The economic importance of Bordeaux wines

- Employment
 - 8,650 wine growers
 - 300 "maison de négoce" (wine merchants)
 - 93 wine brokers
 - 55,000 persons employed directly and indirectly
 - 4 out of 10 people permanently employed in the French wine industry work in the Gironde region
- 2009 Sales
- 4.96 million hectolitres
- 3.37 billion Euros turnover
 - The biggest French wine region by A.O.C. volumes sold
 - The biggest A.O.C. still wine exporter
 - 150 destination countries for Bordeaux wines
- Market share of Bordeaux wines within French exports, by value, in 2009
