and Tampa Bay Rays' infielder Akinori Iwamura and American and Latin players that played in Japan.

The Japanese-born Hayashi attended the prestigious Keio University in Tokyo. He and his wife, Eriko, reside in Aliso Viejo, Calif., with their daughters Lily and Sakura.

2008 FIRST-YEAR PLAYER DRAFT

The D-backs selected University of Arizona left-handed pitcher Daniel Schlereth with the 26th overall pick in the first round. Arizona also continued to focus its draft selections on college-level players, picking someone from the college ranks for 39 of their 51 picks. The organization chose 33 players from four-year colleges and eight from junior and community colleges. Arizona drafted 10 high school prospects. The D-backs inked 21 of their first 30 selections and 29 of 50 players overall.
