


Three Dance Palace Evenings Feature Storytelling And Fun

Saturday, January 8th, at 7:30 PM, West Marin's unique storyteller, Ane Carla Rovetta, returns to her old homeland to delight all ages with warm family stories that everyone in the family can cuddle up to. Ane Carla Rovetta's formal training was as a zoologist. Like artisans of the European Renaissance, she is committed to the practice of art and science as kindred disciplines. Ane Carla has spent most of her adult life unifying the two in paintings, handmade art materials, and public performances across the United States. Her presentations are more than lively portraits of our Western animals. Whether drawing an animal protagonist after a story, or describing how she ground up soil to create the pastel she is using, Ane Carla's unique delivery keeps her audience spellbound.

At 4 PM on Sunday, January 23rd, pianist Sarah Cahill will perform "Playdate", a high spirited event which combines a classical piano recital with theater, audience participation, and lots of fun.

Designed for ages six and up, as well as grown-up audiences, this program features pieces written for and about children, including selections from Schumann's "Album for the Young" and Debussy's "Children's Corner Suite". Cahill has also commissioned new works from John Kennedy, David Van Tieghem, and other composer-parents. These works incorporate small toys, melodies composed by kids, and a variety of innovative techniques fused together with a sense of play and whimsy. In recent months, Sarah has performed solo recitals at the Phillips Collection in Washington D.C., the Other Minds festival in San Francisco, and the Solo Flights Pianorama Festival at Lincoln Center. Her albums of works by Ravel, Ruth Crawford, and Cowell on the New Albion label have received critical acclaim.

Tickets available at the door are \$15 for adults, \$13 for seniors, and \$5 for teens and children.

Tobias Wolff is considered a master of the short story.


